PROVIDING FOR A NATIONAL CERVICAL CANCER DIAGNOSTIC AND
TREATMENT FUND

EXPLANATORY NOTE

In 2014, 12 Filipino women per day died from cervical cancer. Because cervical cancer is often detected in its late stages, the mortality rate is high. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), in the Philippines, cervical cancer ranks as the 2nd most common cancer in women between the ages of 15 to 44, next to breast cancer. This is mainly due to late detection and lack of awareness of the disease among Filipino women. As with all cancers in developing countries, cervical cancer is usually diagnosed at an advanced stage. This is in part because of the paucity of effective screening programs.

It is in this light that this bill seeks to create a breast and cervical cancer diagnostic and treatment fund which shall provide financial assistance for the medical care of indigent patients. The bill provides for the composition and administration of the fund, the covered services, eligibility of patients, and the disbursement of funds. It is hoped that this measure would alleviate the struggle of women and their families who have to cope with the life threatening disease. Moreover, as a proactive measure, it seeks to encourage women to undergo screening to protect them from the same.

In view of the foregoing, immediate approval of this measure is earnestly sought.

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AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR A NATIONAL CERVICAL CANCER DIAGNOSTIC AND TREATMENT FUND

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "National Cervical Cancer Diagnostic and Treatment Fund Program".

SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* - It is the policy of the State to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them.

SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms.* - As used in this article:

1. "Fund" means the breast and cervical cancer diagnostic and treatment fund;

2. "Qualified applicant" means a female who meets the financial and medical eligibility guidelines of this Act pursuant to Article 5 hereof; and

3. "Provider" means a physician, hospital or medical provider currently licensed under the state.

SEC. 4. Establishment of Cervical Cancer Diagnostic and Treatment Fund. - There is hereby established a cervical cancer diagnostic and treatment fund which shall provide financial assistance for the medical care of indigent patients for diagnostic and treatment services for breast and cervical cancer.

The fund shall be comprised of money appropriated to the fund by the Legislature, allocated to the fund by the national government and all other sums designated for deposit in the fund from any source, public or private.

The fund shall be administered by the University of the Philippines - Department of Health Cervical Cancer Screening Research Group (hereinafter referred to as the UP-DOH CCSRG).

SEC. 5. Covered Services. - The Secretary of the Department of Health (DOH) shall appoint a committee of four (4) physicians from the UP-DOH CCSRG to promulgate the rules and regulations for the administration of the fund.

The committee shall include one (1) physician whose specialty is gynecologic oncology, one (1) physician whose specialty is surgery, one (1) physician whose specialty is radiology and one (1) physician whose specialty is pathology. Responsibilities of the committee include, but are not limited to, the following: 1. Establishing a list of covered services approved for payment through the fund. -Covered services include diagnostic and treatment services for cervical cancer or a condition suggestive of cancer. An ancillary diagnostic study may be authorized only when it is determined by the UP-DOH CCSRG to be directly related to the confirmation of a diagnosis of cancer or is necessary for treatment planning: 2. Setting a limitation on days of service covered by the fund. - The Philippine General Hospital (PGH) shall authorize the number of days for reimbursement based on the medical condition of the patient and the procedure to be performed; and 3. Reviewing requests and providing authorization for payment of diagnostic or treatment services covered by the fund. SEC. 6. Patient Eligibility. - To be eligible for assistance in payment of services under the fund, the following conditions shall be met:

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- 1. The patient is not eligible for nor covered by medical insurance other than the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (hereinafter referred to as PhilHealth);
- 2. The patient's income must be at or below the National Poverty Threshold or Poverty Line based on the data provided by the National Statistical Coordination Board (NCSB);
- 3. The patient has a condition clinically indicative of cancer that requires diagnostic services to confirm the preliminary diagnosis and only those services determined to be medically necessary for that diagnostic confirmation may be authorized by the committee for payment from the fund; or
- 4. The patient has received diagnostic confirmation through a positive pathology report and is requesting payment of treatment services by the fund.
- SEC. 7. Application Process. The PGH shall develop authorization request forms and make the forms available to the provider upon request.

An application for inpatient diagnostic services shall be accompanied by a written, signed statement from the attending physician which includes the medical basis for required inpatient services and explains why the services may not be performed on an outpatient basis.

SEC. 8. Reimbursement Process. - The fund is the payor of last resort. Payment for procedures shall be made at the current rate established by PhilHealth.

A claim for authorized services rendered shall be processed in accordance with rules promulgated by the UP-DOH CCSRG.

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1	SEC. 9. Appropiations. – The Department concerned shall include in their programs
2	the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the Annual General
3	Appropriations Act.
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5	SEC. 10. Separability Clause If any provisions or part hereof, is held invalid or
6	unconstitutional, the remainder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
7	valid and subsisting.
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SEC. 11. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations inconsistent with this Act, are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SEC. 12. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
