### AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE GRANT OF STUDENT FARE DISCOUNT PRIVILEGES ON LAND, WATER AND AIR TRANSPORT UTILITIES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

In many areas of the country, particularly in rural towns, students must walk up to five kilometers each way to get to school. A daily tricycle ride, the only alternative, would be too costly. However, with our climate that brings either torrential rains or, extreme heat, the long and arduous walk sometimes spells the difference between pursuing and halting one's education.

To give all Filipino students an equal opportunity to an excellent education, this bill proposes to strengthen the mandate for student discounts on transport fares. Under this act, students with valid proof of enrolment to an educational institution must be granted a 20% discount on all land, water and air transportation all throughout the year.

Additionally, this bill seeks to impose stricter penalties for transport providers who do not honor student fares with the help of a hotline through which complaints may be coursed.

Through this mandate, our most underprivileged students stand to benefit from reasonable transportation costs that will be applicable even on weekends and holidays during which students often have extra-curricular activities related to enriching their education.

The inclusion of air and sea transportation will facilitate students' access to learning not only in the classroom but also around the Philippine islands, across our region, and beyond.

In view thereof the passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

## AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE GRANT OF STUDENT FARE DISCOUNT PRIVILEGES ON LAND, WATER AND AIR TRANSPORT UTILITIES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall also be known as the "Fare Discount for Students Act."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. - Pursuant to Article XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution, "the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all." In addition, Paragraph 3, Section 2 of said Article directs the State to establish and maintain a system at scholarship grants, student loan programs, subsidies, and other incentives which shall be available to deserving students in both public and private schools, especially to underprivileged.

### **SECTION 3.** *Objective.* – This measure aims to:

- a) Establish a mechanism that ensures the mandatory grant of tie discount privileges to deserving students;
- b) Enlist the cooperation and/or support of transport utility owners to extend assistance to deserving students as a social responsibility through the observance of the grant; and
- c) To encourage students, particularly the poor and underprivileged to pursue quality education to secure their future and make them responsible citizens.

**SECTION 4.** *Scope-* This Act shall be applicable to all Filipino students, currently enrolled in schools taking basic and tertiary education, including technical-vocational, taking public air, land or water transportation.

**SECTION 5.** Student Discount. – Students shall be entitled to a twenty (20) percent discount on regular fares upon presenting valid school identification (ID) card or currently validated enrolment forms supported by other documents to properly address identity.

1 2	Fare discounts are effective as long as the student can show proof that they are enrolled in an educational institution, including weekends and public holidays.
3 4 5 6 7	<b>SECTION 6.</b> Complaints and Violations. Students who are refused to avail of the fare discount stipulated in this Act, shall file their complaint with the Secretary of Transportation and Communications. The Office of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation and Communications (DOTC) shall direct the complaints to the concerned attached agency:
8	a) The Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) for land
9	transportation;
10	b) The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) for sea/water transportation
11	utilities;
12	c) The Civil Aeronautics Board (CAB) for air transportation; and
13	d) The Legal Services of DOTC for rail transportation facilities.
14	SECTION 7. Penalties The following penalties shall be imposed to the violators of
15	this Act:
16	a) For Land Transportation Utilities – Suspension of license for the erring driver,
17	conductor or inspector for one (1) month for the 1 <sup>st</sup> offense; two (2) months
18	for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense; three (3) months for the 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense; and for subsequent
19	violations, a three-month suspension of license, plus a fine of Five Hundred
20	Pesos (P 500) for each violation of the erring party;
21	b) For Water and Air Transportation - A fine shall be imposed against the erring
22	firms/establishment or their authorized agents in the amount of One
23	Thousand Pesos (P 1,000) for the 1 <sup>st</sup> offense; Two Thousand Pesos (P 2,000)
24	for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense; Three Thousand Pesos (P 3,000) for the 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense; and
25	Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000) for each subsequent violation;
26	c) For Rail Transport Utilities - All rail transport utilities are mandate to observe
27	the aforesaid fare discount privilege and designate a student/senior citizen
28	fare booth in their boarding stations. Violation thereof shall be sanctioned or
29	fined as indicated in the previous paragraph immediately (item b, above).
30	SECTION 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. — Within sixty (60) days from the
31	effectivity of this Act, the Department of Transportation and Communications, in
32	coordination with its relevant attached agencies, shall promulgate the necessary rules and
33	regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.
34	SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and
35	regulations or other issuances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with this Act are hereby
36	repealed or modified accordingly.
37	SECTION 10. Separability Clause. – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared
38	unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall
39	remain in force and effect.

SECTION 11. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) after its publication in the Official Gazette or two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines.
