A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING THE MEMBERS OF THE PHILIPPINE DELEGATION TO THE UNITED NATIONS ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL IN THE HAGUE FOR THEIR EXPERT AND EXEMPLARY WORK LEADING TO THE FAVORABLE RULING FOR THE PHILIPPINES IN ITS HISTORIC CASE AGAINST CHINA OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA

WHEREAS, on December 10, 1982, the Republic of the Philippines became a signatory to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS). The Philippines became one of the first States to submit its instruments of ratification on May 8, 1984;¹

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2013, the Republic of the Philippines instituted arbitral proceedings against the People's Republic of China under Annex VII to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), "with respect to the dispute with China over the maritime jurisdiction of the Philippines in the West Philippine Sea,"² after exhausting political and diplomatic means to peacefully resolve its maritime dispute with China, who also signed and ratified the UNCLOS along with 167 other countries.³

WHEREAS, on March 30, 2014, the Philippines submitted a 4000-page memorial to the Arbitral Tribunal at the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague for its case against China;

WHEREAS, on July 7-13, 2015, the Philippines presented before the Arbitral Tribunal at the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague its oral arguments on matters of jurisdiciton and admissibility over its case against China under the UNCLOS;

WHEREAS, on October 29, 2015, the Permanent Court of Arbitration unanimously ruled that it has jurisdiction over the Philippines' case against China,

affirming that both nations as parties to the UNCLOS are bound by its provisions on the settlement of disputes;

WHEREAS, on November 24-30, 2015, the Philippines presented before the Arbitral Tribunal at the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague its oral arguments on the merits of its case against China under the UNCLOS;

WHEREAS, on July 12, 2016, the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague issued a momentous unanimous decision in favor of the Philippines that clarified our nation's maritime entitlements under the UNCLOS;
