

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8972, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE SOLO PARENTS'
WELFARE ACT OF 2000, BY PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL BENEFITS AND PENAL
PROVISION FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE ACT

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Raising children and nurturing a healthy family is a major challenge to parents and takes a great deal of time, effort, patience, and learning. For solo parents, the challenge is even more daunting.

To make the situation worse, the financial burden as breadwinner adds to the stress and pressure of solo parents. As such, this measure seeks to amend Republic Act No. 8972 or the Solo Parents' Welfare Act of 2000 to add benefits for solo parents, increase penalties for non-compliance, and enhance the effectiveness of the law's implementation.

Through these amendments, solo parents will be awarded a 10% discount on clothing for their child and a 15% discount on baby's milk and food up to two years from childbirth.

A 15% discount from medicine and medical supply purchases until 5 years from childbirth as well as a 10% discount from tuition fees will also be awarded.


Lastly, a personal tax exemption of Php50,000 can be claimed by single parents, allowing them to take home a larger portion of their income to invest in their family's future.

Let us give them the support they need to provide a bright future for families of solo parents.

In view of the foregoing, the approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8972, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE SOLO PARENTS' WELFARE ACT OF 2000, BY PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL BENEFITS AND PENAL PROVISION FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE ACT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1 Section 3 of the Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. Definition of Terms - As used in this Act, the following terms shall mean:

- a) Solo parent any individual who falls under any of the following categories:
 - 1. A woman who gives birth as a result of rape and other crimes against chastity, even without a final conviction of the offender: *Provided*, That the mother keeps and raises the child;
 - 2. Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to death of spouse;
 - 3. Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood while the spouse is detained or is serving sentence for a criminal conviction for a period of at least one (1) year;
 - 4. Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to physical and/or mental incapacity of spouse as certified by a public medical practitioner;
 - 5. Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to legal separation or *de facto* from spouse for at least one (1) year, as long as he/she is entrusted with the custody of the children;
 - 6. Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of

parenthood due to declaration of nullity or annulment of marriage as decreed by a court or by a church, provided he/she is entrusted with the custody of the children;

- 7. Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to abandonment of spouse for at least one (1) year;
- 8. Unmarried mother/father who has preferred to keep and rear her/his child/ children instead of having others care for them or giving them up to a welfare institution;
- Any other person who solely provides parental care and support to a child or children, PROVIDED SAID PERSON WAS ENTRUSTED WITH THE CUSTODY OF THE CHILDREN; AND
- 10. Any family member who assumes the responsibility as the head of the family as a result of the death, abandonment, disappearance or prolonged absence of the parents or solo parent.

A change in the status or circumstance of the parent claiming benefits under this Act, such that he/she is no longer left alone with the sole responsibility of parenthood, shall terminate his/her eligibility for these benefits. SAID BENEFITS SHALL SEIZE TO BE AVAILABLE BY THE END OF THE YEAR WHEN THE PARENT WAS LAST DEEMED A SOLO PARENT AS DEFINED BY THIS ACT. PROVIDED, THAT, A SINGLE PARENT WHO IS RECEIVING SUPPORT FROM THE CHILD'S OTHER PARENT SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE THE BENEFITS UNDER SECTION 12-A OF THE ACT.

- b) Children [refer to] those living with and dependent upon the solo parent for support who are unmarried, unemployed and not more than eighteen (18) years of age, or even over eighteen (18) years but are incapable of self-support because of mental and/or physical defect/disability.
- c) Parental Responsibility with respect to their minor children, shall refer to the rights and duties of the parents as defined in Article 220 of Executive Order No. 209, as amended, otherwise known as the "Family Code of the Philippines."
- d) Parental leave [shall mean] leave benefits granted to a solo parent to enable him/ her to perform parental duties and responsibilities where physical presence is required.
- e) Flexible work schedule is the right granted to a solo parent/

1	employee to vary his/ her arrival and departure time, without
2	affecting the core work hours as defined by the employer.
3	SEC. 2. Section 8 of the Act is likewise amended to read as follows:
4	"Section 8. Parental Leave - In addition to leave privileges under
5	existing laws, parental leave of not more than seven (7) working days
6 7	WITH PAY every year shall be granted to any solo parent employee who has rendered service of at least one (1) year."
8	SEC. 3. There shall be created and inserted Section 12-A of the Act to
9	read as follows:
10	"SECTION 12-A. ADDITIONAL BENEFITS IN ADDITION TO THE
11	FOREGOING BENEFITS, SOLO PARENTS WHO HAVE BEEN QUALIFIED AS
12	SUCH BY THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT
13	(DSWD) SHALL LIKEWISE BE ENTITLED TO THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL
14	BENEFITS:
15	1. TEN PERCENT (10%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PURCHASES OF
16	CLOTHING AND CLOTHING MATERIALS FOR THE CHILD MADE
17	WITHIN A PERIOD OF UP TO TWO (2) YEARS FROM THE CHILD'S
18 19	BIRTH; 2. FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PURCHASES OF BABY'S
20	MILK, FOOD AND FOOD SUPPLEMENTS MADE WITHIN A PERIOD OF
21	TWO (2) YEARS FROM THE CHILD'S BIRTH;
22	3. FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) DISCOUNT FROM ALL PURCHASES OF
23	MEDICINES AND OTHER MEDICAL SUPPLEMENTS/SUPPLIES FOR
24	THE CHILD MADE WITHIN A PERIOD OF FIVE (5) YEARS FROM
25	THE CHILD'S BIRTH;
26	4. TEN PERCENT (10%) DISCOUNT FROM PRIMARY, SECONDARY AND
27	TERITARY EDUCATION TUITION FEES; AND
28	5. BASIC PERSONAL EXEMPTION FROM INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX IN
29	THE AMOUNT OF FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (PHP 50,000.00) IN
30	ADDITION TO THE EXISTING EXEMPTION THAT THE SINGLE
31	PARENT MAY CLAIM FOR HIS/HER DEPENDENT CHILD OR
32	CHILDREN.
33	COMPANIES OR BUSINESSES FROM WHOM DISCOUNTED PURCHASES ARE
34	MADE AS PER THE IMMEDIATELY FOREGOING SECTION SHALL BE
35	ENTITLED TO CLAIM THE SAID DISCOUNTS AS PART OF THEIR BUSINESS
36	EXPENSE, PROVIDED THAT, THEY MAINTAIN DETAILED AND SEPARATE
37	RECORDS OF SAID PURCHASES."

1	SEC. 4. There shall be created and inserted Section 12-B of the Act to
2	read as follows:

4	"SECTION 12-B. SUPPORT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND
5	DEVELOPMENT (DSWD) AS THE IMPLEMENTING AGENCY OF THIS ACT, THE
6	DSWD SHALL PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING:
7	
8	1. ISSUANCE OF IDENTIFICATION CARDS (IDS) TO SOLO PARENTS — THE IDS SHALL
9	SERVE AS A BASIS FOR THE PROVISION OF OTHER BENEFITS INDICATED IN THIS
10	ACT;
11	2. AN OFFICE OF SOLO PARENTS IN EVERY PROVINCE, CITY AND MUNICIPALITY -
12	THE OFFICE SHALL ALSO SERVE A THE HUB FOR SOLO PARENTS IN THE AREA,
13	CREATING A SUPPORT SYSTEM FOR EACH SOLO PARENTS; AND
14	3. FREE LEGAL ASSISTANCE - THE DSWD SHALL COORDINATE WITH THE
15	DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE (DOJ) FOR THE PROVISION OF FREE LEGAL
16	ASSISTANCE TO SOLO PARENTS."

18	SEC. 5. There shall also be inserted and renumbered Section 13 to read
19	as follows:
20	"SECTION 13. PENALTIES ANY PERSON OR COMPANY WHO VIOLATES
21	THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT BY DENYING OR HINDERING A SOLO
22	PARENT FROM AVAILING OF ANY OF THE BENEFITS OF THIS ACT SHALL
23	BE PENALIZED BY A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS
24	(PHP 50,000.00) FOR THE FIRST VIOLATION; ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND
25	PESOS (PHP 100,000.00) FOR THE SECOND VIOLATION; AND TWO
26	HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (PHP 200,000.00) FOR THE THIRD
27	VIOLATION.
28	IN ADDITION TO SAID FINE, THE SAID BUSINESS MAY BE ORDERED
29	CLOSED BY THE APPROPRIATE IMPLEMENTING AGENCY."

30	SEC. 6. Implementing Rules and Regulations Within sixty (60) days
31	from the effectivity of this Act, the Inter-agency Committee created by the

37	SEC 8. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations
38	or other issuances or parts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby
39	repealed or modified accordingly.

- **SEC 9.** *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines.
