# AN ACT TO FURTHER STRENGTHEN THE OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

It is the declared policy of the State to protect the rights and promote the welfare of the Filipino worker. Pursuant to this policy and to ensure efficient and effective performance in the legal service of the Government, the Office of the Solicitor General should be further strengthened.

This bill provides for the upgrading of the standards, benefits and privileges and increasing the funding of the Office of the Solicitor General. It also provides for survivorship benefits to surviving spouse and legitimate children of a deceased or retired OSG member.

Approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

## AN ACT

# TO FURTHER STRENGTHEN THE OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 9417 is hereby amended to read as
2	follows:
3	
4	"Sec. 3. Standards The Solicitor General shall have cabinet rank
5	and the same qualifications for appointment, rank, CATEGORY,
6	prerogatives, salaries, allowances, [benefits] EMOLUMENTS, [and]
7	privileges AND RETIREMENT AND ALL OTHER BENEFITS OF AN
8	[as the Presiding Justice of the Court of Appeals;] ASSOCIATE JUSTICE
9	OF THE SUPREME COURT; an Assistant Solicitor General, those of an
10	Associate Justice of the Court of Appeals.
11	
12	The qualifications for appointment, rank, CATEGORY,
13	prerogatives, salaries, ALLOWANCES, EMOLUMENTS, PRIVILEGES,
14	AND RETIREMENT AND ALL OTHER BENEFITS [and privileges] of
15	Solicitors shall be the same as judges, specified as follows:
16	
17	Senior State Solicitor - Regional Trial Court Judge
18	State Solicitor II - Metropolitan Trial Court Judge
19	State Solicitor I - Municipal Trial Court in Cities Judge
20	
21	The Solicitor General shall determine the qualifications,
22	prerogatives and responsibilities of the Associate Solicitors."
23	
24	
25	SECTION 2. Section 5 of Republic Act No. 9417 is hereby amended to read as
26	follows:
27	
28	"Sec. 5. Benefits and Privileges Subject to the availability of
29	funds, the Office of the Solicitor General may provide its employees
30	with the following benefits:
31	

1	(1) Health care service through a health maintenance organization
2	(HMO). Expenses for the mandatory annual executive check-up of
3	the Solicitor General, the Assistant Solicitor General, and the
4	Service Heads, shall be for the account of the Office;
5	(2) All employees shall be covered by accident insurance policies
6	procured by the office at its own expense during travels while in
7	the performance of their official duties and functions;
8	(3) Without prejudice to efficiency in the service, scholarship to
9	deserving employees on official time and at the expense of the
10	Office of the Solicitor General to enhance their academic growth
11	and upgrade their knowledge and skills. Scholars under this
12	provision shall be selected on the basis of competitive examination;
13	[and]
14	(4) A provident fund which shall consist of contributions made both
15	by the Office of the Solicitor General and by its lawyers and
16	employees to a common fund for the payment of benefits to such
17	lawyers or employees or their heirs; AND
18	(5) Other perquisites and benefits as may be determined by the
19	Solicitor General in the exigencies of the service."
20	8
21	SECTION 3. Section 11 of Republic Act No. 9417 is hereby amended to read as
22	follows:
23	
24	"Sec. 11. Funding The funds required for the implementation,
25	including those for health care services, insurance premiums,
26	professional, educational, registration fees, contracted
27	transportation benefits, the other benefits above, shall be taken
28	from:
29	
30	(i) <b>TWENTY PERCENT (20%)</b> [five percent (5%)] of monetary
31	awards OR ASSETS given by the Courts to client departments,
32	agencies and instrumentalities of the Government, including those
33	under court-approved compromise agreements AND TWENTY
34	PERCENT (20%) OF ASSETS AWARDED TO THE
35	<b>GOVERNMENT IN FORFEITURE PROCEEDINGS</b> ;
36	(ii) fifty percent (50%) of fees collected by the Special Committee
37	on Naturalization; and
38	(iii) all other income, fees and revenues earned and collected by
39	the Office of the Solicitor General.
40	
41	For this purposes, the Office of the Solicitor General is hereby
42	authorized to charge deputation, certification and other similar fees
43	in the cases that it handles.
44	
45	The amounts collected pursuant to this section shall constitute a
46	trust fund in the name of the Office of the Solicitor General to be
47	managed and used by the Solicitor General to carry out the
48	provisions of this Act.
49	
50	THE OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL IS LIKEWISE
51	AUTHORIZED TO BORROW FUNDS AND DISPOSE OF ITS
52	ASSETS TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT."
53	

SECTION 4. A New Section 10 shall hereafter be added to Republic Act No. 9417, after which renumber the succeeding sections accordingly:

> "SEC. 10. SURVIVORSHIP. - UPON DEATH OF A SOLICITOR GENERAL, ASSISTANT SOLICITOR GENERAL, SENIOR STATE SOLICITOR OR STATE SOLICITOR OF THE OSG, IF SAID OSG OFFICIAL HAD RETIRED OR WAS IN THE SERVICE AT THE TIME OF DEATH, THE SURVIVING LEGITIMATE SPOUSE AND DEPENDENT CHILDREN OF SAID OSG OFFICAL SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE ON A MONTHLY BASIS ALL THE RETIREMENT BENEFITS THAT THE DECEASED WAS RECEIVING OR ENTITLED TO **RECEIVE** AT THE TIME OF DEATH UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE APPLICABLE RETIREMENT LAWS THEN IN FORCE.

"DEPENDENT" 17 Α **MEANS** Α LEGITIMATE, ILLEGITIMATE OR LEGALLY ADOPTED CHILD WHO IS CHIEFLY DEPENDENT WITH THE ABOVE-ENUMERATED 19 DECEASED OSG OFFICIALS IF SUCH DEPENDENT IS NOT 20 21 MORE THAN **TWENTY-ONE** (21) YEARS OF AGE. 22 UNMARRIED AND NOT GAINFULLY EMPLOYED OR IF SUCH DEPENDENT, REGARDLESS OF AGE, IS INCAPABLE 23 OF SELF-SUPPORT BECAUSE OF MENTAL OR PHYSICAL 24 25 DEFECT. THE SAID SURVIVING LEGITIMATE SPOUSE SHALL CONTINUE TO RECEIVE SUCH RETIREMENT 26 BENEFITS DURING HIS/HER LIFETIME OR UNTIL HE/SHE 27 PROVIDED, THAT IF **REMARRIES.** THE SURVIVING LEGITIMATE SPOUSE IS RECEIVING BENEFITS UNDER 30 EXISTING RETIREMENT LAWS, HE/SHE SHALL ONLY BE ENTITLED TO THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE AMOUNT 31 32 PROVIDED FOR IN THIS ACT AND THE BENEFITS HE/SHE IS RECEIVING. PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT SAID BENEFITS 34 SHALL BE GRANTED TO ALL **AFOREMENTIONED** MEMBERS OF THE OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL WHO DIED OR RETIRED PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVITY OF THIS ACT.

FUNDS FOR THE INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE TAKEN OUT OF THE CURRENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE RETIREMENT OF THE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL AND/OR SAVING OF SAID OFFICE. THEREAFTER, SUCH SUMS AS MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE CONTINUED IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL GENERAL **APPROPRIATIONS ACT."** 

SECTION 5. Retroactive Clause. - The retirement benefits provided for under 49 Section 1 of this Act shall have retroactive effect as of the date of effectivity of Republic 50 51 Act No. 9417.

47 48 SECTION 6. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act is declared
unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof not affected shall continue
in full force and effect.

5 **SECTION 7.** *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days 6 after its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general 7 circulation.
