AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE GRANT OF A TEACHING SUPPLIES ALLOWANCE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. *Title*. This Act shall be known as the
 "Teaching Supplies Allowance Act of 2017".
- SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared to be the policy of the State to promote and improve the economic status of teachers and assist them in providing

quality education to their students.

SEC. 3. Teaching Supplies Allowance. — A Teaching
Supplies Allowance for the purchase of chalks, erasers,
forms, and other classroom supplies and materials in the

- amount of Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) per teacher per
 school year is hereby authorized.
- 3 SEC. 4. Coverage. The grant of the cash allowance 4 authorized in this Act shall be limited to teachers who are 5 engaged in actual classroom teaching in public basic

education.

7 SEC. 5. Funding. - In the first year of the effectivity 8 of this Act, the amount of Two thousand five hundred pesos 9 (P2,500.00) per teacher per school year, shall be charged 10 against the current appropriations of the Department of 11 Education (DepEd) for the Teaching Supplies Allowance, while the additional amount of Two thousand five hundred 12 13 pesos (P2,500.00) per teacher per school year, shall be 14 charged against any available funds and/or savings of the 15 DepEd. Thereafter, the amount of Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) per teacher per school year, shall be included 16 17 in the DepEd budget for the Teaching Supplies Allowance 18 under the General Appropriations Act.

1	SEC. 6. Periodic Review for Increases. – The Secretary
2	of Education is hereby mandated to conduct a periodic
3	review of the Teaching Supplies Allowance, taking into
4	account the current prices of classroom supplies, and, if
5	warranted, recommend the necessary increase in the
5	amount of the allowance.

SEC. 7. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, resolutions, orders or ordinances, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with this Act, are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SEC. 8. Effectivity Clause. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
