AN ACT
ESTABLISHING A CRISIS CENTER FOR STREET CHILDREN IN EVERY
REGION OF THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This measure seeks to provide establishment of centers for street children in every region in the country.

Increasing poverty in the country's urban centers such as Metro Manila, Cebu and Davao is causing a corresponding rise in the number of street children. This observation is borne out by reports of the Department of Social Welfare and Development in every budget hearings about the status of street children in the country. A study of the DSWD lists four factors responsible for the street children phenomenon, to wit: poverty and underemployment of the country; rapid urbanization; inequitable distribution of the national wealth; and an ailing national economy.

The Department of Social Welfare and Development extends assistance to these children through its "Lingap" Centers which implement a program aimed at developing the children's potentials and reviving their hope for a better future. But the assistance is not enough, for the government can only do so much. In this regard, remedial measures must be restored to and legislation can help in that respect. However, whatever measure may be taken, it must be done now for the youth of today who will be the parents and leaders of tomorrow and who, in turn, will inculcate in their young, their own values, which may be different from what we want.

In accordance with the firm commitment of the government of promoting children's right when it signed two (2) international covenants in September

1990, namely: the UN Convention of the Rights of the Child (CRC) and the World Declaration on Children's Survival, Protection and Development, as well as the participation of both the DSWD and the Council for the Welfare of Children not to mention the participation of NGOs for the betterment of our children especially the in-and-out school youth and in furtherance of our tasks as responsible guardians of the Filipino children's future, the swift passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 **SECTION 1.** Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Street Children
2 **Crisis Center Act".**
3

4 **SECTION 2.** Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared as policy of
5 the State to defend the right of children to assistance, including the proper
6 care and nutrition, and to provide them with special protection against all
7 forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation and other conditions prejudicial
8 to their development.
9

10 **SECTION 3.** Coverage. - This Act shall cover all persons below
11 eighteen (18) years of age and roaming in the streets without supervision of
12 adults, whether parents, relatives or friends.
13

14 **SECTION 4.** Program Framework. - There shall be a comprehensive
15 program to be formulated by the Department of Social Welfare and
16 Development (DSWD), in coordination with the Department of Interior and
17 Local Government (DILG), to protect street children from circumstances,
18 which endanger their survival and normal development. Such program shall
19 include but not limited to the following:
20

21 a) Emergency medical and feeding program;

- 1 b) Temporary shelter for street children who have been separated
- 2 from their respective homes and who have been staying in the
- 3 streets;
- 4 c) Basic educational, legal and counsel services;
- 5 d) Immediate rehabilitation program for those identified as substance
- 6 abusers;
- 7 e) Programs geared towards the acquisition of livelihood, technical,
- 8 social and other related skills, which would help the children
- 9 become productive members of society;
- 10 f) Support system provided by the Local Government Units;
- 11 g) Referral network of assistance consisting of other government
- 12 agencies;
- 13 h) Program for securing foster homes or employment best suited to
- 14 the individual child's capacity, training and personality;
- 15 i) A follow-up program for monitoring the progress of each child,
- 16 after a certain period of time, to determine other interventions
- 17 needed to further enhance the normal development of the child;
- 18 j) Information, education and communication campaign/programs to
- 19 promote the objectives of this Act; and
- 20 k) Such other functions as may be necessary for the effective
- 21 implementation of this Act.

22
 23 **SECTION 5. Implementing Agency.** - The program shall be
 24 implemented by the Department of Social Welfare in close coordination with
 25 the Local Government Units (LGUs) concerned.
 26

27 The local officials may call upon private and responsible volunteers of
 28 the community to assist in the care of street children by providing
 29 consultative services for medical, educational and other needs of children.
 30

31 **SECTION 6. Functions of the Department of Social Welfare and**
 32 **Development.** - The Department shall:
 33

- 34 a. Formulate the criteria for the selection and qualification of street
- 35 children who shall be covered by this Act;
- 36 b. Provide training for crisis center workers, counselors and other
- 37 volunteers;
- 38 c. Coordinate activities of non-government organizations with the
- 39 crisis center workers and other social workers of the
- 40 Department in order that their services may be fully utilized
- 41 for the attainment of the program goals;
- 42 d. Protect and assist abused, neglected or exploited children and
- 43 secure proper government assistance for said street children;
- 44 and
- 45 e. Promulgate the necessary implementing rules and regulations
- 46 within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Act.

1 **SECTION 7. Appropriations.** - The funds necessary for the
2 implementation of this Act shall be taken from the following sources:
3

- 4 a. The funds for the establishment, maintenance and operation of
5 the crisis center for street children in every region shall be
6 included in the General Appropriations Act as part of the
7 annual budget of the Department of Social Welfare and
8 Development.
9 b. A portion of the health programs available to the Philippines
10 under official aid or official debt arrangements from foreign
11 countries, the amount to be determined by the Office of the
12 President, shall be extended in support of the crisis centers.
13 c. Funds for the establishment of sub-regional crisis center, as may
14 be deemed necessary shall be included in the budget of the
15 LGUs concerned.
16

17 **SECTION 8. Authority to Accept Donations.** - The Department of
18 Social Work and Development may accept donations and grants, both
19 domestic and foreign, for purposes relevant to the functions of the crisis
20 centers. These donations and grants shall be allocated among the regional
21 crisis centers nationwide.
22

23 **SECTION 9. Joint Oversight Committee.** - There is hereby created a
24 Joint Oversight Committee to oversee the implementation of this Act. The
25 Oversight Committee shall be composed of five (5) members each from the
26 Senate and the House of Representatives in addition to the Chairs of the
27 Senate Committee on Youth, Women and Family Relations and that of the
28 House Committee on the Welfare of the Children.
29

30 **SECTION 10. Separability Clause.** - If any portion of this Act be
31 declared unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or any provision not
32 affected thereby shall be remain in force and effect.
33

34 **SECTION 11. Repealing Clause.** - All laws, decrees, rules and
35 regulations, and executive orders contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are
36 hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
37

38 **SECTION 12. Effectivity Clause.** - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)
39 days after its publication in at least two (2) national newspapers of general
40 circulation.
