EXPLANATORY NOTE

The right to suffrage is the essence of democracy. It is both a manner through which we can hold our officials accountable and a way in which we can express our aspirations for our future. That being said, it is imperative upon our government to ensure that our electorate will have all the possible opportunities to have their voices heard during the elections. Parenthetically, there should be no room for disenfranchisement of voters.

However, some sectors in our society are unable to cast their vote because their profession requires them to work in locations away from the precincts where they are registered. They are the government officials, who enforce and execute the law; the media practitioners, who cover the elections; and the election lawyers who advocate for the candidates. It would be injustice if they were to be deprived of their right to vote simply because their work requires them to participate in the conduct of elections.

This bill amends R.A. No. 7166, otherwise known as "An Act Providing for Synchronized National and Local Elections and for Electoral Reforms, Authorizing Appropriations Therefor, and for Other Purposes," by expanding the qualified voters for local absentee voting.

	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:		
8	SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as "Local Absentee Voting		
9	Act."		
10	SEC. 2. Section 12 of Republic Act No. 7166, otherwise known as "An Act		
11	Providing for Synchronized National and Local Elections and for Electoral Reforms,		
12	Authorizing Appropriations Therefor, and for Other Purposes," shall be amended to		
13	read as follows:		
14	"Section 12. LOCAL Absentee Voting Absentee voting		
15	[as provided for in Executive Order No. 157 dated March 30,		
16	1987] shall apply to the elections for President, Vice-President,		
17	Senators, AND PARTY LIST REPRESENTATIVES only and		
18	shall be limited to [members of the Armed Forces of the		
19	Philippines and the Philippine National Police and other		
20	government officers and employees] PERSONS, AS		

PROVIDED IN SECTION 12-A OF THIS ACT, who are duly

25	SEC. 3. Section 12-A shall be inserted after Section 12 of Republic Act No

55	FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ACT, THE SEPARATE TOTAL		
56	NUMBERS OF ELECTION LAWYERS AND ELECTORAL STAFF		
57	PER CANDIDATE SHALL NOT BE MORE THAN THE TOTAL		
58	NUMBER OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS, INCLUDING		
59	PROVINCES, INDEPENDENT CITIES, COMPONENT CITIES,		
60	AND MUNICIPALITIES, AT THE TIME OF THE ELECTION. IF		
61	AN ELECTION LAWYER SHALL HAVE BEEN RETAINED BY		
62	MORE THAN ONE CANDIDATE, HE MAY ONLY AVAIL OF		
63	ABSENTEE VOTING FOR ONE CANDIDATE."		
64	SEC. 4. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – The COMELEC shall,		
65	within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the implementing		
66	rules and regulations which shall include a system of accreditation and verification of		
67	the persons who avail of local absentee voting.		

- 68 SEC. 5. Separability Clause. If any provision or part hereof, is held 69 invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise 70 affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
- SEC. 6. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or is inconsistent with the provision of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
- 75 **SEC. 7.** Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after 76 its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
