AN ACT

PROVIDING EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS TO THE SURVIVING CHILDREN OF MEMBERS OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE WHO WERE SLAIN IN THE LINE OF DUTY, CREATING THE PNP EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS FUND, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Explanatory Note

Article 2, Section 5 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that the maintenance of peace and order is essential for the enjoyment by all people of the blessings of democracy. However, as the Mamasapano incident reminded us recently, the maintenance of peace and order is not without risk to those who pursue it or their families, particularly the members of the Philippine National Police (PNP).

Recognizing the considerable harm faced by members of the PNP, this bill seeks to institutionalize educational benefits to the surviving children of policemen who are slain in the line of action. It proposes that all surviving children of members of the PNP who are killed in the line of duty shall be entitled to educational benefits from the time they are orphaned up to their completion of secondary education. The benefits shall include tuition, and reasonable allowances for books, school supplies, transportation, clothing and food.

Speedy approval of this bill is urgently sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. – The State recognizes the immense risks and considerable harm faced by members of the Philippine National Police (PNP) in fighting crime and ensuring the peace and order of the general public. As such, it shall be the policy of the State to provide educational benefits to the surviving children of members of the PNP who are slain in the line of duty.

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SECTION 2. Educational Benefits. – All surviving children of members of the PNP who
are killed in the line of duty shall be entitled to educational benefits from the time they are
orphaned up to their completion of secondary education. The benefits shall include tuition and
reasonable allowances for books, school supplies, transportation, clothing, and food.

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SECTION 3. PNP Educational Benefit Trust Fund- There is hereby created a trust fund, to be known as the PNP Educational Benefits Trust Fund, hereinafter referred to as "the Fund", which shall be used exclusively for the provision of educational benefits under this act and shall be funded through the following:

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a) Annual Appropriations;

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2	b)	50% of proceeds generated from examination stamps, clearance and certification fees

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5	c)	All proceeds from license fees for firearms and fines and penalties collected by the

8	d)	All interest income of the trust fund; and
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10	e)	Grants, donations and endowments from domestic and foreign sources, pursuant to

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13	SECTION 4. Administration of the Fund The fund shall be administered by the	
14		Police Commission, in accordance with existing government auditing rules and
15	regulation	IS.
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17	SECTION 5. Annual Report. – The National Police Commission shall annually submit to	
18	the Office of the President, the Senate, and the House of Representatives a report on the	
19	disbursem	ent and utilization of the Fund.
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21	SECTION 6. Nondiminuition of Benefits. – Nothing in this Act shall be construed to	
22	reduce existing benefits granted under existing laws, decrees, executive orders, or any contract,	
23	agreemen	t, or policy between the employer and employee.
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25	SECTION 7. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – Within six months from the	
26	effectivity of this Act, the National Police Commission, in coordination with Philippine National	
27	Police, Department of Interior and Local Government, and the Unified Student Financial	
28	Assistance System for Tertiary Education (UniFAST) Board and other relevant government	
29	agencies shall jointly promulgate the rules and regulations for the effective implementation of	
30	this Act.	
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1	SECTION 8. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act shall be held
2	unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not otherwise affected shall remain in full force
3	and effect.
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5	SECTION 9. Repealing Clause Sections 8, 9 and 10 of Republic Act No. 6963 are
6	hereby amended accordingly. All other laws, executive orders, rules and regulations inconsistent
7	with or contrary to this Act, are hereby deemed accordingly repealed or amended.
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9	SECTION 10. Effectivity Clause- This Act shall take effect upon its publication in the
10	Official Gazette.
