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AN ACT ESTABLISHING REFUGE AND ASSISTANCE TO YOUNG PREGNANT WOMEN IN EVERY PROVINCE AND CITY OF THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The National Statistics Office reported that more and more young women, particularly teenagers, are giving birth and becoming mothers at an early age. In 2010, a total of two hundred seven thousand eight hundred ninety eight (207,898) mothers aged twenty and below gave birth, compared to one hundred twenty six thousand twenty five (126,025) in 2000<sup>1</sup>.

To ease the burden of young child-bearing women, the proposed law seeks to establish refuge and medical assistance centers all over the country. The center will serve as a temporary shelter to pregnant women, who by reason of their youth, need protection and assistance of the State. The proposed bill likewise aims to provide young women medical assistance and guidance in child-care and self-enhancement, as well as livelihood generation.

The provision of the proposed law is consistent with the policy of the State recognized in Section 3, Article XV of the Philippine Constitution which provides that: "the State shall... defend the right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition, and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation and other conditions prejudicial to their development. It is likewise a recognition of women's fundamental role in nation-building as declared in Article II, Section 14 of the Philippine Constitution.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly recommended.

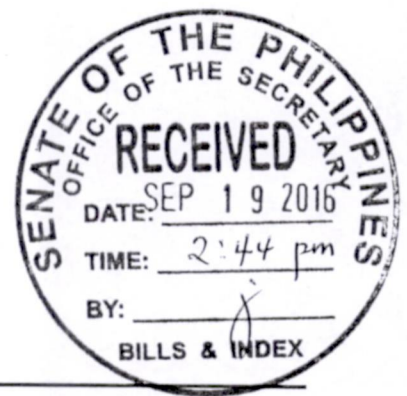

5 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress*  
6 *assembled:*  
7

8 SECTION 1. *Short Title.* This Act shall be known as the “Young Women’s Refuge and  
9 Assistance Act.”  
10

11 SECTION 2. *Declaration of Policy.* It is hereby declared the policy of the State to value the  
12 dignity of young women and recognize their fundamental role in nation-building. Towards this  
13 end, the State shall protect and promote the physical, moral, and social well-being of young  
14 women by providing them with facilities and opportunities that will enhance their welfare and  
15 assist them in their endeavors with a goal to help them realize their full potential in the service  
16 of the nation.  
17

18 SECTION 3. *Establishment of Refuge and Assistance Centers.* In order to carry out the above-  
19 declared policy, there shall be established in every province and city all over the country  
20 Refuge and Assistance Centers for Young Pregnant Women (hereinafter referred to as the  
21 “Centers”).  
22

23 SECTION 4. *Beneficiaries.* The beneficiaries of this law shall include all young women who  
24 are twenty-one years (21) of age and below who are pregnant, or who suffered a miscarriage  
25 or abortion, and their children.  
26

27 SECTION 5. *Refuge and Assistance Center.* The Centers shall be under the management and  
28 supervision of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (“DSWD”) with the  
29 coordination and assistance of the Department of Health (“DOH”). The Centers shall be  
30 headed by a Director who shall be appointed by the President of the Philippines. The Directors  
31 of the Centers shall hold a masters or doctorate degree in Social Work or Community  
32 Development or similar courses and shall have a minimum experience of five (5) years in  
33 counseling, social and psychological services and other related field or experience.  
34

35 Each Center shall have the following personnel: (a) at least one doctor or midwife; and (b)  
36 such other personnel necessary to provide assistance to the beneficiaries of this Act.  
37

38 SECTION 6. *Functions of the Centers.* The Centers shall have the following functions:

39 a) to provide temporary shelter and refuge to beneficiaries of this Act;

- 1 b) to provide free medical assistance, including monthly pre-natal checkup, or such other  
2 care for young women to prevent potential risks from child-bearing, and all other medical  
3 services for childbirth and delivery, and provide them free pre-natal vitamin and other  
4 medication;  
5  
6 c) to undertake programs geared towards the development of maternal and child health care,  
7 self-enhancement and the development of skills for livelihood generation, social  
8 communication, and other related skills which will help women and children to become  
9 productive members of society; and  
10  
11 d) to perform such other function as may be necessary to carry out the objectives of this  
12 Act.  
13

14 SECTION 7. *Rehabilitation and Development Program.* The DSWD in coordination with  
15 DOH shall, within ninety (90) days from the approval of this Act, formulate a program for the  
16 rehabilitation, development and protection of young women and children.  
17

18 SECTION 8. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* The DSWD in coordination with DOH  
19 shall issue the necessary implementing rules and regulations within six (6) months from the  
20 approval of this Act.  
21

22 SECTION 9. *Funding and Appropriations.* The amount necessary for the effective  
23 implementation of this Act shall be charged to the appropriations for the DSWD under the  
24 current General Appropriations Act. Thereafter, such sum as may be necessary for the  
25 continued operation and maintenance of the Centers shall be included in the regular  
26 appropriations for the DSWD in the annual General Appropriations Act.  
27

28 SECTION 10. *Repealing Clause.* All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations that  
29 are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.  
30

31 SECTION 11. *Separability Clause.* If for any reason, any section or part of this Act is held  
32 unconstitutional or invalid, such parts not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.  
33

34 SECTION 12. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the  
35 Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
