RESOLUTION
REGULATING THE USE, INTEGRATION INTO THE RECORDS OF THE SENATE
AND PROPER ARCHIVAL OF FILM, VIDEO CLIPS, MULTIMEDIA OR SIMILAR
DEVICES USED BY ANY SENATOR TO WHOM THE FLOOR HAS BEEN
ASSIGNED BY THE CHAIR IN PLENARY SESSION

WHEREAS, there is a steady increase of the use of video, film clips, multimedia and other similar devices as integral parts of privilege speeches of Senators;

WHEREAS, it is only right that the use thereof are regulated in order to make efficient use of the time of the Senate;

WHEREAS, it is imperative to provide for a maximum length of thirty (30) minutes of film, video clips, multimedia or other similar devices, per speech;

WHEREAS, the aforesaid video clips, multimedia or other similar devices should form part of the records of the Senate by making it accessible at any time at the Legislative Journal Service as well as be properly archived at the Legislative Records and Archives Service;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate to regulate the use of video, film clips, multimedia and other similar devices by limiting its length to a maximum period of thirty (30) minutes per privilege speech;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that all film, video clips, multimedia and other similar devices shown or played before the plenary shall be integrated into the records of the Senate by making it accessible at any time at the Legislative Journal Service and be properly archived at the Legislative Records and Archives Service.
