RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEES ON JUSTICE AND HUMAN RIGHTS, AND CULTURAL COMMUNITIES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE ROOT CAUSES OF INTERNAL DISPLACEMENT OF INDIGENOUS CULTURAL COMMUNITIES (ICCS)/INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S (IPS) WITH THE END IN VIEW OF ENACTING LEGISLATION TO UPHOLD RIGHTS OF INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS (IDPs)

Whereas, Article II, Section 22 of the 1987 Constitution states that "[t]he State
 recognizes and promotes the rights of indigenous cultural communities within the
 framework of national unity and development";

Whereas, Article XII, Section 5 of the same provides that "[t]he State, subject
to the provisions of this Constitution and national development policies and
programs, shall protect the rights of indigenous cultural communities to their
ancestral lands to ensure their economic, social and cultural well being";

8 Whereas, Republic Act No. 8371, also known as the "Indigenous People's 9 Rights Act of 1997" further provides that the State shall protect the rights of 10 Indigenous Cultural Communities (ICCs)/Indigenous People's (IPs) to their ancestral 11 domains to ensure their economic, social and cultural well being and shall recognize 12 the applicability of customary laws governing property rights or relations in 13 determining the ownership and extent of ancestral domain;

Whereas, according to the United Nations Guiding Principles on Internal Displacement, internally displaced persons (IDPs) are "persons or groups of persons who have been forced or obliged to flee or to leave their homes or places of habitual residence, in particular as a result of or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflict, situations of generalized violence, violations of human rights or natural or humanmade disasters, and who have not crossed an internationally recognized border"¹;

Whereas, reports from local and international human rights groups show that the indigenous cultural group and Lumad in Mindanao have been displaced from their ancestral lands and were forced to live in evacuation centers or temporary shelters as a result of development aggression such as mining activities coupled with military operations in support thereto;

Whereas, the UNHCR report revealed that in 2015, in Mindanao alone, a total
of 407,397 persons have been forced to flee their homes, of which around 37,000
persons have been repeatedly displaced mostly because of armed conflict, clan war,
and generalized form of violence including human rights violations².

10 *Whereas,* further, these conflict-related displacements recorded an increase of 11 127% compared to 2014;

Whereas, the displaced indigenous people (IP) and Lumad themselves have 12 vehemently blamed the government's counter-insurgency program in support of the 13 unregulated mining operations, land conversions and pillaging of natural resources 14 15 in their ancestral domains as members of the communities fall victim to displacement and numerous human rights violations, such as arbitrary detention, 16 persecution, killings of community representatives, demolition of houses, destruction 17 of property, rape, and forced recruitment but the perpetrators - state as well as 18 private armed forces – are usually not held responsible; 19

Whereas, under the doctrine of "parens patriae", the government as the legal protector of citizens who are unable to protect themselves, should address the plight of the displaced ICCs and IPs vis-à-vis the harmful effects of disasters, militarization and development aggression in their communities;

Whereas, the official statement of the UN Special Rapporteur on Internally Displaced Persons³ on his visit in the country in 2015 states that the [Philippine] Government should ensure that the rights of IDPs will be upheld, whether displaced by natural disaster, conflict or development, and that for a country prone to disasters and the displacement effects of long-standing conflicts, it is essential to enshrine the rights and protection of IDPs into law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the
 Committees on Justice and Human Rights, and Cultural Communities to conduct an
 inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the root causes of internal displacement of
 indigenous cultural communities (ICCs)/indigenous people's (IPs) with the end in
 view of enacting legislation upholding rights of internally displaced persons (IDPs).
