AN ACT CREATING THE PHILIPPINE BOXING COMMISSION TO STRENGTHEN THE BOXING INDUSTRY AND PROMOTE THE SAFETY AND WELFARE OF FILIPINO BOXERS, AND **PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR**

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives in Congress assembled:

SECTION. 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Philippine 1 Boxing Commission Act of 2017". 2

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is the declared policy to strengthen 3 and ensure the continued growth of the boxing industry in the country through 4 a national government agency that will not only pursue the sports' development 5 program but also utilize the sport as a source of revenue and employment to 6 promote the safety and welfare of Filipino boxers, and provide supplemental 7 assistance to the industry's registered stakeholders. 8

SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. - For purposes of this Act, the following 9 terms shall be defined as follows: 10

a. **Commission** – shall refer to the Philippine Boxing Commission; 11

- 12 b. **Boxer** – means an individual who fights another in a boxing match;
- c. License shall refer to a document issued by the Commission 13 authorizing a person or entity to be a professional boxer, to perform 14 duties as a coach or trainer of a professional boxer, a promoter for a 15 professional boxing match, or a judge or referee in said match; 16
- d. Manager means a person who receives compensation for service as 17 18 an agent or representative of a professional boxer;

e. **Permit** – shall refer to a document issued by the Commission authorizing a person or entity to hold, promote or engage in the conduct or operation of a professional boxing match;

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- f. **Primary beneficiaries** for purposes of this Act, shall refer to the spouse and children;
- g. Professional boxer shall refer to a boxer who is issued a license by the Commission to receive a sum of money or other compensation as a salary or prize money for fighting in a boxing match;
- h. **Professional boxing match** shall refer to a boxing match held in the Philippines between professional boxers that shall receive money or other compensation for fighting in said match, but shall not refer to a boxing contest that is regulated by an amateur sports organization;
- i. Promoter shall refer to a person, group of persons, or an entity, 13 licensed as such by the Commission and primarily responsible for 14 organizing, promoting, and producing a professional boxing match. 15 The term "promoter" does not include a hotel, casino, resort, or other 16 commercial establishment hosting or sponsoring a professional 17 boxing match unless - (i) the hotel, casino, resort, or other 18 commercial establishment is primarily responsible for organizing, 19 20 promoting and producing the match; and (ii) there is no person or group of persons primarily responsible for organizing, promoting and 21 22 producing the match;
- j. Secondary beneficiaries for purposes of this Act, shall refer to the
 parents, and in their absence, to the siblings.

SEC. 4. Creation of the Philippine Boxing Commission. – For the purpose of carrying out the above declared policy, there is hereby created the Philippine Boxing Commission, hereinafter referred to as the Commission, which shall be directly under the administrative supervision of the Office of the President.

30 SEC. 5. *Objectives*. – The Commission shall have the following 31 objectives:

a) To strengthen the boxing industry in the Philippines towards
 developing world-class professional boxers;

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b) To utilize the sport for revenue and employment in order to promote
the safety and welfare of boxers and provide supplemental assistance to the
industry's registered stakeholders;

SEC. 6. *Membership.* – The Commission shall be composed of a Chairman and six (6) members that shall be appointed by the President of the Philippines: *Provided*, that the Chairman and two of the members shall be chosen from nominees of the Games and Amusement Board, one Member chosen from the nominee of the Department of Health, and three Members from the private sectors.

Nominations by the GAB and the DOH shall be submitted to the Office of the President thirty (30) days prior to expiration of the term of office of incumbents, or within thirty (30) days from the occurrence of any vacancy in the Commission. Said nominees shall have nationally recognized experience and comprehensive knowledge in professional boxing activities and known integrity.

SEC. 7. *Term of Office.* – The term of office of the commissioners shall be six (6) years; *Provided*, that no vacancy shall be filled except for the unexpired portion of any term; and *Provided*, *further*, that the Chairman or any member of the Commission whose term of office has expired shall hold over in office until his successor shall have been appointed and has qualified. The Chairman and members of the Commission may be suspended or removed by the President of the Philippines.

SEC. 8. *Meetings and Quorum.* The Commission shall meet regularly once a month and as often as the exigencies of the service may demand, upon the call of the Chairman or upon the request of three (3) members of the Commission. The vote of a majority of the entire Membership shall be necessary for the adoption of any rule, resolution or decision of the Commission.

SEC. 9. Allowances and Per Diems. – The Chairman and members of the Commission shall each receive a monthly allowance of eight thousand pesos and a per diem not to exceed five hundred pesos for each meeting actually attended by him: *Provided*, that such allowance and per diems shall not exceed twelve thousand pesos during one month.

SEC. 10. Powers and Duties of the Commission. - The Commission
 shall have the following powers:

a) To formulate, review and update the rules and procedures related to professional boxing in the Philippines in conformity to international standards in order to regulate the boxing industry for the accomplishment of its objectives;

7 b) To establish rules, set requirements, and collect fees for the procurement of a license by, or issuance and renewal of a license to a 8 professional boxer, a coach or trainer of a professional boxer, a promoter for a 9 professional boxing match, or a judge or referee in said match, and the 10 procurement of and issuance of a permit for a professional boxing match; or 11 the suspension or revocation of such license or permit, in order to limit 12 participation in professional boxing matches and other related activities to 13 licensed and appropriately fit individuals; 14

15 c) To maintain an integrated registry of professional boxers, coaches, 16 trainers, judges, referees, and promoters who will comprise the registered 17 stakeholders of the industry;

d) To request the assistance and support of any government agency, office or instrumentality including government-owned and controlled corporations, local government units as well as non-governmental organizations or institutions in the pursuit of its objectives and the execution of its other powers and duties;

e) To establish linkages with international boxing organizations or institutions and counterpart agencies of foreign governments in order to facilitate and ensure the participation of Filipino professional boxers in international boxing events;

f) To formulate and implement a comprehensive and progressive health care program, alternative livelihood program, a system of life insurance, disability and death benefits and other benefits for all boxers participating in boxing events/matches sanctioned by the Commission;

g) To facilitate a pension system through the Social Security System
 (SSS) and/or private insurance companies for qualified professional boxers;

h) To determine and set a safety standard for and to ensure that emergency medical personnel and services are available in every professional boxing match in the Philippines;

i) To act as a quasi-judicial board when it shall deem necessary to initiate, undertake, hear and decide any investigation for any violation of its

rules & regulations concerning professional boxing and, in connection
 therewith, shall have the power to issue subpoenae and subpoenae duces
 tecum.

j) To submit an annual report on the implementation of this Act to theOffice of the President and to Congress; and

6 k) To perform such other functions as may be necessary to effectively and7 efficiently carry out the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 11. Secretariat. - The Commission shall constitute and establish 8 a Secretariat that shall be headed by an Executive Director, who shall also be 9 appointed by the President of the Philippines, and staffed as may be 10 determined by the Commission. The Secretariat shall be tasked to implement 11 the policies and programs approved by the Commission, and to administer its 12 duties and day to day functions. Their salaries, allowances and other 13 emoluments shall be determined by the Commission in accordance with Civil 14 Service rules and other relevant and existing laws. 15

16 SEC. 12. Boxing Officials. - All the boxing officials involved in any 17 boxing event shall not receive funds or compensation, in any form, directly or 18 indirectly, from the promoter or its agents. Such funds shall be coursed 19 through and collected by the Commission for appropriate disbursement.

SEC. 13. Health Care Benefits. – All professional boxers shall be enrolled in the National Health Insurance Program (PhilHealth) to enable them to receive and avail of an adequate package of personal health services including, but not limited to, in-patient hospital care, out-patient care, emergency and transfer services, and other supplementary health benefits, as may be provided in the PhilHealth programs. The cost of premium contribution shall be fully paid by the Commission to be directly remitted to the Philhealth.

In case of hospitalization in any government hospital or clinic, any required hospital and physician's fees in excess of PhilHealth benefit shall be shouldered by the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO), provided that the boxer shall comply with the requirements for qualification and grant of health care assistance to be extended by the PCSO consistent with and subject to compliance with PCSO's existing rules and guidelines.

1 SEC. 14. Alternative Livelihood Programs for Retired and/or Injured 2 Professional Boxers. – The Commission, in coordination with various 3 stakeholders in the boxing industry, shall establish an alternative livelihood 4 training program and referral system for retired and/or injured boxing 5 champions.

6 SEC. 15. Retirement Benefits. – Professional Filipino boxers who won a 7 world championship in the World Boxing Championship (WBC), International 8 Boxing Federation (IBF), World Boxing Organization (WBO), World Boxing 9 Association (WBA) shall receive a lifetime retirement pension of Twenty 10 Thousand Pesos (P20,000.00) monthly upon reaching the age of sixty (60). 11 Retirement benefits under this Act shall be separate and distinct from the 12 mandatory requirement benefits provided by existing laws.

The Commission is authorized to adjust the benefits provided in this section every ten (10) years based on studies, consultations, and public hearings with relevant agencies and entities. However, no memorandum order or issuance shall diminish the prescribed retirement incentive benefits.

SEC. 16. Survivorship Benefits. - In the event of the death of the Professional boxer, his/her surviving legal spouse or in the absence of such spouse, his/her other primary beneficiaries together, or in the latter's absence his/her secondary beneficiaries in the order mentioned under Section 3 (j), shall receive the monthly pension due him, as-provided under Section 16 of this Act.

SEC. 17. Education and Training Benefits. – A Professional boxer, or the boxer's designated beneficiary, may avail any of the following scholarship programs, subject to a selection process and accreditation of the participating institutions as may be determined by the Commission:

a) Skills-for Employment Scholarship Program. - For technical or
vocational training scholarship;

b) Education for Development Scholarship Program. – For
b) baccalaureate program; and

31 c) Boxing Sports Science Program. - To ensure the competitive 32 advantage of Filipino boxers in achieving healthy and safety boxing standards.

The annual scholarship lists of all these programs shall be submitted to
 the Commission

3 SEC. 18. Appropriations. - The amount of One Hundred Fifty Million Pesos (P150,000,000.00) shall be appropriated for the initial implementation of 4 this Act, which shall be taken from the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office 5 (PCSO) and the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) in 6 7 equal shares. Thereafter, such amount needed to implement this Act shall be included in the Annual Appropriations of the Commission subject to the 8 retention of the amount mandated under Section 20 of this Act. The 9 Commission is hereby authorized to re-align its appropriations in the current 10 year of the date of effectivity of this Act to conform with the requirements of 11 this Act. 12

SEC. 19. Boxers Welfare Development Trust Fund. - There shall be an 13 independent and separate trust fund established under this Act, to be 14 administered by the Commission. An amount not less than eighty per cent 15 16 (80%) accrued from the licensing, registration and accreditation fees and fines and charges shall be used for the purpose of the Boxers Welfare Development 17 Trust Fund, ten per cent (10%) for the national Government Share and the 18 remaining ten per cent (10%) for administration. The trust fund may also 19 accept grants and donations from national and foreign entities and individuals 20 21 interested in the development of the boxing industry.

The said Trust Fund shall be used for, but not limited to, the death and disability benefits of the professional boxers. The guidelines for the availment of the said benefits shall be determined by the Commission based on the actuarial studies.

SEC. 20. *Transitory Provision.* – Pending the organization of the Commission, the Games and Amusements Board (GAB) shall continue to exercise the duties and functions in relation to professional boxing sports.

Such amount under the Boxer's Welfare Fund, under the GAB shall then be transferred to the Boxers' Welfare Development Trust Fund of the Commission and will form part of the initial appropriations of the Commission.

32 SEC. 21. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). – The 33 Commission in consultation with the Department of Health (DOH), the

Department of Education (DepED), the CHED, the TESDA, the Department of Finance (DOF), the BIR, the PAGCOR, the PCSO, the PhilHealth, among others, and other concerned agencies shall promulgate and issue the IRR within sixty (60) days upon approval of this Act: Provided, That the failure of the Commission to promulgate the rules and regulations shall not prevent the implementation of this Act upon its effectivity.

SEC. 22. Repealing Clause. – Any law, presidential decree or issuance,
executive orders, rules or regulations, or parts thereof not consistent with the
provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 23. Separability Clause. – If any part or provision of this Act shall
 be held unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not
 affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SEC. 24. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
 following its publication in the Official Gazette or in any two (2) newspapers of
 general circulation.
