

INSTITUTIONALIZING THE BALIK SCIENTIST PROGRAM, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Explanatory Note

Several provisions of the 1987 Philippine Constitution ("Constitution") recognize the primary role of science and technology in promoting national development. For instance, Section 17, Article 2 of the Constitution includes science and technology as a priority area in order to foster "patriotism and nationalism, accelerate social progress, and promote total human liberation and development." Furthermore, Section 10, Article 14 states that "science and technology are essential for national development and progress. The State shall give priority to research and development, invention, innovation, and their utilization; and to science and technology education, training, and services."

Unfortunately, the reality is far from the ideals espoused in the Constitution. One major concern is the continuing and overwhelming outflow of Filipino scientists to other countries. According to the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), outbound Science and Technology ("S&T") workers in the Philippines have increased 148 percent from 9,877 in 1998 to 24,502 in 2009.¹ As a result, the presence of Research and Development ("R&D") personnel in the Philippines stands at 165 per a million Filipinos - way below the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) recommendation of 380 per million persons.²

Fortunately, the framers of the Constitution were prudent enough to include a solution. Section 11, Article 14 states that "the Congress may provide for incentives, including tax deductions, to encourage private participation in programs of basic and applied scientific research. Scholarships, grants-in-aid, or other forms of incentives shall be provided to deserving science students, researchers, scientists, inventors, technologists, and specially gifted citizens."

The DOST itself leads in this area as it implements the *"Balik Scientist Program"* (the "Program"). Established in 1975, the Program is a "brain gain" tool for the strengthening of the country's scientific and technological human resources.³

This bill seeks to institutionalize the above-mentioned Program. This bill also seeks to provide benefits, incentives, and programs in order to entice Filipino Scientists to share their expertise with the country on a short, medium and/or long-term basis. In doing so, this bill envisions a future in which Filipino scientists contribute to nation building and inclusive growth through the acceleration of research and development in the country.

In view of the foregoing, speedy approval of this measure is earnestly sought.

INSTITUTIONALIZING THE BALIK SCIENTIST PROGRAM, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress Assembled:

1	ARTICLE I
2	GENERAL PROVISIONS

4	Section 1. Title This Act shall be known as the "Balik Scientist Act of 2017".
5	
6	Section 2. Declaration of Policy The State recognizes the utilization of the
7	expertise of expatriate Filipino scientists and technologists as a vital component of the
8	nation's political, economic, and social development efforts. Hence, it is hereby declared to
9	be the policy of the State to encourage Filipino scientists and technology experts from abroad
10	to return to the Philippines and share their expertise to accelerate the development of the
11	country.

13	Towards this end, the "Balik Scientist" program is hereby institutionalized, in which
14	the State shall provide incentives for foreign-based Filipino scientists, professionals,
15	technicians, or Filipinos with special skills or expertise to share their professional
16	experiences, know-how or expertise in the Philippines in accordance with the implementing
17	rules and regulations which shall be promulgated by the Department of Science and

1 Section 4. Institutionalization of the Balik Scientist Program. - There is hereby 2 established and institutionalized the Balik Scientist program, hereafter referred to as the 3 "Program". Under the Program, a "Balik Scientist" is contracted by the government to return 4 and serve in the Philippines in his or her field of expertise based on a short-, medium-, or 5 long-term engagement.

Section 5. *Program Objectives.* - The Program shall aim to entice foreign-based scientists, professionals, technicians, or any person with special skills or expertise who are of Filipino descent to share their professional experiences, know-how or expertise in the Philippines to strengthen the scientific and technological human resources and knowledge base of the academe, public institutions, and domestic corporations, in order to promote knowledge-sharing and accelerate the flow of new technologies into the country.

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Section 6. *General Benefits, Incentives, and Privileges.* - All *Balik Scientists*, as certified by the DOST, shall be eligible for the following general benefits, incentives, and privileges, including such others which may be provided through additional rules and regulations pursuant to the declared national policy of this Act:

- 19a) Registration as a professional and issuance of a certificate of registration and20license by the PRC, subject to the conditions of Republic Act No. 8981, otherwise21known as the "PRC Modernization Act of 2000"; Provided, that the DOST shall22submit to the PRC the list of all accredited or vetted Balik Scientists, as well as23those who shall serve under the Program, at the end of each award or Project;

c) Subject to applicable provisions of Section 29 of Commonwealth Act No. 613, otherwise known as *"The Philippine Immigration Act of 1940"*, as amended, *Balik Scientists* who have acquired foreign citizenship, including his/her immediate family members, as certified by the DOST, shall be granted by the Secretary of Justice special non-immigrant visas under Section 47 (a) (2) of the same law.
