## AN ACT

EXTENDING THE VALIDITY PERIOD OF DRIVER'S LICENSES, AMENDING FOR THAT PURPOSE SECTION 23 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 4136, AS AMENDED BY BATAS BLG. 398 AND EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1011, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRAFFIC CODE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Section 23 of Republic Act No. 4236, otherwise known as
- 2 the "Land Transportation and Traffic Code," as amended, is hereby further
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 SECTION 23. Issuance of Driver's License, Fees and
- 5 Validity. If, after such examination, the Director or his
- deputies find that the applicant possesses the necessary

qualification and proficiency in the operation of motor vehicles. is able to read and write any of the official languages or a major dialect and knows how to read and interpret various traffic signals and road markings, a professional nonprofessional license may be issued to such applicant upon payment of the fee prescribed in accordance with law, AND WHICH SHALL NOT COST **MORE** THAN THE GOVERNMENT'S PROCUREMENT EXPENSE, but prior to the issuance of said license, the applicant shall present himself in person and have his photograph taken by the [bureau] LAND TRANSPORTATION OFFICE (LTO). All driver's licenses issued shall be signed in the presence of the Director or his deputies and shall bear, among others, the full name, date of birth, height, weight, sex, color of eyes, blood type, complete current address, [right hand thumbprint of the licensee,] BIOMETRICS, license number, and its date of issue and expiration.

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In the issuance of licenses, the [Bureau] LTO shall use such process or adopt such measure as will prevent any alteration or falsification of a license or will enable the [Bureau] LTO to detect any unauthorized license. THE LTO SHALL

ALSO STRIVE TOWARDS CREATING AN ONLINE
APPLICATION PROCESS FOR THE RENEWAL OF
PROFESSIONAL AND NONPROFESSIONAL LICENSES.

Except for student permits and new licenses, all driver's licenses shall be valid for [three] FIVE (5) consecutive years reckoned from the birthdate of the licensee, unless sooner revoked or suspended: Provided, however, That, subject to Section twenty-six hereof, any holder of a professional or nonprofessional driver's license who has not committed any violation during the [three-year] FIVE-YEAR period shall be entitled to a renewal of such license for [five-year period] TEN YEARS.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (LGUs), THE METRO MANILA DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (MMDA) OR OTHER AGENCIES LAWFULLY ISSUING TRAFFIC VIOLATION RECEIPTS SHALL REPORT WITHIN TWENTY FOUR (24) HOURS FROM THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH RECEIPT THE DETAILS OF THE TRAFFIC VIOLATION TO THE LTO, WHICH SHALL SERVE AS THE REPOSITORY OF ALL TRAFFIC VIOLATION RECORDS.

- SECTION 2. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* The Secretary of the
- 2 Department of Transportation, shall, upon the recommendation of the Land
- 3 Transportation Office Assistant Secretary, promulgate not later than thirty (30)
- 4 days from the effectivity of this Act the necessary rules and regulations for its
- 5 effective implementation.
- 6 SECTION 3. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, letters
- of instructions, executive orders, rules, regulations, and other issuances or parts
- 8 thereof which are contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are
- 9 hereby revoked, repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
- SECTION 4. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
- following the completion of its publication in two (2) newspapers of general
- 12 circulation.
