- AN ACT MANDATING THE CONSERVATION OF GABALDON SCHOOL BUILDINGS NATIONWIDE, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Gabaldon
- 2 School Buildings Conservation Act".
- 3 SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* It is hereby declared the policy of 4 the State to conserve and promote the country's historical and cultural heritage 5 and resources. Towards this end, it shall strengthen its efforts and pursue a 6 more proactive role in the conservation and restoration of built heritage, such

as the Gabaldon school buildings, to preserve their architectural, historical,
 and social significance.

SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act:

4 (a) *Conservation* refers to all processes and measures of 5 maintaining the cultural significance of Gabaldon school buildings 6 including preservation, restoration, reconstruction, protection, adaptation 7 or any combination thereof; and

8 (b) Gabaldon school buildings refer to school buildings designed
9 by American Architect William Parsons and funded through Act No. 1801,
10 authored by Assemblyman Isauro Gabaldon.

SEC. 4. Conservation of Gabaldon School Buildings. – The Department of Education (DepED), in consultation with the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA), the National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP), and the National Museum (NM), shall implement a program for the identification and conservation of all Gabaldon school buildings nationwide.

For this purpose, an inventory of all Gabaldon school buildings, whether fully functional or condemned, in all public elementary and secondary schools, shall be jointly undertaken by the DepED and the NCCA to determine the physical status of each structure. School heads shall submit to their respective Schools Division Superintendents, for appropriate action, a report indicating the existence of or any structural damage to any Gabaldon school building in schools under their respective supervisions.

Local government units that have Gabaldon school buildings under their jurisdiction shall likewise adopt measures for the protection and conservation of these structures and shall provide the DepED with the necessary assistance in the implementation of any conservation project.

28 Any modification, alteration, destruction, demolition, or relocation of 29 Gabaldon school buildings shall be strictly prohibited. In cases where

conservation measures are necessary, the DepED, in coordination with the 1 NCCA, the NHCP, and the NM, shall provide proper technical assistance to 2 school heads to ensure that the original architectural design of the school 3 building is maintained: Provided, however, That, subject to the issuance of a 4 permit from the NCCA, any modification or alteration of the original 5 architectural design of Gabaldon school buildings may be allowed in public 6 elementary and secondary schools where the exigency of constructing new 7 school buildings is a priority in anticipation of the increase in student 8 population by virtue of the implementation of Republic Act No. 10533, or 9 the "Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013": Provided, further, That the 10 facade and other distinct features of the original Gabaldon school buildings 11 shall, as much as possible, be preserved. 12

SEC. 5. Penalties. - Any person who shall abet or cause the 13 unauthorized modification, alteration, destruction, demolition, or relocation 14 of the Gabaldon school building shall be subject to a fine of not less than 15 two hundred thousand pesos (P200,000.00) or imprisonment for a term of 16 not less than ten (10) years, or both, upon the discretion of the court, and 17 shall likewise pay for the conservation of the structure: Provided, That if 18 the violation is committed by a juridical person, its license to operate shall 19 be revoked, and its president, manager, representative, director, agent, or 20 employee shall also be liable for the penalties prescribed herein: Provided, 21 further, That if the offender is an alien, the offender shall be placed under 22 the custody of the Bureau of Immigration for appropriate proceedings and 23 shall be summarily deported after serving the applicable sentence. 24

25 School heads who fail to submit a report to their respective Schools 26 Division Superintendents on the existence of or any structural damage to any 27 Gabaldon school building in schools under their respective supervision, shall 28 be held administratively liable for simple neglect of duty and shall be 29 suspended without pay for a period of six (6) months.

1 SEC. 6. *Appropriations*. – The Secretary of Education shall 2 immediately include in the Department's program the implementation of this 3 Act, the initial funding of which shall be charged to the current year's 4 appropriation of the DepED. Thereafter, the amount necessary for the 5 continued implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual General 6 Appropriations Act.

7 SEC. 7. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – Within ninety (90) 8 days from the approval of this Act, the DepED, in consultation with the 9 NCCA, the NHCP, and the NM, shall formulate the rules and regulations 10 implementing the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 8. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act is held
 invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not so declared shall remain in
 force and effect.

SEC. 9. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders and rules, and
 regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are
 hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

SEC. 10. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general
circulation.
