BY REPRESENTATIVES ARENAS, BERTIZ, ERMITA-BUHAIN AND ALVAREZ (F.), PER COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 228

AN ACT EXTENDING FOR ANOTHER TWENTY-FIVE (25) YEARS THE FRANCHISE GRANTED TO BRIGHT STAR BROADCASTING NETWORK CORPORATION UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7295, ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING THE BRIGHT STAR BROADCASTING NETWORK CORPORATION A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, INSTALL, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES RADIO AND TELEVISION BROADCASTING STATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

## Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Nature and Scope of Franchise. - Subject to the 2 provisions of the Constitution and applicable laws, rules and regulations, the 3 franchise granted to Bright Star Broadcasting Network Corporation, hereunder 4 referred to as the grantee, its successors or assignees, under Republic Act 5 No. 7295, to construct, install, establish, operate, and maintain for commercial 6 purposes and in the public interest, radio and/or television broadcasting 7 stations, including digital television system, through microwave, satellite or 8 whatever means, as well as the use of any new technology in television and 9 radio systems, with the corresponding technological auxiliaries and facilities, special broadcast and other program and distribution services and relay 10

stations in the Philippines, is hereby extended for another twenty-five (25)
 years from the effectivity of this Act.

3 SEC. 2. Manner of Operation of Stations or Facilities. - The stations or facilities of the grantee shall be constructed and operated in a manner as 4 will, at most, result only in the minimum interference on the wavelengths or 5 frequencies of existing stations or other stations which may be established by 6 law, without in any way diminishing its own privilege to use its assigned 7 wavelengths or frequencies and the quality of transmission or reception 8 9 thereon as should maximize rendition of the grantee's services and/or the 10 availability thereof.

11 SEC. 3. Prior Approval of the National Telecommunications Commission. - The grantee shall secure from the National 12 Telecommunications Commission (NTC) the appropriate permits and licenses 13 for the construction and operation of its stations or facilities and shall not use 14 any frequency in the radio/television spectrum without authorization from the 15 NTC. The NTC, however, shall not unreasonably withhold or delay the grant 16 17 of any such authority.

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The grantee shall not dispose or lease its facilities except to entities with radio or television broadcasting franchise: *Provided*, That the grantee shall inform and secure written authorization to proceed from the NTC, and report the transaction to the NTC within sixty (60) days after its completion: *Provided, further*, That the NTC shall determine the corresponding sanction for any violation of this provision.

SEC. 4. *Responsibility to the Public.* – The grantee shall provide adequate public service time to enable the government, through the said broadcasting stations or facilities, to inform the population on important public issues; provide at all times sound and balanced programming; assist in the performance of the functions of public information and education; conform to the ethics of honest enterprise; and not use its stations or facilities for the broadcasting of obscene and indecent language, speech, act or scene; or for the
 dissemination of deliberately false information or willful misrepresentation, to
 the detriment of the public interest; or to incite, encourage, or assist in
 subversive or treasonable acts.

5 SEC. 5. Right of the Government. – The radio spectrum is a finite 6 resource that is part of the national patrimony and the use thereof is a privilege 7 conferred upon the grantee by the State and may be withdrawn any time after 8 due process.

9 A special right is hereby reserved to the President of the Philippines, in 10 times of war, rebellion, public peril, calamity, emergency, disaster, or 11 disturbance of peace and order: to temporarily take over and operate the 12 stations or facilities of the grantee; to temporarily suspend the operation of any 13 station or facility in the interest of public safety, security and public welfare; 14 or to authorize the temporary use and operation thereof by any agency of the 15 government, upon due compensation to the grantee, for the use of said stations 16 or facilities during the period when these shall be so operated.

SEC. 6. Term of Franchise. - This franchise shall be in effect for a
period of twenty-five (25) years from the effectivity of this Act, unless sooner
revoked or cancelled. This franchise shall be deemed *ipso facto* revoked in the
event the grantee fails to operate continuously for two (2) years.

SEC. 7. Acceptance of Franchise. – Acceptance of the terms of this franchise shall be given in writing to the Congress of the Philippines, through the Committee on Legislative Franchises of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Public Services of the Philippine Senate, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act. Upon giving such acceptance, the grantee shall exercise the privileges granted under this Act. Nonacceptance shall render the franchise void.

SEC. 8. Self-regulation by and Undertaking of the Grantee. - The
 grantee shall not require any previous censorship of any speech, play, act or

1 scene, or other matter to be broadcast from its stations: Provided. That the 2 grantee, during any broadcast, shall cut off from the air the speech, play, act or 3 scene, or other matter being broadcast if the tendency thereof is to propose and/or incite treason, rebellion or sedition; or the language used therein or the 4 theme thereof is indecent or immoral: Provided, further. That willful failure to 5 do so shall constitute a valid cause for the cancellation of this franchise. 6

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SEC. 9. Warranty in Favor of the National and Local Governments. -The grantee shall hold the national, provincial, city, and municipal governments of the Philippines free from all claims, liabilities, demands, or actions arising out of accidents causing injury to persons or damage to properties, during the construction or operation of the stations of the grantee.

12 SEC. 10. Sale, Lease, Transfer, Usufruct, or Assignment of Franchise. 13 - The grantee shall not sell, lease, transfer, grant the usufruct of, nor assign 14 this franchise or the rights and privileges acquired thereunder to any person, 15 firm, company, corporation, or other commercial or legal entity, nor merge with any other corporation or entity, nor the controlling interest of the grantee 16 be transferred, whether as a whole or in parts, and whether simultaneously or 17 18 contemporaneously, to any such person, firm, company, corporation, or entity without the prior approval of the Congress of the Philippines: Provided, That 19 20 Congress shall be informed of any sale, lease, transfer, grant of usufruct, or assignment of franchise or the rights and privileges acquired thereunder, or of 21 the merger or transfer of the controlling interest of the grantee, within sixty 22 (60) days after the completion of the said transaction: Provided, further, That 23 failure to report to Congress such change of ownership shall render the 24 franchise ipso facto revoked: Provided, finally, That any person or entity to 25 which this franchise is sold, transferred or assigned, shall be subject to the 26 27 same conditions, terms, restrictions, and limitations of this Act.

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SEC. 11. Dispersal of Ownership. \_ In accordance with the constitutional provision to encourage public participation in public utilities, the 29

grantee shall offer to Filipino citizens at least thirty percent (30%) or a higher 1 percentage that may hereafter be provided by law of its outstanding capital 2 stock in any securities exchange in the Philippines within five (5) years from 3 the commencement of its operations: Provided, That in cases where public 4 offer of shares is not applicable, establishment of cooperatives and other 5 methods of encouraging public participation by citizens and corporations 6 operating public utilities such as stock sharing with employees' organization 7 8 must be implemented.

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Noncompliance therewith shall render the franchise ipso facto revoked.

SEC. 12. Reportorial Requirement. - The grantee shall submit an 10 annual report to the Congress of the Philippines, through the Committee on 11 Legislative Franchises of the House of Representatives and the Committee on 12 13 Public Services of the Philippine Senate, on its compliance with the terms and conditions of the franchise and on its operations on or before April 30 of every 14 year during the term of its franchise. The reportorial compliance certificate 15 issued by Congress shall be required before any application for permit or 16 certificate is accepted by the NTC. 17

18 SEC. 13. *Fine.* – Failure of the grantee to submit the requisite annual 19 report to Congress shall be penalized by a fine in the amount of five hundred 20 pesos (P500.00) per working day of noncompliance. The fine shall be 21 collected separately by the NTC distinct from the penalties it imposes for 22 noncompliance of its own reportorial requirements.

23 SEC. 14. *Equality Clause*. – Except for taxes and customs duties, any 24 advantage, favor, privilege, exemption, or immunity granted under existing 25 franchises, or which may hereafter be granted for radio and/or television 26 broadcasting, upon prior review and approval of Congress, shall become part 27 of this franchise and shall be accorded immediately and unconditionally to the 28 herein grantee: *Provided*, That the foregoing shall neither apply to nor affect provisions of broadcasting franchises concerning territorial coverage, the term,
 or the type of service authorized by the franchise.

3 SEC. 15. *Repealability and Nonexclusivity Clause.* – This franchise 4 shall be subject to amendment, alteration, or repeal by the Congress of the 5 Philippines when the public interest so requires and shall not be interpreted as 6 an exclusive grant of the privileges herein provided for.

SEC. 16. Separability Clause. - If any of the sections or provisions of
this Act is held invalid, all other provisions not affected thereby shall remain
valid.

SEC. 17. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, orders, resolutions,
 instructions, rules and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof which
 are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended,
 or modified accordingly.

SEC. 18. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general
circulation.
