RESOLUTION
CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING THE FILIPINO MEDALISTS WHOM
COMPETED IN THE 29TH SOUTH EAST ASIAN GAMES THAT WAS HELD FROM
AUGUST 19 TO 30, 2017 AT KUALA LUMPUR, MALAYSIA

WHEREAS, the Philippine Senate has in several occasions paid tribute to exemplary Filipinos for their contribution in bringing home pride and honor to the country by winning in international competitions;

WHEREAS, the 2017 South East Asian Games (SEA GAMES) will be held at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia from August 19 to 30, 2017 and will be the 29th edition of the biennial games¹;

WHEREAS, the Philippines finished 6th in the overall medal count of the 2017 SEA Games with a final count of twenty four (24) gold medals, thirty three (33) silver medals, and sixty four (64) bronze medals for a total of one hundred and twenty one (121) medals²;


