AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8504, OR THE "PHILIPPINE AIDS PREVENTION AND CONTROL ACT OF 1998"

EXPLANATORY NOTE

In the almost twenty years since the enactment of *Republic Act No.* 8504, or the "*Philippine AIDS Prevention and Control Act of 1998*", individuals with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) continue to face stigma and discrimination. This stigma and discrimination compound their affliction and discourage others who may be infected with the disease from submitting themselves to testing and treatment.

In the interest of protecting those already infected by HIV and to encourage those who may be infected to seek proper help, there is a need to ensure that their status as persons with HIV will remain confidential unless that information is needed for proper treatment, or unless they desire to disclose that information publicly. A wide-reaching mandate of confidentiality will also prevent the malicious or irresponsible disclosure of the HIV status of persons that will only fuel prejudice.

For the above-mentioned reasons, passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8504, OR THE "PHILIPPINE AIDS PREVENTION AND CONTROL ACT OF 1998"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Amendment to Confidentiality. - Section 30 of Republic Act No. 8504 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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SEC. 30. [Medical confidentiality] **CONFIDENTIALITY**. – ANY PERSON TO WHOM PERSONS WITH HIV CONDITION [All DISCLOSE THEIR medical instructors, workers, employers, professionals, recruitment agencies, insurance companies, data encoders, and other custodians of any medical record, file, data or test **SHALL** strictly results are directed tol observe confidentiality in the handling of [all medical information, particularly the identity and status of persons with HIV] THAT INFORMATION AND SHALL REFRAIN FROM DISCLOSING THE SAME TO ANY UNAUTHORIZED PERSON OR MAKING **THAT** INFORMATION **OBLIGATION** PUBLIC. THIS TO **OBSERVE** CONFIDENTIALITY SHALL EXTEND TO PERSON WHO SHALL BECOME AWARE OF THE CONDITION OF A PERSON WITH HIV.

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SEC. 2. Amendment to Exceptions to Confidentiality. - Section 31 of Republic Act No. 8504 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 31. Exceptions to the mandate of confidentiality. – [Medical confidentiality] **CONFIDENTIALITY** shall not be considered breached in the following cases:

(a) When complying with reportorial requirements in conjunction with the AIDSWATCH programs provided in Sec. 27 of this Act;

(b) When informing [other] health workers directly involved or about to be involved in the treatment or care of a person with HIV/AIDS: *Provided*, That such treatment or care carry the risk of HIV transmission: *Provided*, *further*, That such workers shall be obliged to maintain the shared [medical] confidentiality;

(c) When responding to a subpoena *duces tecum* and subpoena *ad testificandum* issued by a Court with jurisdiction over a legal proceeding where the main issue is the HIV status of an individual: *Provided*, That the confidential medical record shall be properly sealed by its lawful custodian after being double-checked for accuracy by the head of the office or department, hand delivered, and personally opened by the judge: *Provided, further*, That the judicial proceedings be held in executive session; **AND**

(D) WHEN THE PERSON WITH HIV MAKES A PUBLIC STATEMENT ACKNOWLEDGING HIS OR HER CONDITION WITH THE SPECIFIC INTENT TO MAKE THE INFORMATION PUBLIC.

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SEC. 33. Penalties for violations of confidentiality. – Any violation of [medical] confidentiality [as provided in Sections 30 and 32 of this Act] shall [suffer] **BE METED** the [penalty of imprisonment for six (6) months to four (4) years, without prejudice to administrative sanctions such as fines and suspension or revocation of the violator's license to practice his/her profession, as well as the cancellation or withdrawal of the license to operate any business entity and the accreditation of hospitals, laboratories or clinics.] **FOLLOWING PENALTIES:**

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(A) SIX (6) MONTHS TO TWO (2) YEARS OF IMPRISONMENT FOR ANY PERSON WHO BREACHES CONFIDENTIALITY AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 30 OF THIS ACT;

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(B) TWO (2) YEARS AND ONE (1) DAY TO FIVE (5) YEARS OF IMPRISONMENT FOR ANY PERSON WHO CAUSES THE MASS DISSEMINATION OF THE HIV STATUS OF A PERSON, INCLUDING SPREADING THE INFORMATION ONLINE OR MAKING STATEMENTS TO THE MEDIA, IN VIOLATION OF SECTIONS 30 AND 32 OF THIS ACT; AND

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(C) FIVE (5) YEARS AND ONE (1) DAY TO SEVEN OF IMPRISONMENT (7) YEARS FOR ANY PROFESSIONAL, **MEDICAL** HEALTH INSTRUCTOR. WORKER, EMPLOYER, AGENCY. RECRUITMENT **INSURANCE** COMPANY, DATA ENCODER, AND OTHER CUSTODIAN OF ANY MEDICAL RECORD, OR **TEST** RESULT FILE, DATA,

14	shall already enjoy the expanded right of confidentiality provided under				
15	this Act.				
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17	SEC. 5. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act is				
18	declared invalid, any provision not affected thereby shall remain in force				
19	and effect.				
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21	SEC. 6. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, executive orders				
22	rules and regulations, and issuances inconsistent with the provisions of				
23	this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.				
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25	SEC. 7. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days				
26	after its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of				
27	general circulation.
