RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING THE SENSE OF THE SENATE TO RECOGNIZE AND HONOR THE FILIPINO WOMAN ON THE OCCASION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY AND NATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY ON MARCH 8, FOR FULFILLING HER INDIVIDUAL ROLE IN NATIONBUILDING, AND COLLECTIVELY MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN GENDER EQUALITY, WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT, AND SOCIAL PROGRESS

- WHEREAS, Article II, Section 14 of the Constitution states in part that "[t]he State recognizes the role of women in nation-building";
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Republic Act No. 6949, the eighth day of March of every year is a working special holiday known as National Women's Day;
 - WHEREAS, Proclamation No. 224 s. 1988 provides that the first week of March of every year is celebrated as Women's Week;
- WHEREAS, the same states that March 8 of every year shall be known as Women's Rights and International Peace Day;
- 9 WHEREAS, Proclamation No. 227 s. 1998 also provides for the observance of Women's Role in History every March;
- WHEREAS, March 8 is celebrated as International Women's Day to recognize women "for their achievements without regard to divisions, whether national, ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic or political";

WHEREAS, the theme for this year's month-long celebration in the Philippines is "We Make Change Work For Women";

WHEREAS, the Senate has, in the past, paid tribute to outstanding and exemplary Filipinos;

WHEREAS, on the occasion of the 2018 National Women's Month and International Women's Day, it is opportune to recognize and highlight the accomplishments of outstanding women who have contributed to the fulfillment of women's human rights, gender equality, women's empowerment, and social progress;

WHEREAS, due recognition must be given to the following women, for being prime movers and achievers in their respective fields:

- 1. Her Excellency Rosario G. Manalo, member of United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW);
- 2. United Nations Special Rapporteur on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Victoria Tauli-Corpuz;
- 3. United Nations Special Rapporteur on Internally Displaced Peoples Cecilia Jimenez-Damary;
- 4. United Nations Independent Expert on Human Rights and International Solidarity Virginia Dandan;
- 5. The late Supreme Court Justice Flerida Ruth Romero;
- 6. The late Senator Eva Estrada Kalaw;
- 7. The late Senator Leticia Ramos-Shahani; and
- 8. The late Senator Miriam Defensor-Santiago.

WHEREAS, due recognition must be given, equally, to all our heroic Filipinas who work overseas in different sectors, including domestic services, the healthcare industry, military and police, education, medicine, law, informal economy, religious work, and every woman who devoted her life to look after and care for her family;
