## COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 294

### MR. PRESIDENT:

The Committee on Public Services to which was referred House Bill No. 5635 introduced by Representatives Arenas, Bertiz, Ermita-Buhain and Alvarez (F), entitled:

#### "AN ACT

EXTENDING FOR ANOTHER TWENTY-FIVE (25) YEARS THE FRANCHISE GRANTED TO BRIGHT STAR BROADCASTING NETWORK CORPORATION UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7295, ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING THE BRIGHT STAR BROADCASTING NETWORK CORPORATION A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, INSTALL, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES RADIO AND TELEVISION BROADCASTING STATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

has considered the same and has the honor to report it back to the Senate with the recommendation that the attached H.B. No. 5635 be approved with the following amendments:

1. On page 2, section 4 shall be adopted with amendments and shall now read as follows:

"SEC 4. Responsibility to the Public. – The grantee shall provide, FREE OF CHARGE, adequate public service time WHICH IS REASONABLE AND SUFFICIENT to enable the government through [the said] ITS broadcasting stations or facilities OF THE GRANTEE, to [inform] REACH the PERTINENT populationS OR PORTIONS THEREOF on important public issues AND RELAY IMPORTANT PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS AND WARNINGS CONCERNING PUBLIC EMERGENCIES AND CALAMITIES, AS NECESSITY, URGENCY OR LAW MAY REQUIRE; provide at all times sound and balanced programming; PROMOTE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION; assist in the [performance of the] functions of public information and education; conform to the ethics of honest enterprise; PROMOTE AUDIENCE SENSIBILITY AND EMPOWERMENT INCLUDING CLOSED CAPTIONING; and not use its stations or facilities for the broadcasting of obscene [and] OR indecent language, speech, act, or scene; or for the dissemination of deliberately false information and willful misrepresentation to the detriment of the public interest, or to incite, encourage, or assist in subversive or treasonable acts.

PUBLIC SERVICE TIME REFERRED HEREIN SHALL BE EQUIVALENT TO A MAXIMUM AGGREGATE OF TEN (10%) PERCENT OF PAID COMMERCIALS OR ADVERTISEMENTS WHICH SHALL BE ALLOCATED BASED ON NEED TO THE EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE, JUDICIARY, CONSTITUTIONAL COMMISSIONS AND INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS DULY RECOGNIZED BY STATUTES: PROVIDED, THAT THE NTC SHALL INCREASE THE PUBLIC SERVICE TIME IN CASE OF EXTREME EMERGENCY OR CALAMITY. THE NTC SHALL ISSUE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THIS PURPOSE, THE EFFECTIVITY OF WHICH SHALL COMMENCE UPON APPLICABILITY WITH OTHER SIMILARLY SITUATED BROADCAST NETWORK FRANCHISE HOLDERS.

- 2. On page 4, between lines 11 and 12, insert new section that shall read as follows:
  - "SEC. 10. COMMITMENT TO PROVIDE AND PROMOTE THE CREATION OF EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES. THE GRANTEE SHALL CREATE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES AND SHALL ALLOW ON-THE-JOB TRAININGS IN THEIR FRANCHISE OPERATION. PROVIDED, THAT PRIORITY SHALL BE ACCORDED TO THE RESIDENTS IN AREA WHERE THEIR PRINCIPAL OFFICE IS LOCATED. PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT THE GRANTEE SHALL FOLLOW THE APPLICABLE LABOR STANDARDS AND ALLOWANCE ENTITLEMENT UNDER EXISTING LABOR LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS AND SIMILAR ISSUANCES, PROVIDED FINALLY, THAT THE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES OR JOBS CREATED SHALL BE REFLECTED IN THE GENERAL INFORMATION SHEET (GIS) TO BE SUBMITTED TO SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION ANNUALLY."
  - "SEC. 11. TAX PROVISIONS. THE GRANTEE, ITS SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNEES SHALL CONTINUE TO BE SUBJECT TO ALL APPLICABLE TAXES, DUTIES, FEES, OR CHARGES AND OTHER IPOSITIONS UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8424, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE NATIONAL INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1997", AS AMENDED, AND OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS."; and
- 3. Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

AN ACT EXTENDING FOR ANOTHER TWENTY-FIVE (25) YEARS THE FRANCHISE GRANTED TO BRIGHT STAR BROADCASTING NETWORK CORPORATION UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7295, ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING THE BRIGHT STAR BROADCASTING NETWORK CORPORATION A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, INSTALL, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES RADIO AND TELEVISION BROADCASTING STATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Nature and Scope of Franchise. — Subject to the provisions of the Constitution and applicable laws, rules and regulations, the franchise granted to Bright Star Broadcasting Network Corporation, hereunder referred to as the grantee, its successors or assignees, under Republic Act No. 7295, to construct, install, establish, operate, and maintain for commercial purposes and in the public interest, radio and/or television broadcasting stations, including digital television system, through microwave, satellite or whatever means, as well as the use of any new technology in television and radio systems, with the corresponding technological auxiliaries and facilities, special broadcast and other program and distribution services and relay

stations in the Philippines, is hereby extended for another twenty-five (25) years from the effectivity of this Act.

SEC. 2. Manner of Operation of Stations or Facilities. – The stations or facilities of the grantee shall be constructed and operated in a manner as will, at most, result only in the minimum interference on the wavelengths or frequencies of existing stations or other stations which may be established by law, without in any way diminishing its own privilege to use its assigned wavelengths or frequencies and the quality of transmission or reception thereon as should maximize rendition of the grantee's services and/or the availability thereof.

SEC. 3. Prior Approval of the National Telecommunications Commission. — The grantee shall secure from the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) the appropriate permits and licenses for the construction and operation of its stations or facilities and shall not use any frequency in the radio/television spectrum without authorization from the NTC. The NTC, however, shall not unreasonably withhold or delay the grant of any such authority.

The grantee shall not dispose or lease its facilities except to entities with radio or television broadcasting franchise: *Provided*, That the grantee shall inform and secure written authorization to proceed from the NTC, and report the transaction to the NTC within sixty (60) days after its completion: *Provided*, *further*. That the NTC shall determine the corresponding sanction for any violation of this provision.

SEC. 4. Responsibility to the Public. – The grantee shall provide adequate public service time to enable the government, through the said broadcasting stations or facilities, to inform the population on important public issues; provide at all times sound and balanced programming; assist in the performance of the functions of public information and education; conform to the ethics of honest enterprise; and not use its stations or facilities for the

broadcasting of obscene and indecent language, speech, act or scene; or for the dissemination of deliberately false information or willful misrepresentation, to the detriment of the public interest; or to incite, encourage, or assist in subversive or treasonable acts.

SEC. 5. Right of the Government. — The radio spectrum is a finite resource that is part of the national patrimony and the use thereof is a privilege conferred upon the grantee by the State and may be withdrawn any time after due process.

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A special right is hereby reserved to the President of the Philippines, in times of war, rebellion, public peril, calamity, emergency, disaster, or disturbance of peace and order: to temporarily take over and operate the stations or facilities of the grantee; to temporarily suspend the operation of any station or facility in the interest of public safety, security and public welfare; or to authorize the temporary use and operation thereof by any agency of the government, upon due compensation to the grantee, for the use of said stations or facilities during the period when these shall be so operated.

SEC. 6. Term of Franchise. — This franchise shall be in effect for a period of twenty-five (25) years from the effectivity of this Act, unless sooner revoked or cancelled. This franchise shall be deemed ipso facto revoked in the event the grantee fails to operate continuously for two (2) years.

SEC. 7. Acceptance of Franchise. — Acceptance of the terms of this franchise shall be given in writing to the Congress of the Philippines, through the Committee on Legislative Franchises of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Public Services of the Philippine Senate, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act. Upon giving such acceptance, the grantee shall exercise the privileges granted under this Act. Nonacceptance shall render the franchise void.

SEC. 8. Self-regulation by and Undertaking of the Grantee. - The grantee shall not require any previous censorship of any speech, play, act or

scene, or other matter to be broadcast from its stations: *Provided*, That the grantee, during any broadcast, shall cut off from the air the speech, play, act or scene, or other matter being broadcast if the tendency thereof is to propose and/or incite treason, rebellion or sedition; or the language used therein or the theme thereof is indecent or immoral: *Provided*, *further*. That willful failure to do so shall constitute a valid cause for the cancellation of this franchise.

SEC. 9. Warranty in Favor of the National and Local Governments. —
The grantee shall hold the national, provincial, city, and municipal governments of the Philippines free from all claims, liabilities, demands, or actions arising out of accidents causing injury to persons or damage to properties, during the construction or operation of the stations of the grantee.

SEC. 10. Sale, Lease, Transfer, Usufruct, or Assignment of Franchise. - The grantee shall not sell, lease, transfer, grant the usufruct of, nor assign this franchise or the rights and privileges acquired thereunder to any person, firm, company, corporation, or other commercial or legal entity, nor merge with any other corporation or entity, nor the controlling interest of the grantee be transferred, whether as a whole or in parts, and whether simultaneously or contemporaneously, to any such person, firm, company, corporation, or entity without the prior approval of the Congress of the Philippines: Provided, That Congress shall be informed of any sale, lease, transfer, grant of usufruct, or assignment of franchise or the rights and privileges acquired thereunder, or of the merger or transfer of the controlling interest of the grantee, within sixty (60) days after the completion of the said transaction: Provided, further, That failure to report to Congress such change of ownership shall render the franchise ipso facto revoked: Provided, finally, That any person or entity to which this franchise is sold, transferred or assigned, shall be subject to the same conditions, terms, restrictions, and limitations of this Act.

SEC. 11. Dispersal of Ownership. - In accordance with the constitutional provision to encourage public participation in public utilities, the

grantee shall offer to Filipino citizens at least thirty percent (30%) or a higher percentage that may hereafter be provided by law of its outstanding capital stock in any securities exchange in the Philippines within five (5) years from the commencement of its operations: *Provided*. That in cases where public offer of shares is not applicable, establishment of cooperatives and other methods of encouraging public participation by citizens and corporations operating public utilities such as stock sharing with employees' organization must be implemented.

Noncompliance therewith shall render the franchise ipso facto revoked.

SEC. 12. Reportorial Requirement. — The grantee shall submit an annual report to the Congress of the Philippines, through the Committee on Legislative Franchises of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Public Services of the Philippine Senate, on its compliance with the terms and conditions of the franchise and on its operations on or before April 30 of every year during the term of its franchise. The reportorial compliance certificate issued by Congress shall be required before any application for permit or certificate is accepted by the NTC.

SEC. 13. Fine. – Failure of the grantee to submit the requisite annual report to Congress shall be penalized by a fine in the amount of five hundred pesos (P500.00) per working day of noncompliance. The fine shall be collected separately by the NTC distinct from the penalties it imposes for noncompliance of its own reportorial requirements.

SEC. 14. Equality Clause. - Except for taxes and customs duties, any advantage, favor, privilege, exemption, or immunity granted under existing franchises, or which may hereafter be granted for radio and/or television broadcasting, upon prior review and approval of Congress, shall become part of this franchise and shall be accorded immediately and unconditionally to the herein grantee: *Provided*. That the foregoing shall neither apply to nor affect

I	provisions of broadcasting franchises concerning territorial coverage, the term,
2	or the type of service authorized by the franchise.
3	SEC. 15. Repealability and Nonexclusivity Clause This franchise
4	shall be subject to amendment, alteration, or repeal by the Congress of the
5	Philippines when the public interest so requires and shall not be interpreted as
6	an exclusive grant of the privileges herein provided for.
7	SEC. 16. Separability Clause If any of the sections or provisions of
8	this Act is held invalid, all other provisions not affected thereby shall remain
9	valid.
10	SEC. 17. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, resolutions,
11	instructions, rules and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof which
12	are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended,
13	or modified accordingly.
14	SEC. 18. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
15	after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general
16	circulation.
