AN ACT

STRENGTHENING THE POWERS OF THE NATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION (NTC), AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7925, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS POLICY ACT OF THE PHILIPPINES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. - Section 3 of the Republic Act No. 7925, otherwise known as the "Public Telecommunications Policy Act of the Philippines", is hereby amended to read 2 3 as follows: "SEC.3. Definitions and Interpretations. - For purposes of this Act, the 4 5 following terms shall be used: 6 "XXX 7 "L) SIGNIFICANT MARKET POWER - THE ABILITY OF A 8 PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY TO AFFECT PRICE, 9 SUPPLY OR INNOVATION IN THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS 10 INDUSTRY OR ANY PART THEROF, AS A RESULT OF EITHER ITS 11 CONTROL OVER ESSENTIAL FACILITIES OR THE USE OF ITS 12 POSITION IN ANY MARKET IN THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS 13 INDUSTRY OR ANY MARKET RELATED THERETO. 14 "FURTHER, THE COMMISSION IS MANDATED TO ADOPT 15 STANDARDIZED DEFINITIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL 16

TELECOMMUNICATIONS UNION 1 (ITU), THE INTERNET 2 ENGINEERING TASK FORCE (IETF), THE WORLD WIDE WEB CONSORTIUM (WWWC), AND THE INTERNET CORPORATION 3 FOR ASSIGNED NUMBERS AND NAMES (ICANN) AND OTHER 4 5 INTERNATIONAL AND TRANSNATIONAL **AGENCIES** GOVERNING THE DEVELOPMENT, STANDARDIZATION, AND 6 7 UTILIZATION OF THE INTERNET AND INFORMATION AND 8 COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY, **SUBJECT** TO REFINEMENTS OF THESE INTERNATIONAL STANDARDS AS 9 MAY BE PRESCRIBED BY REGIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS 10 BODIES TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION 11 THE **SPECIAL** CIRCUMSTANCES APPLICABLE ONLY TO THE REGION." 12

Sec. 2. Section of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 5. Responsibilities of the National Telecommunications Commission. – The National Telecommunications Commission (Commission) shall be the principal administrator of this Act and as such shall take the necessary measures to implement the policies and objectives set forth in this Act. Accordingly, in addition to its existing functions, the Commission shall be responsible for the following: "x x x

"c) Mandate a fair and reasonable interconnection of facilities of authorized public ne6twork operators and other providers of telecommunications services through appropriate modalities of interconnection and at a reasonable and fair level charges [,which make provision for the cross subsidy to unprofitable local exchange service areas so as to promote telephone density and provide the most extensive access to basic telecommunications services available at affordable rates to the public];

"f) Protect consumer against misuse of a telecommunications entity's monopoly or quasi-monopolistic powers by, but not limited to, the investigation of complaints and exacting compliance with service standards from such entity; [and]

"g) In the exercise of its regulatory powers, continue to impose such fees and charges as may be necessary to cover reasonable costs and expenses for the regulation and supervision of the operations of telecommunications Entities [.]; AND

"H) IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS REGULATORY POWERS, IMPOSE FINES AGAINST PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITIES WITHIN THE SCOPE OF ITS REGULATION, WHICH ARE FOUND TO HAVE VIOLATED, VIOLATING, OR THOSE WHICH HAVE FAILED OR ARE FAILING TO COMPLY WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS ACT, ANY CERTIFICATE, OR ANY ORDER, DECISION OR REGULATION OF THE COMMISSION.

"THE ERRING PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A FINE AMOUNTING TO THE TOTAL ACTUAL LOSS OR OVERCHARGING AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION FOR EVERY DAY DURING WHICH SUCH DEFAULT OR VIOLATION CONTINUES, OR IF IT IS NOT FEASIBLE TO QUANTIFY THE OFFENSE, TO A FINE AMOUNTING TO ONE MILLION PESOS (P1,000,000.00) FOR EVERY DAY DURING WHICH SUCH DEFAULT OR VIOLATION CONTINUES UNTIL THE AMOUNT IS FULLY PROVIDED, THAT, IF THE PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY HAS A GROSS ANNUAL INCOME NOT EXCEEDING TEN MILLION PESOS (P10,000,000.00), THE PENALTY THAT MAY BE IMPOSED SHALL BE EQUIVALENT TO ONE PERCENT (1%)

TO TWO PERCENT (2%) OF ITS GROSS ANNUAL INCOME. THE COMMISSION IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED TO IMPOSE SUCH FINE, AFTER DUE NOTICE AND HEARING. THE ERRING PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY IS ALSO MANDATED TO REFUND TO CONSUMERS THE CHARGES IT ERRONEOUSLY IMPOSED TO ITS SUBSCRIBERS.

"THE COMMISSION IS FURTHER AUTHORIZED TO IMPOSE A FINE OF ONE MILLION PESOS (1,000,000.00) FOR EVERY DAY THAT A VIOLATION OF SECTIONS 18 AND 19 HEREOF IS COMMITTED, AND UNTIL SUCH TIME THAT THE ERRING PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY FULLY COMPLIES WITH THE TERM S AND CONDITIONS OF THIS ACT, ANY CERTIFICATE, OR ANY ORDER, DECISION, OR REGULATION OF THE COMMISSION: *PROVIDED*, THAT, IF THE PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY HAS A GROSS ANNUAL INCOME NOT EXCEEDING TEN MILLION PESOS (P10,000,000.00), THE PENALTY THAT MAY BE IMPOSED SHALL BE EQUIVALENT TO ONE PERCENT (1%) TO TWO PERCENT (2%) OF ITS GROSS ANNUAL INCOME.

FOUND TO BE IN WILLFUL VIOLATION OF THIS ACT,

THE COMMISSION SHALL UNDERWRITE OR ADVANCE LITIGATION COSTS AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING LEGAL FEES AND OTHER EXPENSES OF EXTERNAL COUNSEL, OR PROVIDE LEGAL ASSISTANCE TO ITS COMMISSIONER, DEPUTY COMMISSIONERS, OFFICERS, AND **EMPLOYEES** IN CONNECTION WITH ANY CIVIL, CRIMINAL, ADMINISTRATIVE OR ANY OTHER ACTION OR PROCEEDING, TO WHICH THEY ARE MADE A PARTY BY REASON OF, OR IN CONNECTION WITH, THE EXERCISE OF AUTHORITY OR PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS UNDER THIS ACT: PROVIDED, THAT SUCH LEGAL PROTECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY CIVIL, ADMINISTRATIVE, OR ANY CRIMINAL, ACTION OR PROCEEDING THAT MAY BE INITIATED BY THE COMMISSION, AGAINST SUCH COMMISSIONER, DEPUTY COMMISSIONERS, OFFICERS, AND EMPLOYEES: PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT THE COMMISSIONER, ITS DEPUTY COMMISSIONERS AND OFFICERS WITH DISCRETION AND SPECIFIC DUTIES TO DECIDE AND ENFORCE THIS ACT WHO SHALL RESIGN, RETIRE, TRANSFER TO ANOTHER AGENCY OR BE SEPARATED FROM THE SERVICE, SHALL CONTINUE TO BE PROVIDED WITH SUCH LEGAL PROTECTION IN CONNECTION WITH ANY ACT DONE OR OMITTED TO BE DONE BY THEM IN GOOD FAITH DURING THEIR TENURE OR EMPLOYMENT WITH THE COMMISSION: PROVIDED, FINALLY, THAT IN THE EVENT OF A SETTLEMENT OR COMPROMISE INDEMNIFICATION SHALL BE PROVIDED ONLY IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH MATTERS COVERED BY THE SETTLEMENT AS TO WHICH THE COMMISSION IS ADVISED BY COUNSEL THAT THE PERSONS
