

## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, INTO GOVERNMENT'S EMERGING STRATEGY FOR RURAL ELECTRIFICATION, AND THE POLICIES AND PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES IN SERVICING FILIPINO COMMUNITIES AND ACHIEVING THE SECTOR'S MANDATE FOR TOTAL RURAL ELECTRIFICATION

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with Presidential Decree No. 269, otherwise known as the "National Electrification Administration Decree," it is the policy of the State to pursue the attainment of total electrification of the country on an area coverage basis for the welfare of the Filipino people and the sound development of the nation. For this purpose, the State shall promote, encourage and assist all public service entitites engaged in supplying electric service, particularly electric cooperatives, which are willing to diligently pursue this objective;

**WHEREAS,** Section 4 of PD 269 authorized the National Electrification Administration (NEA) to promote, encourage and assist public service entities, particularly electric cooperatives, for the purpose of making service available throughout the nation on an area coverage basis as rapidly as possible;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9136, otherwise known as the "Electric Power Industry Reform Act of 2001" or "EPIRA," was enacted into law to provide a framework for the restructuring of the electric power industry, including the privatization of the assets of the National Power Corporation,

the transition to the desired competitive structure, and the definition of the responsibilities of the various government agencies and private entities;

- WHEREAS, Section 57 of EPIRA gives electric cooperatives the option to convert into either stock cooperative under the Cooperatives Development Act or stock corporation under the Corporation Code. It further maintains that nothing in the provisions of EPIRA shall deprive electric cooperatives of any privilege or right granted to them under PD 269, as amended, and other existing laws;
- **WHEREAS,** in accordance with Section 58 of EPIRA, the NEA was given the additional mandate of developing and implementing programs to prepare electric cooperatives to operate and compete under the deregulated electric market, strengthen the technical capability and financial viability of rural electric cooperatives, and review and upgrade regulatory policies with a view to enhancing the viability of rural electric cooperatives as electric utilities;
- **WHEREAS,** in accordance with Section 59 of EPIRA, the provision of electric service may be opened to other qualified third parties in remote and unviable villages where the franchised utility is unable to service for any reason;
- WHEREAS, Section 60 of EPIRA directs the PSALM Corporation to assume all outstanding financial obligations of electric cooperatives to NEA and other government agencies incurred for the purpose of financing the rural electrification program. This shall be done in accordance with the program approved by the President of the Philippines within one (1) year from the law's effectivity, and implemented and completed within three (3) years from the same. The Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) shall ensure a reduction in the rates of electric cooperatives commensurate with the resulting savings due to the removal of the amortization payments of their

- loans. Within five (5) years from the condonation of debt, any electric
- 2 cooperative which shall transfer ownership or control of its assets, franchise
- 3 or operations thereof shall repay PSALM Corporation the total debts including
- 4 accrued interests thereon;

- **WHEREAS**, last March 2018, the President instructed the Department of Energy and the ERC to undertake "bold executive actions" to remove perceived barriers to rural electrification, particularly by allowing the entry of the private sector in the distribution of electricity;
- WHEREAS, several organizations of electric cooperatives issued a joint statement expressing their grave concern regarding the President's directive, fearing that instead of addressing the real challenge of bringing electricity to currently unserved areas, the entry of third-party power providers into the franchise areas of electric cooperatives would simply undermine the electric cooperatives' lawful mandate and the service that they have long been providing to communities;
- WHEREAS, the statement of the Philippine Rural Electric Cooperatives Association, Inc. (PhilRECA) and the Philippine Federation of Electric Cooperatives (PhilFECO) sought to dispute the misconception that underperformance by Electric Cooperatives was the main barrier to total electrication;
- WHEREAS, according to their statement, only eight percent (8%) of the total of 121 electric cooperatives in the country was problematic. Moreover, the problematic performance of these electric cooperatives were not due to operational inefficiency, but rather to external factors beyond the control of the electric cooperatives such as natural calamities, political strife or unwarranted political intervention, insurgency and topographic challenges;

whereas, another organization, the Philippine Association of Board of Directors of Rural Electric Cooperatives (PABREC), called on government to protect electric cooperatives against private entities that may have vested interests in encroaching upon areas already being properly serviced by electric cooperatives;

whereas, while the NEA initiates interventions for unelectrified areas and for under-performing electric cooperatives, effective measures should likewise be in place to ensure the necessary support for the electric cooperatives that have been performing their mandate of providing dependable and adequate service to Filipino communities;

**WHEREAS,** the Department of Energy (DOE) must focus and intensify the determination, exploration and development of energy sources and its generation by interested investors in order to provide sufficient power supply for the electric cooperatives and other private distribution utilities to distribute at reasonable and the most affordable cost possible to all sectors of society;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** as it is hereby resolved to direct the appropriate Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, into government's emerging strategy for rural electrification, and the policies and programs to support electric cooperatives in servicing Filipino communities and achieving the sector's mandate for total rural electrification.
