## AN ACT REAPPORTIONING THE PROVINCE OF ISABELA INTO SIX (6) LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION. 1. In the next national and local elections after 2 the effectivity of this Act, the Province of Isabela is hereby 3 reapportioned into six (6) legislative districts, as follows:

- (a) First Legislative District. The First Legislative District shall be composed of the City of Ilagan and the municipalities of Cabagan, Delfin Albano, Divilacan, Maconacon, Tumauini, San Pablo, Sta. Maria and Sto. Tomas;
- 8 (b) Second Legislative District. The Second Legislative
  9 District shall be composed of the municipalities of Benito
  10 Soliven, Palanan, Naguillan, Reina Mercedes, San Mariano and
  11 San Agustin;

(c) Third Legislative District The Third Legislative
District shall be composed of the municipalities of Alicia, Cabatuan,
San Mateo, Ramon and Angandanan;
(d) Fourth Legislative District The Fourth Legislative
District shall be composed of the City of Santiago and the
municipalities of Cordon, Dinapigue, San Agustin and Jones;
(e) Fifth Legislative District The Fifth Legislative District
shall be composed of the municipalities of Aurora, Burgos, Luna,
Mallig, Quezon, Quirino, Roxas and San Manuel; and
(f) Sixth Legislative District The Sixth Legislative
District shall be composed of the City of Cauayan and the
municipalities of Echague, San Guillermo and San Isidro.
SEC. 2. The incumbent Representatives of the Province of
Isabela shall continue to represent their respective legislative
districts until the new representatives shall have been elected and
qualified.
SEC. 3. The Commission on Elections shall issue the
necessary rules and regulations to implement this Act.
SEC. 4. All laws, rules and regulations which are inconsistent
with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general
