## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE IMPOSITION OF ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT OF NO PENDING CRIMINAL CASES INVOLVING MORAL TURPITUDE ON OFFICERS OF REVENUE GENERATING AGENCIES

WHEREAS, Section 1 of Article XI of the 1987 Constitution emphasizes that public office is imbued with public trust. The Constitution mandates public officers and employees to be, at all times, accountable to the people, and to serve them with utmost responsibility, integrity, loyalty, and efficiency, act with patriotism and justice;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 292, also known as the Revised Administrative Code of the Philippines, mandates the Department of Finance (DOF) to handle and manage the financial resources of the Government, its subdivisions, agencies and instrumentalities. Under this department are the Bureau of Customs (BOC) and the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) which the primary revenue collection agencies in the country;

WHEREAS, under the Section 18 Title II, Book IV of the Revised Administrative Code, the BIR shall be headed by the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, who shall be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Secretary;

WHEREAS, under the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, the BIR Commissioner shall be assisted by four Deputy Commissioners. The Revised Administrative Code provides that the aforementioned undersecretaries shall be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Secretary;

WHEREAS, Section 23 of the Revised Administrative Code provides that the BOC shall be headed by the Commissioner of Customs, who shall be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Secretary;

WHEREAS, under the Tariff and Customs Code of the Philippines, the BOC Commissioner shall be assisted by four Deputy Commissioners, assigned to each of the four operations group under the Bureau of Customs. Under Section 25 of the Revised Administrative Code, the aforementioned Deputy and Assistant Commissioners shall be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of Customs in keeping with the intent of Executive Order No. 9;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the aforementioned agencies shall exercise duly designated police powers for the performance of their functions and duties; assess, collect, and account for all taxes collected; and are given power to prosecute those committed illegal activities under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, imposing the qualification of no pending criminal cases involving moral turpitude on these public offices will remove any doubt and suspicion on the integrity and work ethics of these public officials;

WHEREAS, while acknowledging the freedom and trusting the discretion of the President to appoint these officials, it is necessary to maintain such stringent criteria for the selection of the said officials who will be handling and managing the collection of taxes which are the "lifeblood of the government";

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the proper Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the imposition of additional requirement of no pending criminal cases involving moral turpitude on officers of revenue generating agencies.
