

AN ACT RECTIFYING THE PERIOD TO CONSTITUTE THE SEARCH COMMITTEE FOR THE PRESIDENCY OF THE PALOMPON INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY AND EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR ITS COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION FOR CONVERSION INTO A STATE UNIVERSITY, THEREBY AMENDING SECTIONS 9 AND 25 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10599

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 9 of Republic Act No. 10599, entitled "An Act Converting the Palompon Institute of Technology in the Municipality of Palompon, Province of Leyte Into a State University

4 to be Known as the Palompon Polytechnic State University,

5 Integrating Therewith the Marcelino R. Veloso National Polytechnic

6 College in the Municipality of Tabango, Province of Leyte and

Appropriating Funds Therefor", shall be amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 9. The University President. - The

University shall be headed by a President, who

shall render full-time service and who shall be appointed by the Board, subject to the guidelines, qualifications and standards set by the Board, upon duly constituted search recommendation of a committee. The University President shall have a term of four (4) years and shall be eligible for reappointment for another term: Provided, That in order to effect a smooth transition to a state university, the incumbent President of the Palompon Institute of Technology, if qualified, shall serve as the interim President of the [PPSU] UNIVERSITY. However, within three (3) months from the effectivity of this Act, a new President shall be appointed by the Board.

"Within [six (6)] TWO (2) months before the expiration of the term of office of the interim President of the University, the Board shall constitute the Search Committee for the Presidency (SCP).

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SEC. 2. Section 25 of Republic Act No. 10599 shall be amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 25. Compliance With CHED Requirements.

The provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the [establishment or] conversion of the institution into a state university shall become effective only upon the determination and declaration by the CHED, based on the recommendation of a panel of experts, that the institution has complied with the requirements for [a]

8	SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
9	publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general
10	circulation.
