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

#### AN ACT

REPLACING THE QUANTITATIVE IMPORT RESTRICTIONS ON RICE WITH TARIFFS, LIFTING THE QUANTITATIVE EXPORT RESTRICTIONS ON RICE, AND CREATING THE RICE COMPETITIVENESS ENHANCEMENT FUND, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8178, AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9496, AND AS FURTHER AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10848, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 8178, as amended, otherwise known
 as "An Act Replacing Quantitative Import Restrictions on Agricultural Products, Except
 Rice, With Tariffs, Creating the Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund, and For
 Other Purposes," is hereby amended, to read as follows:

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"SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy – It is the policy of the State to **ENSURE FOOD SECURITY AND TO** make the country's agricultural sector viable, efficient and globally competitive. The State adopts the use of tariffs in lieu of non-tariff import restrictions to protect local producers of agricultural products **[**, except in the case of rice, which will continue to have quantitative import restrictions]. XXX"

- SEC. 2. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 8178, as amended, is hereby amended to
   read as follows:
  - "SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. The following definitions apply to the terms used in this Act:

(a) "Agricultural products" shall have the same meaning as agricultural products under Chapters 1-24 of [Presidential Decree No. 1464, otherwise known as the Tariff and Customs Code of the Philippines, as amended] SECTION 1611 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10863, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE CUSTOMS MODERNIZATION AND TARIFF ACT (CMTA).

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# (c) "ATIGA RATE" REFERS TO TARIFF RATE COMMITMENTS UNDER THE ASEAN TRADE IN GOODS AGREEMENT (ATIGA) APPLICABLE TO IMPORTATIONS ORIGINATING FROM ASEAN MEMBER STATES.

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(d) "Bound rate" refers to THE AGREED maximum [limits on] tariffs on
 products committed by the Philippines to the World Trade Organization
 (WTO) under the Uruguay Round Final Act, AND UNDER THE ATIGA, IN
 ACCORDANCE WITH ITS TARIFF SCHEDULE (ANNEX 2; TARIFFS
 UNDER THE ASEAN TRADE IN GOODS AGREEMENT (ATIGA)
 PHILIPPINES).

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"BUFFER STOCK" REFERS TO THE NATIONAL FOOD 26 (e) AUTHORITY'S (NFA) RICE INVENTORY AS RESERVED, EQUIVALENT 27 TO A VOLUME DETERMINED BASED ON THE COMPUTED NATIONAL 28 CONSUMPTION REQUIREMENT BY AN INTER-AGENCY COMMITTEE 29 TO BE CONSTITUTED BY THE NFA COUNCIL. 30 THIS RESERVE REQUIREMENT SHALL BE MAINTAINED AT ANY GIVEN TIME TO 31 ADDRESS CALAMITIES AND EMERGENCY SITUATIONS, AND FOR 32 PRICE STABILIZATION DURING THE TRADITIONAL LEAN MONTHS; 33 34

(f) "In-Quota Tariff Rate" refers to the tariff rates for minimum access volumes committed by the Philippines to the World Trade Organization (WTO) under the Uruguay Round Final Act.

# (g) "OUT-QUOTA TARIFF RATE" REFERS TO THE HIGHER RATE OF CUSTOMS DUTY THAT IS LEVIED ON THE QUANTITIES OF AN IMPORTED AGRICULTURAL PRODUCT IN EXCESS OF THE MINIMUM ACCESS VOLUME (MAV) OF THAT PARTICULAR PRODUCT.

(h) "Minimum Access Volume" refers to the volume of a specific agricultural
 product that is allowed to be imported with a lower tariff as committed by the
 Philippines to the World Trade Organization (WTO) under the Uruguay Round
 Final Act.

(i) "MOST FAVOURED NATION (MFN) RATE" REFERS TO PHILIPPINE
 TARIFF RATES THAT ARE APPLICABLE TO IMPORTS FROM ALL
 SOURCES AS PRESCRIBED IN THE CUSTOMS MODERNIZATION AND
 TARIFF ACT (CMTA).

20 **(j)** "Quantitative Import Restrictions" refers to non-tariff restrictions used to 21 limit the amount of imported commodities, including but not limited to 22 discretionary import licensing and import quotas, whether qualified or 23 absolute.

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(k) "RICE" REFERS TO ALL PRODUCTS CLASSIFIED UNDER THE HARMONIZED COMMODITY DESCRIPTION AND CODING SYSTEM (HS) HEADING 10.06.

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(I) "RICE SHORTAGE" IS A SITUATION WHERE THE QUANTITY
 AVAILABLE OR SUPPLIED OF THE COMMODITY IN A MARKET FALLS
 SHORT OF THE QUANTITY DEMANDED OR REQUIRED AT A GIVEN
 TIME.

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(m) "Tariff" refers to a tax levied on a commodity imported from another
 country. It earns revenues for the government and regarded as instruments
 to promote local industries by taxing their competitors. The benefit is

accorded to the local producers by the maintenance of a domestic price at a level equal to the world price plus the tariff.

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## (n) "TARIFF EQUIVALENT" REFERS TO THE RATE OF TARIFF THAT ALLOWS THE SAME PROTECTION GIVEN BY EXISTING QUANTITATIVE IMPORT RESTRICTIONS, REFLECTED BY THE AVERAGE PRICE GAP BETWEEN DOMESTIC PRICES AND WORLD PRICES; AND

- (o) "Tariffication" refers to the lifting of all existing quantitative restrictions
   such as import quotas or prohibitions, imposed on agricultural products, and
   replacing these restrictions with tariffs.
- SEC. 3. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 8178, as amended, is hereby amended, to read as follows:
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"SEC. 4. *Repeal*. The following laws and all other laws or provisions of law prescribing quantitative import restrictions or granting government agencies the power to impose such restrictions on agricultural products  $F_7$ except rice,] are hereby repealed:

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SEC. 4. *REPEAL OF SECTION 5.* - SECTION 5 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8178 IS HEREBY REPEALED. HENCE, THE NFA SHALL NO LONGER ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE IMPORTATION OF RICE AND ISSUE IMPORT LICENSES OR PERMITS FOR THE PRIVATE SECTOR. LIKEWISE, THE POWER OF THE NFA TO FIRST CERTIFY THE EXISTENCE OF A SHORTAGE BEFORE IMPORTATION IS ALLOWED IS HEREBY REMOVED.

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SEC. 5. A new section 5 is hereby inserted, to read as follows:

Section 6 of Republic Act No. 8178, as amended, is hereby amended, to 4 read as follows: 5 6 "SEC. 6. Tariffication. - In lieu of quantitative IMPORT restrictions, 7 the maximum bound rates committed under the Uruguay Round Final Act 8 shall be imposed on the agricultural products whose quantitative IMPORT 9 restrictions are repealed by this Act, AS AMENDED. XXX." 10 11 XXX" 12 13 FOR THE TARIFF EQUIVALENT OF THE QUANTITATIVE IMPORT 14 RESTRICTION ON RICE, THE BOUND RATE SHALL BE AS NOTIFIED BY THE 15 PHILIPPINES TO THE WTO AS FOLLOWS: 16 17 18 A. FOR THE MINIMUM ACCESS VOLUME COMMITTED BY THE 19 PHILIPPINES TO WTO, THE INDICATED RATES IN THE 20 APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE WTO AGREEMENT ON AGRICULTURE, SHALL APPLY; 21 22 B. FOR ASEAN MEMBER STATES THIRTY-FIVE PERCENT 23 (35%) OR THE IMPORT DUTY RATE COMMITMENT OF THE 24 PHILIPPINES FOR RICE IMPORTATION ORIGINATING 25 FROM THIS COUNTRIES, PURSUANT TO THE ASEAN TRADE 26 IN GOODS AGREEMENT (ATIGA); AND 27 28 C. FOR NON-ASEAN MEMBER STATES, FIFTY PERCENT (50%) 29 30 OR THE TARIFF EQUIVALENT CALCULATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 10 OF ANNEX 5, 31 SECTION B, OF THE WTO AGREEMENT ON AGRICULTURE 32 UPON THE EXPIRATION OF THE WAIVER RELATING TO THE 33 SPECIAL TREATMENT FOR RICE OF THE PHILIPPINES, 34 35 WHICHEVER IS HIGHER. 36

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THE CALCULATED TARIFF EQUIVALENT SHALL BE DETERMINED BY 1 THE NEDA BOARD WITHIN 45 DAYS UPON THE EFFECTIVITY OF THIS ACT. 2 3 SEC. 7. A new Section 7 is hereby inserted, to read as follows: 4 5 "SEC. 7. POWERS OF THE PRESIDENT. - THE PRESIDENT MAY 6 **EXERCISE HIS POWERS, AS WARRANTED UNDER CHAPTER 2 TITLE** 7 XVI OF THE CMTA, EVEN WHEN CONGRESS IS IN SESSION, IN THE 8 FOLLOWING CASES: 9 10 A. IN CASE OF IMPENDING RICE SHORTAGES AS DETERMINED BY 11 AN INTER-AGENCY TECHNICAL COMMITTEE AND CONFIRMED 12 BY THE NFA COUNCIL WHEN A LOWER APPLIED TARIFF RATE ON 13 A SPECIFIED VOLUME OF IMPORTATION OF RICE FOR A LIMITED 14 PERIOD OF TIME IS NECESSARY; AND 15 16 B. IN CASE THE TARIFF EQUIVALENT REFERRED TO UNDER 17 SECTION 6C EXCEEDS 100% IN WHICH CASE SECTION 1608 18 (A.1) OF THE CMTA SHALL ALSO NOT APPLY. 19 20 ANY ORDER ISSUED BY THE PRESIDENT ADJUSTING THE 21 TARIFF RATES AND/OR THE SPECIFIED VOLUME SHALL TAKE 22 23 **EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.**" 24 SEC. 8. A new Section 8 is hereby inserted, to read as follows: 25 26 "SEC. 8. DIRECT IMPORTATION BY THE NATIONAL FOOD 27 AUTHORITY (NFA), - THE NFA SHALL ONLY UNDERTAKE DIRECT 28 IMPORTATION OF RICE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES AND 29 PROCEDURES TO BE DETERMINED BY THE NFA COUNCIL, ONLY WHEN 30 LOCAL PRODUCTION IS NOT SUFFICIENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF 31 MAINTAINING THE REQUIRED BUFFER STOCK TO ENSURE RICE 32 SECURITY. 33 34 SEC. 9. A new Section 9 is hereby inserted, to read as follows: 35

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"SEC. 9. LIFTING OF THE RICE EXPORT RESTRICTION. EXPORTATION OF RICE BY CERTIFIED AND LICENSED EXPORTERS SHALL
 BE ALLOWED BASED ON RULES AND REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES
 FORMULATED BY THE NFA AND APPROVED AND CLEARED BY THE NFA
 COUNCIL. THE NFA SHALL DETERMINE FEES AND CHARGES OF RICE
 EXPORTS WHICH SHALL LIKEWISE BE APPROVED BY THE NFA COUNCIL
 AND SHALL COLLECT TAXES AND CHARGES FROM SUCH EXPORTS.

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SEC. 10. A new Section 10 is hereby inserted, to read as follows:

"SEC. 10. SPECIAL RICE SAFEGUARD. - IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE
 PHILIPPINE RICE INDUSTRY FROM SUDDEN OR EXTREME PRICE
 FLUCTUATIONS, A SPECIAL SAFEGUARD DUTY ON RICE SHALL BE
 IMPOSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH RA 8800, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE
 SAFEGUARD MEASURES ACT AND IT'S IMPLEMENTING RULES AND
 REGULATIONS.

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SEC. 11. Section 7 of Republic Act No. 8178, as amended, is hereby
 renumbered to become Section 11.

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SEC. 12. Section 8 of Republic Act No. 8178, as amended by RA 10848, is hereby renumbered to become Section 12 and is further hereby amended, to read as follows:

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"SEC. 12. Agricultural Competitiveness Enhancement Fund. - To implement 25 the policy enunciated in this Act, there is hereby created the Agricultural 26 Competitiveness Enhancement Fund, herein referred to as the Fund. The Fund shall 27 consist of all duties collected from the importation of agricultural products, EXCEPT 28 RICE, under the MAV mechanism, including unused balances and collections from 29 repayments from loan beneficiaries including interests, if any. The FUND shall be 30 automatically credited to the Special Account 183 in the General Fund of the National 31 Treasury; provided, that fund release shall not be subject to any ceiling by the 32 33 Department of Budget and Management (DBM). 34

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SEC. 13. A new Section 13 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

"SEC. 13. RICE COMPETITIVENESS ENHANCEMENT FUND. - THERE IS 3 HEREBY CREATED A RICE COMPETITIVENESS ENHANCEMENT FUND, HEREIN 4 REFERRED TO AS THE 'RICE FUND.' THE RICE FUND SHALL CONSIST OF 5 INITIAL APPROPRIATION OF TEN BILLION PESOS (P10,000,000,000.00) AND 6 ALL DUTIES COLLECTED FROM THE IMPORTATION OF RICE UNDER THIS ACT 7 AND SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY CREDITED TO A SPECIAL ACCOUNT IN THE 8 GENERAL FUND OF THE NATIONAL TREASURY WHICH SHALL BE IN PLACE 9 WITHIN NINETY (90) DAYS UPON THE EFFECTIVITY OF THIS ACT. 10

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FUNDING FOR THE SUCCEEDING YEARS SHALL COME FROM THE 12 TARIFF REVENUES FOR RICE IMPORTATION, UNTIL SUCH TIME THAT 13 THERE IS ENOUGH COLLECTION FROM TARIFF IN THE FUND, AND THE 14 RICE PRODUCTION COMPETITIVENESS IN THE PHILIPPINES SHALL HAVE 15 BEEN ACHIEVED, A YEARLY APPROPRIATION OF TEN BILLION (PHP 16 10,000,000,000.00) PESOS SHALL BE PROVIDED FOR IN THE GENERAL 17 APPROPRIATIONS ACT (GAA) AND SHALL BE CONTINUOUSLY USED FOR 18 THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH IT WAS EARMARKED AND SET ASIDE. 19

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THE AMOUNT COLLECTED/ALLOCATED SHALL BE RELEASED
 DIRECTLY TO THE IMPLEMENTING AGENCY AS PROVIDED FOR IN THIS
 LAW.

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THE FUND RELEASES SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO ANY CEILING BY
 THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT.

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ANY PROGRAM UNDERTAKEN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ACT SHALL ONLY BE DEEMED COMPLEMENTARY TO AND SHALL NOT BE A REPLACEMENT FOR ALL AND EXISTING PROGRAMS FOR RICE AND RICE FARMERS ALREADY IMPLEMENTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

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34 SUBJECT TO THE USUAL ACCOUNTING AND AUDITING RULES AND 35 REGULATIONS, THE RICE FUND SHALL BE ALLOCATED AND DISBURSED TO 36 RICE PRODUCING AREAS, AS FOLLOWS:

A. FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE RICE FUND SHALL BE UTILIZED AS GRANT IN KIND TO ELIGIBLE FARMERS ASSOCIATIONS, AND REGISTERED RICE COOPERATIVES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS, IN THE FORM OF RICE FARM EQUIPMENTS, SUCH AS TILLERS, TRACTORS, SEEDERS, THRESHERS, RICE PLANTERS, HARVESTERS, IRRIGATION PUMPS, SMALL SOLAR IRRIGATION, REAPERS, DRIERS, MILLERS, AND THE LIKE, FOR PURPOSES OF IMPROVING FARM MECHANIZATION, TO BE IMPLEMENTED BY PHILMECH;
