AN ACT

STRENGTHENING THE COMMISSION ON ELECTIONS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE PERTINENT PROVISIONS OF **BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 881, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE** "OMNIBUS ELECTION CODE", AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

A report in 2013 revealed that "in 39 COMELEC field offices in Luzon and the Visayas, COMELEC field personnel suffer from poor working conditions and a shortage in basic resources - personnel, funds, office space, supplies and equipment - that prevent them from fully performing their duties in an effective and efficient manner."1 These woes suffered by the COMELEC affect the discharge of their duties to the public, who may in turn be – in effect – disenfranchised.

As a body created by no less than the Constitution, whose scant number of personnel are housed in dilapidated offices, COMELEC's independence weakened when Section 55 of the Omnibus Election Code (B.P. Blg. 881) came into effect. Under the said Section, the provision of COMELEC offices was lodged with the Local Government Units. The danger of making the efficiency and working conditions of the personnel of a body that breathes life into the Constitutional provision "sovereignty resides in the people and all government authority emanates from them",² dependent on certain people - who may and will use such power to their own advantage - cannot be denied. Its effects on the integrity of the conduct of elections

are so far-reaching that efforts to quash such danger must be made, and made not a minute too late.

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The importance of the conduct of elections cannot be overemphasized: "the means by which the people choose their officials for a definite and fixed period and to whom they entrust for the time being the exercise of the powers of government."³ For this reason, it is obligatory upon the State to ensure that utmost protection from evils that corrupt the conduct thereof will be provided - protection that run at the very roots of the exercise of the right to suffrage of the Filipino people.

To guarantee the sanctity of the votes of the people, it is necessary to begin the process at the grassroots – in strengthening COMELEC, the constitutional body whose principal role is to enforce all laws and regulations relative to the conduct of elections in the Philippines. In empowering the COMELEC, this Act will eradicate the danger of a constitutional commission - tasked with safeguarding the ballots of the people - being beholden to forces that tend to unduly influence, pressure and intimidate it.

This Act will give back the independence and strength to the COMELEC, the twin hallmarks of its integrity. And in giving the COMELEC the power to procure its own offices and enlist the personnel that it needs, the State effectively safeguards and holds sacred the ballots of the people, in whom all government powers reside.

This is the counterpart bill of HBN 7701 filed by Cong. Sherwin Tugna.

STRENGTHENING THE COMMISSION ON ELECTIONS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE PERTINENT PROVISIONS OF BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 881, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "OMNIBUS ELECTION CODE", AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

| 1 | Section. 1. Statement of Policy The State hereby affirms and recognizes the |
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| 2 | independence of the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) as guaranteed under |
| 3 | Article IX, Part A, Section 1 of the 1987 Constitution. As such, the State shall ensure |
| 4 | and preserve the integrity and independence of the COMELEC by providing suitable |
| 5 | office space for its field offices with sufficient manpower complement. |
| 6 | Sec. 2. Increase of the Number of Personnel. – Section 53, Article VII, of Batas |
| 7 | Pambansa Blg. 881, otherwise known as the "Omnibus Election Code of the |
| 8 | Philippines", as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows: |
| 9 | "Section 53. Field offices of the Commission The |
| 10 | Commission shall have the following field offices; |
| 11 | (1) Regional Election Office, headed by the Regional |
| 12 | Election Director and assisted by the Assistant |
| 13 | Regional Director and such other subordinate officers |
| 14 | or employees as the Commission may appoint. |
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(2) [Provincial Election Office, headed by the Provincial Election Supervisor and assisted by such other subordinate officers or employees as the Commission may appoint.] PROVINCIAL ELECTION OFFICE. HEADED THE BY PROVINCIAL ELECTION SUPERVISOR FOR EACH PROVINCE. EACH PROVINCIAL ELECTION SUPERVISOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY AT LEAST ONE (1) ELECTION ASSISTANT AND SUCH NUMBER OF ASSISTANTS AND SUBORDINATE OFFICERS OR EMPLOYEES AS THE COMMISSION MAY APPOINT, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT THE PROVINCIAL ELECTION SUPERVISOR SHALL HAVE THE SOLE AUTHORITY TO ENGAGE CONTRACTUAL PERSONNEL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS TO PERFORM ADMINISTRATIVE OR CLERICAL WORKS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANDATE OF HIS/HER OFFICE.

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20 (3) [City/Municipal Election Office, headed by the 21 City/Municipal Registrar who shall be assisted by an 22 election clerk and such other employees as the Commission may appoint.] 23 CITY/MUNICIPAL ELECTION OFFICE, HEADED BY AN ELECTION 24 OFFICER FOR EACH CITY, MUNICIPALITY, OR 25 ELECTORAL DISTRICT. 26 EACH ELECTION OFFICER SHALL BE ASSISTED BY AT LEAST 27 ONE (1) ELECTION ASSISTANT AND SUCH 28 NUMBER OF ASSISTANTS AND SUBORDINATE 29 OFFICERS OR 30 EMPLOYEES AS THE COMMISSION 31 MAY APPOINT, PROVIDED. HOWEVER, THAT THE ELECTION OFFICER 32 SHALL HAVE THE SOLE AUTHORITY TO 33

ENGAGE CONTRACTUAL PERSONNEL IN 1 ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANDATE OF HIS/HER 2 OFFICE. 3 The Commission may delegate its powers and 4 functions, or order the implementation or enforcement 5 of its orders, rulings or decisions thought the heads of 6 its field offices." 7 Sec. 3. Automatic Creation of Positions. – A new section, Section 53-A, is 8 hereby inserted in Article VII of Batas Pambansa Blg. 881, otherwise known as the 9 "Omnibus Election Code of the Philippines", as amended, to read as follows: 10 "Section 53-A. AUTOMATIC CREATION OF 11 OF ELECTION POSITIONS OFFICERS. 12 WHENEVER NEW CITIES, MUNICIPALITIES AND 13 ELECTORAL DISTRICTS ARE CREATED. THERE 14 SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY CREATED FOR THE 15 CITY OR MUNICIPALITY, POSITIONS OF 16 ELECTION OFFICERS AND ELECTION 17 ASSISTANTS IN SUCH NUMBER AS DETERMINED 18 PURSUANT TO THE RATIO ESTABLISHED IN THE 19 SUCCEEDING SECTION." 20 Sec. 4. Ratio of Election Assistants to Registered Voters. – A new section, 21 Section 53-B, is hereby inserted in Article VII of Batas Pambansa Blg. 881, otherwise 22 known as the Omnibus Election Code of the Philippines", as amended, to read as 23 follows: 24 "Section 53-B. RATIO OF ELECTION ASSISTANTS 25

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26TO REGISTERED VOTERS. - THERE SHALL BE A27CORRESPONDING NUMBER OF ELECTION28ASSISTANT POSITIONS AT THE RATIO OF ONE29ELECTION ASSISTANT FOR EVERY TWENTY30THOUSAND (20,000) REGISTERED VOTERS."

Sec. 5. Assignment, Designation, Engagement and Detailing of Employees. –
 A new section, Section 53-C, is hereby inserted in Article VII of Batas Pambansa Blg.
 881, otherwise known as the "Omnibus Election Code of the Philippines", as
 amended, to read as follows:

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"Section 53-C. ASSIGNMENT, DESIGNATION, 5 ENGAGEMENT AND DETAILING OF EMPLOYEES. 6 – NO OTHER PERSONNEL, OTHER THAN THOSE 7 MENTIONED IN SECTION 53 HEREOF, OR 8 EXPRESSLY AUTHORIZED BY LAW, SHALL BE 9 DESIGNATED, ASSIGNED, ENGAGED OR 10 DETAILED AT THE COMMISSION'S FIELD 11 OFFICES, OR SHALL BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM 12 ADMINISTRATIVE OR CLERICAL WORKS IN 13 ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANDATE OF THE 14 FIELD OFFICES. VIOLATION OF THIS PROVISION 15 SHALL CONSTITUTE AN ELECTION OFFENSE." 16

Sec. 6. Mandate to Provide Separate Offices. – The Commission on Elections (COMELEC) is hereby mandated to provide suitable office spaces for its field offices enumerated in Section 53 of Batas Pambansa Blg. 881, as amended, separate from the offices of the Local Government Units that currently provide office facilities to said offices.

Sec. 7. *Transfer Plan.* – Within one (1) year from the effectivity of this Act, COMELEC shall formulate a Transfer Plan to transfer COMELEC field offices from the Local Government Unit (LGU)-controlled facilities to COMELEC-owned or leased facilities. The plan shall provide for a complete transfer of all COMELEC field offices within five (5) years from the effectivity of this Act.

27 Sec. 8. *Reporting.* – COMELEC shall submit the Transfer Plan to Congress.

Sec. 9. *Appropriations.* – Such amounts as may be necessary to implement this Act shall be included in the budget of the COMELEC in the next succeeding General Appropriations Act following the adoption of the Transfer Plan by the COMELEC *En Banc*.

Sec. 10. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any section or provision of
 this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions which
 are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Sec. 11. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, executive orders,
proclamations, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are
repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Sec. 12. *Effectivity*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
