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#### AN ACT ESTABLISHING A COMPREHENSIVE SUBSTANCE ABUSE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM IN EVERY SCHOOL

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 13 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being. It shall inculcate in the youth patriotism and nationalism, and encourage their involvement in public and civic affairs."

For the purpose of ensuring the future of our youth's intellectual, physical and social well-being there is a need to establish a comprehensive program for the prevention, intervention, evaluation, and treatment for student alcohol, tobacco and drug use.

The proposed bill seeks to create and establish a national alcohol, tobacco and drug abuse program that will be implemented in all high schools, colleges, and universities. In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

	AN ACT ESTABLISHING A COMPREHENSIVE SUBSTANCE ABUSE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM IN EVERY SCHOOL
	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
1	Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Keep Clean from
2	Substance Abuse Guidance and Educational Program."
3	
4	Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State
5	to ensure the social, physical and mental health and development of our youth
6	and address substance abuse problems within school campuses.
7	
8	Sec. 3. Establishment of the Keep Clean from Substance Abuse Guidance
9	<i>and Educational Program.</i> – The Department of Education (DepEd), in
0	coordination with the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the Department
1	of Health (DOH), and the Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB), shall establish a
2	comprehensive program of prevention, intervention, referral for evaluation,
3	referral for treatment and continuity of care for student alcohol, tobacco and
4	other drug abuse in all secondary schools, colleges and universities.

6	Sec. 4. Prevention Component The purpose of the prevention
7	component of the program shall be to:
18	<ul><li>(A) Keep students from using alcohol, tobacco or other drugs;</li></ul>

1	(B) Reduce or eliminate the incidence and prevalence of student
2	alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse;
3	(C) Increase the age of onset of students' first use of alcohol,
4	tobacco or other drugs;
5	(D) Reduce the factors that place students at risk for involvement
6	with alcohol, tobacco or other drugs through school and
7	community-based planning processes;
8	(E) Contribute to the development of school environments and
9	alternative activities that are alcohol, tobacco and other drug-
10	free;
11	(F) Increase the knowledge and skills of students, staff and
12	community members for avoiding the harmful effects of
13	alcohol, tobacco and other drug use; and
14	(G) Actively involve staff, parents and other community members
15	in the development and implementation of prevention
16	program plans.
17	
18	Sec. 5. Intervention, Referral for Evaluation and Referral for Treatment
19	Component The purpose of the intervention, referral for evaluation and
20	referral for treatment components of the program shall be to:
21	(A) Identify students who are at risk for, or who have exhibited,
22	alcohol, tobacco or other drug abuse or related problems;
23	(B) Help students or their parents who have requested assistance
24	for alcohol, tobacco or other drug abuse problems;
25	(C) Make a preliminary assessment of a student's need for
26	educational programs, supportive services or treatment which
27	extends beyond the general school program by virtue of the
28	use of alcohol, tobacco or other drugs by the student or the
29	student's parents;

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1	(D)	Refer students for evaluation to make a positive determination
2		regarding a student's need for alcohol, tobacco or other drug
3		treatment; and
4	(E)	Help a student or a student's parents follow through on the
5		recommendation of an evaluation which has positively
6		determined the harmful use of alcohol, tobacco or other drugs
7		by the student or the student's parents.
8		
9	Sec. 6.	Continuity of Care Component The purpose of the continuity of
10	care compone	nt of the program shall be to:
11	(A)	Assist with the provision of educational programs and services
12		for students in treatment; and
13	(B)	Plan and provide supportive services for students who are
14		returning from treatment.
15		
16	Sec. 7.	Training of Educational Staff. – The DepEd and CHED shall ensure
17	that all mem	bers of the educational staff shall receive in-service training in
18	alcohol, tobac	co and other drug abuse prevention and intervention.
19		
20	Sec. 8.	Substance Awareness Coordinators. – The program shall have
21	substance aw	vareness coordinators who shall assist schools in the effective
22	implementatio	on of the program.
23		
24	Sec. 9.	Program for Parents. – Educational programs on alcohol, tobacco
25	and other dru	g abuse for parents shall be established and offered at times and
26	places conven	ient to the parents of enrolled students.
27		
28	Sec. 10	. Confidentiality of Student Alcohol and Other Drug Information. –
29	Each school	shall assure compliance with the following confidentiality
30	requirements:	
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1	(A) Confidentiality of alcohol and drug abuse patient records; and
2	(B) Confidentiality of information provided by an elementary or
3	secondary school student while participating in a school-based
4	drug and alcohol counseling program which indicates that the
5	student's parent or other person residing in the student's
6	household is dependent upon or illegally using substances.
7	
8	Sec. 11. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). – The DepEd, CHED,
9	and DOH shall promulgate the IRR within three (3) months from the effectivity of
10	this Act.
11	
12	Sec. 12. Appropriations To carry out the provisions of this Act, such
13	sums as may be necessary are hereby authorized to be appropriated from the
14	National Treasury. Thereafter, the amount necessary for the continuous
15	operation of the Keep Clean from Substance Abuse Guidance and Educational
16	Program shall be included in the annual appropriations of the DepEd.
17	
18	Sec. 13. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act is held invalid or
19	unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other
20	provisions hereof.
21	
22	Sec. 14. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances, or
23	portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are
24	hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
25	
26	Sec. 15. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
27	after its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general
28	circulation.
