- AN ACT DECLARING THE BALANGA WETLAND AND NATURE PARK LOCATED IN BARANGAY TORTUGAS, CITY OF BALANGA, PROVINCE OF BATAAN AS A RESPONSIBLE, COMMUNITY-BASED ECOTOURISM ZONE AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR
- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
- SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. The State is mandated to promote a tourism industry that is ecologically sustainable, responsible, participative, culturally sensitive, economically viable, and equitable for the local community.
- 5 SEC. 2. Balanga Wetland and Nature Park Ecotourism Zone.
- 6 The Balanga Wetland and Nature Park (BWNP) located in
- 7 Barangay Tortugas, City of Balanga, Province of Bataan is hereby
- 8 declared as a responsible, community-based ecotourism zone. It
- 9 shall be accorded priority development by the Department of
- 10 Tourism (DOT) and shall be subject to the rules and regulations
- 11 governing the development of ecotourism zones.
- 12 Sec. 3. Technical Description. The technical description of
- the area for declaration as ecotourism zone are as follows:

SEC. 4. Objectives. - Pursuant to the above policy, the State shall endeavor to accomplish the following:

 (a) Ensure the conservation of the biodiversity and the preservation of the park;

 (b) Develop and promote responsible, community-based ecological tourism as the core management strategy in the development of the BWNP:

(c) Develop tourism products and programs that will generate employment and livelihood for the local residents, consistent with the preservation and maintenance of natural resources;

(d) Guarantee that the financial and economic benefits of the tourism industry are equitably shared by, and distributed among the local residents by giving preference and support to community and home-based tourism enterprises, such as micro and small businesses including local inns, lodges and homestays, restaurants, food and fruit stands, and other similar tourism-oriented industries and businesses:

(e) Ensure that the quality of local tourism programs and activities are educational and enriching for tourists and visitors through the provision of orientation, educational and tour programs by local tour operators, nongovernment organizations (NGOs), the local government of the City of Balanga and the DOT; and

(f) Guarantee that in the development and promotion of the local tourism industry, the local government of the City of Balanga shall ensure that the needs of local residents for adequate water supply, food, energy and local construction materials are first secured and met.

## SEC. 5. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act:

- (a) *Biodiversity conservation* refers to the practice of preserving the variety of species and habitats, including *inter alia*, terrestrial, marine and other aquatic ecosystems, and the ecological complexes which they are a part of;
- (b) Community-based tourism refers to a form of tourism where the local community and its residents have substantial control and involvement in the development and management of the local tourism industry and a greater portion of the economic gains remain within the community;
- (c) Ecotourism refers to a form of sustainable tourism within a natural area where community participation, protection and management of natural resources, cultural and indigenous knowledge and practices, environmental education and ethics, as well as economic benefits are fostered and pursued for the enrichment of host communities and the satisfaction of visitors;
- (d) Homestay refers to a system of tourist accommodation where a tourist stays with local residents and experiences their day-to-day life within the local community;
- (e) Responsible ecotourism refers to a form of sustainable tourism in which both the tourism sector and the tourists take responsibility in the protection, respect, and conservation of the

- natural environment and the local culture and ways of life, and
  where community participation as well as economic benefits are
  fostered and pursued for the well-being of the local people and
  visitors; and
  - (f) Sustainable tourism development refers to the management of resources in a manner that simultaneously meets the needs of tourists and the host locality; protects the opportunities for the future; fulfills the economic and social needs of the district; and preserves natural integrity, essential ecological processes, biological diversity and a system that supports and perpetuates life.
  - SEC. 6. Balanga Wetland and Nature Park Tourism Development Plan. The DOT, in coordination with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), shall assist the local government of the City of Balanga in the formulation of the BWNP Tourism Development Plan. The Plan shall include a set of guidelines for a responsible, community-based ecotourism that shall ensure the preservation of the area, and shall include the following components:
  - (a) Carrying capacity of the park;

- (b) Specific site assessments;
- (c) Identification of strategic priorities;
- (d) Product development for local income generation;
- (e) Capacity building for the local community to allow residents therein to ably manage economically viable and responsible, community-based ecotourism business enterprises;
- (f) Support for the formulation of local production groups and networks, including the marketing and pricing of products; and

1	(g) Marketing strategies that reflect the natural, social and
2	environmental integrity of the BWNP.
3	The process of developing the BWNP Tourism Development
4	Plan shall be participatory, from the bottom up, with the framework
5	to be provided by the DOT and DENR, in consultation with the
6	Balanga Wetland and Nature Park Development Council herein
7	created.
8	Sec. 7. Balanga Wetland and Nature Park Development
9	Council A multisectoral council to be known as the Balanga
10	Wetland and Nature Park Development Council, hereinafter
11	referred to as the Council, shall be created. The Council, whose
12	members shall serve coterminously with the incumbent Mayor
13	of the City of Balanga, shall be composed of the following members:
14	(a) The Mayor of the City of Balanga, as Chairperson;
15	(b) The head of the City Tourism Office, as Vice-Chairperson;
16	(c) The head of the City Environmental and Natural
17	Resources Office; and
18	(d) Three (3) representatives from the private sector.
19	The local government of the City of Balanga, Province of
20	Bataan shall provide a Secretariat for the Council including the
21	funding necessary to cover the expenses for the performance of its
22	official functions and activities.
23	Sec. 8. Functions and Responsibilities of the Council The
24	Council shall be responsible for the following:

(a) Formulation and the implementation of the Tourism

Development Plan in consultation with the local residents,

businesses, and other stakeholders;

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1 (b) Assessment and evaluation of the potential impact of the 2 development to the environmental safety and well-being of the area. 3 communities, and enterprises; 4 (c) Provision of technical and financial assistance to the 5 communities within the site: 6 (d) Formulation of the rules and regulations in relation to the 7 maintenance and security of the ecotourism zone; and 8 (e) Performance of other functions as may be necessary to 9 carry out the objectives of this Act. 10 SEC. 9. Formulation of Guidelines and Standards. - The concerned Protected Area Management Board of the DENR, the 11 DOT and the Council shall assist in the formulation of local tourism 12 13 standards ensuring that environmental protection is integrated in 14 the development of ecotourism plans. 15 The guidelines and standards shall: 16 (a) Raise the capacity of all stakeholders and ensure that best 17 practices are followed; 18 (b) Ensure optimal use of water and energy: 19 (c) Reduce waste and pollution through the encouragement of 20 recycling and other environmentally-sound waste management 21 reduction and disposal schemes; 22 (d) Prevent vandalism in the facilities of the park; and 23 (e) Encourage the use of local produce and services, and 24 support the employment of local people. 25 SEC. 10. Coordination with National Agencies. - The DOT 26 shall closely coordinate with the local government of the City of

Balanga, as well as the relevant regional offices of the DENR,

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- 1 Department of Labor and Employment, Department of Public
- 2 Works and Highways, Department of Transportation, Department
- 3 of Agriculture, Department of Education, Department of Trade and
- 4 Industry, Department of the Interior and Local Government,
- 5 Philippine National Police, Maritime Industry Authority and other
- 6 line agencies of the government in the implementation of this Act.
- 7 SEC. 11. Appropriations. The Secretary of Tourism shall 8 include in the Department's subsidy program, support for the
- 9 capital outlay requirements of the BWNP for the preliminary
- implementation of this Act and enhancement of the facilities of the
- implementation of this Act and enhancement of the facilities of the
- 11 ecotourism zone, the funding of which shall be included in the
- 12 annual General Appropriations Act and internally generated funds
- of the DOT.
- The budgetary allocations for the succeeding years shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act, subject to
- 16 government audit.
- 17 Sec. 12. Implementing Rules and Regulations. Within
- 18 thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the DOT, in
- 19 coordination with the DENR, and in consultation with the local
- 20 government of the City of Balanga and other concerned government
- 21 agencies and stakeholders, shall promulgate the necessary rules
- 22 and regulations for the proper implementation of this Act.
- 23 SEC. 13. Separability Clause. If, for any reason, any
- 24 provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid,
- 25 other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall
- 26 continue to be in full force and effect.

1	SEC. 14. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, executive
2	orders, proclamations and administrative regulations, or parts
3	thereof inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or
4	modified accordingly.
5	SEC. 15. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)
6	days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper
7	of general circulation.
