## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORTED 5,100 TONS OF GARBAGE THAT ARRIVED FROM SOUTH KOREA WITH THE END IN VIEW OF REVIEWING AND IMPROVING GUIDELINES AND PROTOCOLS ON THE MOVEMENT OF HAZARDOUS WASTES

- WHEREAS, Article II, Section 16 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides the State shall protect and advanced the right of the people to a balance and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature;
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Customs (BOC) implements an effective revenue collection by preventing and suppressing smuggling and the entry of prohibited imported goods;
- WHEREAS, an article from ABS-CBN News Online, dated November 13, 2018, reported on 5,100 tons of garbage from South Korea that arrived at the Mindanao Container Terminal (MCT) and was misdeclared as "plastic synthetic flakes".;
  - WHEREAS, according to the initial findings Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), the garbage shipment contained used dextrose tubes, used diapers, batteries, bulbs, and electronic equipment;
  - WHEREAS, the said garbage shipment was consigned to South Korean company Verde Soko II Industrial Corp., which runs a waste recycling facility in Tagoloan town. However, the said company is not registered as an importer of recyclable materials;

WHEREAS, the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal is an international treaty, which the Philippines ratified on January 19, 1994, designed to reduce the movements of hazardous waste between countries specifically to prevent the transfer of hazardous waste from developed to less developed countries;

WHEREAS, Title III, Chapter VII, Section 24 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 6969, otherwise known as the "Toxic Substances and Hazardous and Nuclear Wastes Control Act of 1990", provides it shall be the policy of the DENR to prohibit the entry even in transit of hazardous wastes and their disposal into the Philippine territorial limits for whatever purpose;

WHEREAS, an article by Rappler, dated on November 16, 2017, reported on garbage from Canada that entered the Philippines in 2013 and 2014. On 2017, the said garbage has not yet been returned;

WHEREAS, a Senate inquiry on the matter is necessary to review and improve our guidelines and protocols on transboundary movement of hazardous wastes for the purpose of protecting the welfare of the environment and to prevent further occurrence of hazardous wastes from entering the country;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the proper Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the reported 5,100 tons of garbage that arrived from South Korea with the end in view of reviewing and improving guidelines and protocols on the movement of hazardous wastes.
