EXPLANATORY NOTE

No less than the Constitution guarantees the right of every citizen an access to quality education at all levels. Towards this end, the State shall promote and develop its educational institutions by providing sufficient governmental support. The Polytechnic University of the Philippines (PUP) serves as one of the country's premier state universities by providing every citizen an affordable yet quality higher education.

Through the years, the University had produced competent and fullyequipped graduates who now serve as the country's industry leaders especially in the field of science and technology, engineering and architecture, education, information technology, law, business, public administration, and social sciences. Results of surveys conducted by Jobstreet.com show that employers in the Philippines consider graduates of PUP as their top choice for employment.

The country, with its thrust towards an unparalleled development in the new century, needs more quality industry leaders who will serve under the principle of excellence, patriotism, and love for knowledge and truth. In order to contribute more to this thrust, and for nation building and national development, it is now high time to strengthen the Polytechnic University of the Philippines and elevate this into a National Polytechnic University which will cater into educating and developing the country's future industry leaders. In so doing, PUP shall maintain and propagate the ideals for which its core values are based—social justice, peace, freedom, academic excellence, ethical and moral standards, cultural identity and respect for diversity, civil society engagement, and passion for learning. Furthermore it shall live up to its mandate of providing technical and professional instruction and training applied arts and sciences, and to take steps to enrich the academic freedom in other fields of study and offer other courses that are essential to produce individuals with highly technological and specialized skills. It is likewise bound to promote applied research, advance studies, and progressive leadership in the aforementioned fields.

To this end, the State will empower PUP as an institution committed in producing industry leaders and professionals towards nation-building and national development.

For these reasons, the passage of this bill is most respectfully sought.

INTRODUCED BY SENATOR JOSEPH VICTOR G. EJERCITO

AN ACT

AMENDING PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NUMBER 1341, OTHERWISE KNOWN A THE CHARTER OF THE POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of PD 1341 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 "Section 1. Declaration of Policy. --- The Polytechnic 3 University of the Philippines is hereby strengthened into the 4 Country's National Polytechnic University. In order to execute its mandate, it is hereby declared that as the country's first national 5 polytechnic university. Along with its elevated status as the 6 country's first national polytechnic university, the University will aid 7 and support other polytechnic state universities and colleges raise 8 the bar by having the former serve as the latter's guide in 9 developing professional and technical programs. 10

11 "The University shall enjoy institutional autonomy and fiscal 12 autonomy. It shall be treated in a manner consistent with its institutional requirements by the service-wide agencies in the 13 14 exercise of their respective jurisdiction. Taking into account 15 national goals and priorities, it shall exclusively determine its teaching research and extension thrusts, plans, policies, programs 16 and standards. On the basis of such determination, the national 17 polytechnic university shall recommend its annual budget to the 18

President of the Republic of the Philippines and Congress. Appropriations for the university shall not be reduced by the legislature below the amount appropriated for the previous year and after approval shall be automatically and regularly released."

5 Section 2. Section 2 of PD 1341 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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6 "Section 2. Primary Purpose. --- The University shall primarily 7 provide higher occupational, technical and professional instruction 8 and training in the fields of engineering and architecture, applied 9 sciences, accountancy, law, education, business and management. 10 and shall be strengthened as the country's National Polytechnic 11 University. It shall also promote applied research, advance studies, 12 and progressive leadership in the stated fields. As a national polytechnic university, PUP is committed in implementing programs 13 14 designed to ameliorate the pressing social need by rendering services to individuals and communities and empowering citizenry 15 16 for sustainable development. "

17 Section 3. Section 3 of PD 1341 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. Secondary Purpose. The University shall offer
 undergraduate and graduate programs in the field of accountancy,
 engineering and architecture, applied sciences, law, education,
 business and management. In addition, the University shall offer
 other programs in the polytechnic areas in light of its purpose as a
 national polytechnic university."

24 Section 4. Section 4 of PD 1341 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 "Section 4. The University Administration. --- The 26 administration of the university shall be vested in the President of the university who shall render full-time service. He shall be 27 appointed by the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of 28 a duly constituted search committee. He shall have a term of six 29 (6) years without an eligibility for reappointment for another term: 30 31 Provided, That this provision shall not adversely affect the terms of the incumbents; Provided further that in cases no appointment 32 was made, the incumbent President shall continue to hold the 33 34 office in a hold-over capacity, such period shall in no case be more 35 than 90 days. 36

"The president shall be assisted by a vice president for academic 1 affairs who shall be appointed by the Board upon the former's 2 3 recommendation without prejudice to the appointment of more 4 than one vice president when so warranted. 5 "In case of vacancy by reason of death, resignation, removal for 6 7 cause or incapacity of the president to perform the functions of his 8 office, the Board of Regent shall have the authority to designate 9 an officer-in-charge pending the appointment of a new president. 10 11 "In case of vacancy in the office of the president as mentioned in the immediately preceding paragraph, his successors shall hold 12 13 office for the unexpired term." Section 5. Section 5 of PD 1341 is hereby amended to read as follows: 14 "Section 5. Powers and Duties of the President. ---15 Specifically, the President of the University shall have the following 16 powers and duties in addition to those normally appertaining to the 17 Office of the President of the University: 18 19 "(a) He shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the University. As 20 such, progressive and dynamic, ethical, and intellectual and 21 administrative leadership in the University is expected of him and 22 23 vested in him: "(b) He shall be the head of the University Faculties and of any 24 25 branch thereof: "(c) He shall have general supervision over all academic as well as 26 business and financial operations of the University; 27 28 "(d) He shall promulgate and enforce general policies affecting any unit of the University and take such actions which in his judgment 29 are necessary for the protection of property and general interest 30 of the University, students and personnel and for the operation of 31 the University as a whole and shall inform the Board on all matters 32 relating to the operation and welfare of the University; 33 "(e) He shall appoint qualified persons to fill all vacancies and new 34 positions subject to the approval of the Board and make such other 35 arrangements to meet emergencies occurring between meetings 36 of the Board so that the work of the University shall not suffer. 37 "(f) He shall institute disciplinary action against any member of the 38 University personnel, faculty or non-faculty as well as any student 39 of the University whose actions adversely affect the general 40 41 interest of the University:

1 "(g) He shall decide appeals in controversies between ranking 2 officials of the University, his decisions being final and conclusive; 3 "(h) He shall grant or deny sabbatical leaves and leaves of absence 4 without pay and/or extension of such leaves as well as extension 5 of fellowships or any form of scholarship for a period not exceeding 6 one academic year if the budget permits and for reasons he may 7 deem satisfactory; 8 "(i) He shall make ad-interim appointments; 9 "(j) He shall grant or withhold permission to reveal confidential matters affecting the University or any unit thereof, as well as any 10 action taken by the Board of Regents; 11 "(k) He shall grant permission for the use of buildings and premises 12 13 of the University for academic, professional and scientific 14 conventions, for student and related activities and to fix the fee 15 thereof: "(I) He is authorized to join the execution of all contracts, deeds, 16 and instruments for the proper conduct of the business of the 17 University and to assign the same in behalf of the University; 18 "(m) He shall prepare an annual report on the work of the past 19 year and needs of the current year including a budget with 20 21 estimates of income and expenditures; and "(n) He shall have such other powers as may be specifically 22 authorized by the Board of Regents. He may delegate in writing 23 24 any of his specific functions to any office." Section 6. Section 6 of PD 1341 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25 "Section 6. The Board of Regents. --- The governing body of the 26 University shall be the Board of Regents of the Polytechnic University 27 of the Philippines (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"). 28 29 30 (1) The Board shall be composed of : (a) The Chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education as 31 32 Chairperson; (b) The President of the University as Co-Chairperson; 33 (c) The Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Education, 34 35 Arts, and Culture: (d) The Chairperson of the House Committee on Higher and 36 37 Technical Education; (e) The Director-General of the National Economic Development 38 39 Authority;

30	to the contrary notwithstanding, any income generated by
31	the university from tuition fees and other charges, as well as

36	fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific purposes for

42	of said funds for any reasonable purpose which, in its

of the objectives and goals of the universities, Provided further, That a portion of any amount of fees increased, however, shall inure to the benefit of the College or Institute for the purpose of faculty, physical facilities and equipment development;

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(e) to authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machineries, equipment and other facilities and the purchase and acquisition of real and personal properties including necessary supplies, materials and equipment. Purchases and other transactions entered into by the university through the Board of Regents shall be exempt from all taxes and duties;

(f) to appoint, upon the recommendation of the president and vice presidents of the University;

(g) to fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative officials and employees subject to the provisions of the revised compensation and classification system and other pertinent budget and compensation laws governing hours of service, and such other duties and conditions as it may deem proper; to grant them, at its discretion, leaves of absence under such regulations as it may promulgate, any provisions of existing law to the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for cause in accordance with the requirements of due process of law;

(h) to approve the curricula, institutional programs and rules of discipline drawn by the administrative and academic councils as herein provided;

(i) to set polices on admission and graduation of students;

(j) to award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of outstanding contribution in the field of education, public service, arts, science and technology or in any field of specialization within the academic competence of the university and to authorize the award of certificates of completion of non-degree and non-traditional courses;

(k) to absorb non-chartered tertiary institutions within their respective provinces in coordination with the CHED and in consultation with the Department of Budget and Management, and to offer therein needed programs or courses, to promote and carry out equal access to educational opportunities mandated by the Constitution;

(I) to establish research and extension centers of the SUC where such will promote the development of the latter;

1	(m) to establish chairs in the university and to provide
2	fellowships for qualified faculty members and scholarships to

4	(n) to delegate any of its powers and duties provided for

(c) The Board may plan, design, approve and/or cause the

(f) Any plan to generate revenues and other sources from land 10 11 grants and other real properties entrusted to the national polytechnic university shall be consistent with the academic mission and orientation 12 of the national polytechnic university as well as protect it from undue 13 influence and control of commercial interests: Provided, that such 14 programs, projects or mechanisms shall be approved by the Board 15 subject to a transparent and democratic process of consultation with the 16 17 constituents of the national polytechnic university: Provided, further, that funds generated from such programs, projects or mechanisms shall not 18 be meant to replace, in part or in whole, the annual appropriations 19 provided by the national government to the national polytechnic 20 21 university."

Section 18. Separability Clause. - Should any provision herein be declared
 unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of

Section 19. Repealing Clause. – Republic Act No. 8292, as amended, and all laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations or other issuances or parts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

5 **Section 20. Effectivity.** - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 6 publication in the Official Gazette or in any newspaper of general circulation in 7 the Philippines.
