AN ACT ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL SENIOR VISION SERVICES PROGRAM FOR ELDERLY PERSONS WITH FUNCTIONAL VISUAL IMPAIRMENTS

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article XV, Section 4 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The family has the duty to care for its elderly members but the State may also do so through just programs of social security."

Article II, Section 15 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them."

The eye is an important organ of the human body that is used in everyday life. As they age, elderly people encounter different problems that lead to impairment of visual functions. It is our duty to provide senior citizens with health care services that will assist them in adapting to visual impairments brought about by aging.

The proposed bill seeks to protect and promote the health and welfare of our senior citizens by creating a national senior vision program that will provide comprehensive services for their functional visual impairments. In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL SENIOR VISION SERVICES PROGRAM FOR ELDERLY PERSONS WITH FUNCTIONAL VISUAL IMPAIRMENTS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Senior Vision
2	Services Act."
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4	Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is the policy of the State to promote the
5	general welfare of the people. Pursuant to this policy, it shall establish a national
6	senior vision services for elderly persons with functional visual impairments.
7	
8	Sec. 3. Definition of Terms For purposes of this Act, the term:
9	(A) "Senior vision services" shall mean the provision of medical
10	and other needed services to elderly persons who have a
11	functional visual impairment. These services may include, but
12	not be limited to the following:
13	(1) vision screening;
14	(2) eye examination;
15	(3) information and referral;
16	(4) client and family counseling;
17	(5) referrals for opthalmological, optometric, or other
18	health care services;

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1	(6) provision of corrective eyeglasses;
2	(7) technical assistance and training for human services
3	personnel to serve persons who are blind or visually
4	impaired; and
5	(8) low vision screening.
6	(B) "Functional visual impairment" means an impairment of sight
7	that substantially interferes with an elderly person's ability to
8	perform specific daily living skills and tasks. Persons who are
9	not regarded as legally blind, pursuant to this paragraph, but
10	who experience such an impairment of sight, shall be deemed
11	eligible for senior vision services pursuant to this Act;
12	(C) "Elderly" means an individual over sixty (60) years of age; and
13	(D) "Secretary" means the Secretary of Health.
14	
15	Sec. 4. National Senior Vision Services Program. – There is hereby
16	established a national senior vision services program for elderly persons with
17	functional visual impairments. Such program shall be under the direction of the
18	Secretary of Health.
19	In providing senior vision services, the Secretary shall take into
20	consideration the lack of services for elderly persons in need of senior vision
21	services to establish or to expand existing blind or visually impaired services
22	currently provided or available in municipalities and cities throughout the

currently provided or available in municipalities and cities throughout the country. The Secretary shall likewise ensure that due consideration is given to the geographic and existing services demands for senior vision services within a municipality or city.

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Sec. 5. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. – Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary shall promulgate the implementing rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

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The Secretary shall submit a report to the House of Representatives and the State, prior to, but in no event later than, December thirty-first, in the year following the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, which shall include, but not be limited to:

- 5 (A) Financial reports of the program operations established 6 pursuant to this Act;
- 7 (B) An analysis of the program's ability to provide such nationwide
 8 senior vision services to elderly persons with functional visual
 9 impairments;
- 10(C) Recommendations on the continuation of such program and11the need for program expansion, if appropriate; and
- 12 13
- (D) Other information deemed necessary.

Sec. 6. *Appropriations*. – The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be included and incorporated in the annual general appropriations of the Department of Health.

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Sec. 7. *Separability Clause*. – If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provisions not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

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Sec. 8. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

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27 Sec. 9. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days 28 after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
