ABOLISHING THE SPECIAL FUNDS CREATED PURSUANT TO REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8794 AND REQUIRING THE MONIES COLLECTED AS MOTOR VEHICLE USER'S CHARGE BE DEPOSITED INTO THE GENERAL FUND

EXPLANATORY NOTE

In the year 2000, Republic Act No. 8794 was enacted to put in place a Motor Vehicle User's Charge (MVUC) that would replace the registration fee and the private motor vehicle tax. The monies collected as MVUC are special funds earmarked solely for (1) road maintenance and the improvement of road drainage, (2) installation of adequate and efficient traffic lights and road safety devices, and (3) air pollution control.

Over the years, the Commission on Audit has flagged the illegal utilization of these funds under the Road Board, the entity created under R. A. 8794 to implement the prudent and efficient management and utilization of these special funds. Thus, legislative measures have been filed to abolish the Road Board. As a complementary bill to the abolition of the road board, this bill seeks to merge these special funds into the general fund to fund priority programs and projects of the government and the allocation will be decided by Congress through the annual general appropriations act.

With these proposed changes, we expect a more transparent and accountable use of public funds and we ensure a steady funding source for vital government programs and projects.

In view of the foregoing, passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

ABOLISHING THE SPECIAL FUNDS CREATED PURSUANT TO REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8794 AND REQUIRING THE MONIES COLLECTED AS MOTOR VEHICLE USER'S CHARGE BE DEPOSITED INTO THE GENERAL FUND

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Amendment in the Disposition of Monies Collected.
2	- Section 7 of R. A. 8794 is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	
4	SEC. 7. Disposition of Monies Collected All monies
5	collected under this Act shall [be earmarked solely and
6	used exclusively (1) for road maintenance and the
7	improved of the road drainage, (2) for the installation of
8	adequate and efficient traffic lights and road safety devices,
9	and (3) for air pollution control.
10	
11	All such monies collected shall be deposited in four
12	(4) special trust accounts in the National Treasury, namely:
13	(1) Special Road Support Fund; (2) Special Local Road
14	Fund; (3) Special Road Safety Fund; and (4) Special
15	Vehicle Pollution Control Fund. The distribution of
16	collections under this Act shall be as follows:
17	
18	(1) Eighty percent (80%) shall be allotted to and
19	placed in the Special Road Support Fund;

1 Five percent (5%) shall be allotted to and placed 2 (2)in the Special Local Road Fund; and 3 4 Seven and one-half percent (7.5%) shall be (3)5 allotted to and placed in the Special Vehicle 6 Pollution Control Fund. 7 8 The Special Road Support Fund, the Special Local 9 Road Fund shall be under the DPWH, whereas the Special 10 Vehicle Pollution Control Fund shall be under the DOTC. 11 12 Seventy percent (70%) of the Special Road Support 13 Fund shall be used for the maintenance of, and the 14 improvement of drainage of, national primary roads. The 15 remaining thirty percent (30%) thereof shall be allocated 16 and used for the maintenance, and improvement of 17 drainage of national secondary roads throughout the 18 country. 19 20 The cost of installation of adequate and efficient traffic 21 lights and road safety devices throughout the country, 22 where such traffic lights and safety devices are needed, 23 shall be taken from the Special Road Safety Fund. 24 25 The Special Local Road Fund shall be apportioned to 26 provincial and city governments in accordance with the 27 vehicle population and size of the road network under their 28 respective jurisdictions, and shall be used exclusively for 29 maintenance of local roads, traffic management and road 30 safety devices. 31 32 A Road Board to implement the prudent and efficient 33 management and utilization of the special funds shall be 34 organized by the President of the Philippines. The Road 35 Board shall be composed of seven (7) members, with the 36 Secretary of the DPWH as ex officio head, and the 37 secretaries of the Department of Finance, Budget and 38 Management, and Transportation and Communications, as

Management, and Transportation and Communications, as *ex officio* members. The remaining three (3) members shall come from transport and motorist organizations which have been in existence and active for the last five (5) years prior to this Act. They shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years each by the President of the Philippines upon the recommendation of the secretaries of the DPWH and the DOTC] ACCRUE TO THE GENERAL FUND TO FINANCE PRIORITY PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS THE GOVERNMENT WHICH SHALL BE OF ANNUAL **GENERAL** ALLOCATED IN THE APPROPRIATIONS ACT.

SEC. 2. Repeal. — Section 8 of R. A. 8794 is hereby repealed.

[SEC. 8. *Status of the Special Funds.* – The four (4) special funds established under this Act shall be distinct and separate from and in addition to any appropriation authorized and granted yearly to the DPWH and the DOTC to cover expenditures for the identified objects of expenditures under this Act. Congress shall continue to appropriate an amount in the General Appropriations Act for road maintenance of the DPWH: *Provided, however*, That any savings for each year out of such appropriation shall revert to the General Fund. Any savings from the special funds created herein shall accrue to these respective special funds.]

SEC. 3. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* — Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Public Works and Highways, Department of Transportation, Department of Budget and Management, Department of Finance, and the Bureau of Treasury shall jointly promulgate the rules and regulations necessary for its effective implementation.

32 **SEC. 4.** *Repealing Clause.* — All other laws, rules and 33 regulations, or parts thereof that are inconsistent with this Act are hereby 34 repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SEC. 5. *Effectivity Clause.* — This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
