DESIGNATING THE THIRD SUNDAY OF NOVEMBER AS THE PHILIPPINE DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD CRASH VICTIMS, SURVIVORS AND FAMILIES

Explanatory Note

A World Bank study entitled, "*The High Toll of Traffic Injuries: Unacceptable and Preventable*," concludes that reducing road traffic deaths and injuries could result in substantial long-term income gains for low- and middle-income countries such as the Philippines.¹ The study showed that countries that do not invest in road safety could miss out 7 to 22% in potential per capita GDP growth over a 24-year period. Moreover, it also reported that the cost of inaction is more than 1.25 million deaths a year globally, diminished productivity and reduced growth prospects. Thus, designating the third Sunday of November of each year as the Philippine Day of Remembrance for road crash victims, survivors and families is an affirmative action that indicates the government's commitment to road safety and road casualty reduction.

According to the Road Crash Statistics Report of Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA), some 110,025 crash incidents happened in Metro Manila in 2017, or about 300 incidents daily.² Of these, 12,635 road crashes were on Epifanio de los Santos Avenue (EDSA)³. It recorded Quezon City with 35,494; Makati with 11,425 and Manila with 11,315 as the top three cities with the highest number of road crash cases.⁴

The same report in 2017 revealed that a total of 434 Filipinos died and 19,374 were wounded in the National Capital Region alone due to road crashes. This means that 4 in every 100,000 Filipinos died while 193 people in every 100,000 were injured as a result of road crashes.⁵

The number of fatalities in 2017 had declined to 434 compared to 446 recorded accidents in 2016. Cars are the most susceptible to road accidents involving 110,653 vehicles followed by motorcycle, with 24,058.⁶

Designating the third Sunday in November of every year as the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims is an appropriate commemoration for victims of road traffic crashes and their families. At the same time, it will raise awareness to the disastrous effects of road accidents not only to life and property but to the economy as well.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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

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DESIGNATING THE THIRD SUNDAY OF NOVEMBER AS THE PHILIPPINE DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD CRASH VICTIMS, SURVIVORS AND FAMILIES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title This Act shall be known as the "National Day of Remembrance for
Road Crash Victims, Survivors, and their Families Act."
SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy It is the policy of the State to nurture a Filipino society
that is aware of the causes, consequences, and costs of road crash deaths and injuries and that
values human lives by way of remembering the victims of road crashes, recognizing the sufferings
of their affected families and communities and advocating for the improvement of the Philippine
road safety situation to prevent the wastage of more lives.
SEC. 3. National Day of Remembrance Every third Sunday of November of each year
is hereby declared as the "National Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims, Survivors, and
their Families."
SEC. 4. Mandatory Activities To ensure the meaningful observance of the National Day
of Remembrance as herein declared, the Department of Transportation (DOTr), in coordination
with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), Land Transportation Office
(LTO), Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) and Metropolitan
Manila Development Authority (MMDA), shall ensure the implementation of the following
programs and activities:
a) Commemorative ceremonies, including flower-laying activities, candlelight vigil,
solidarity march and special assemblies, shall be observed in provinces, cities and

municipalities nationwide for road crash victims and survivors, involving their families and support groups.

As a sign of support, local government units (LGUs) are encouraged to put up memorials and tributes in strategic local public spaces or road networks to commemorate the lives that were lost and/or injured to promote road safety to the public;

- b) Special recognition shall be given to public officers, private stakeholders, volunteers and organizations who are instrumental in saving lives or supporting victims, survivors 10 and their families;
- c) In coordination with the Department of Health (DOH), Department of Social Welfare 13 and Development (DSWD), Department of Justice (DOJ) and other agencies 14 concerned, the DOTr shall conduct multi-sectoral symposia, conferences or 15 16 consultations that focus on: (1) how to improve the trauma care system and emotional support programs given to victims, survivors and their families; (2) how to improve the 17 legal response, including resolution of pending cases and investigations and immediate 18 compensation of victims and/or their families; and, (3) how to improve the road safety 19 20 situation by addressing the key risk factors to prevent the occurrence of similar road crash incidents; 21
- d) The DOTr, with the assistance of other government agencies and private stakeholders, 23 24 shall conduct public awareness campaigns that provide a platform to victims and survivors of road crashes, including their families, to advocate for road safety; 25
- e) Flag-raising ceremonies in government offices the day or week immediately after the 27 National Day of Remembrance shall be dedicated to road crash victims, survivors and 28 their families, and shall provide a platform for bereaved or affected employees to 29 30 advocate the need for road safety; and
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- f) Other related programs and activities as may be determined in the Implementing Rules and Regulations.
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SEC. 5. DOTr as Lead Agency. – The DOTr shall be the lead agency in the meaningful 35 36 observance of the National Day of Remembrance each year. In collaboration with public and private stakeholders, national and/or local steering committees may also be created for the 37 effective observance of the said event. 38

1	SEC. 6. Implementing Rules and Regulations The DOTr, in collaboration with the
2	DILG, LTO, LTFRB, MMDA, other agencies and stakeholders concerned, shall promulgate the
3	necessary implementing rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act within
4	sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act.
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6	SEC. 7. Separability Clause If any provision, section or part of this Act shall be declared
7	unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, invalidate or impair any other
8	provisions, sections or parts hereof.
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10	SEC. 8. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations which are
11	inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
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13	SEC. 9. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication
14	in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation or in the Official Gazette.
