EXPLANATORY NOTE

Organic Agriculture, as defined by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations, is a "holistic production management system which promotes and enhances the agro-ecosystem health, including biodiversity, biological cycles, and soil biological activity." Various studies and the experience of other countries recognize the positive effects of organic farming and products on the general health of farmers and consumers; its role in environmental protection, particularly soil fertility, reduction in the risk of groundwater and air pollution, and enhanced biodiversity; and organic farming as a viable and sustainable alternative to achieve food security and food self-sufficiency.

Republic Act No. 10068, otherwise known as the Organic Agriculture Act of 2010, institutionalized the development and promotion of organic agriculture in the Philippines. Following its passage into law, the corresponding program, spearheaded by the National Organic Agriculture Board (NOAB) under the Department of Agriculture, envisioned that at least 5% of the country's agricultural land be devoted to the practice of organic farming by 2016.2 This has not been achieved to date owing to insufficient support from government and the problem of inclusivity, among others. To boost the sector, it is necessary to ensure that the needs of smallholder farmers and farmworkers who practice organic farming, and those who are planning to shift to organic farming, are met.

To address these, this representation respectfully submits amendments to the Organic Agriculture Law.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10068 OR THE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE ACT OF 2010

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 10068, otherwise known as "An Act Providing for the Development and Promotion of Organic Agriculture in the Philippines and for other Purposes," is hereby amended, to read as follows:
 - "SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote, propagate, develop further, and implement the practice or organic FARMING AND OTHER SUSTAINABLE agriculture PRACTICES in the Philippines that will cumulatively condition and enrich the fertility of the soil, increase farm productivity AND FARMERS' INCOMES, reduce pollution and destruction of the environment, prevent the depletion of natural resources, further protect the health of farmers, consumers, and the general public, [and] save on imported farm inputs, AND PROMOTE FOOD SELF-SUFFICIENCY. Towards this end, a comprehensive program for the promotion of community-based organic agriculture systems, which include, among others, farmer-produced purely organic fertilizers such as compost, [pesticides] BIO-PESTICIDES, and other farm inputs, together with a nationwide educational and promotional campaign for their use and processing[,] SHALL BE ESTABLISHED.

LIKEWISE, A NATIONWIDE EDUCATIONAL AWARENESS CAMPAIGN AMONG CONSUMERS ON THE BENEFITS OF CONSUMING ORGANIC PRODUCTS TO BOOST LOCAL PRODUCTION OF ORGANIC FOOD AND NON-FOOD PRODUCERS, as well as adoption of organic agricultural system as a viable alternative shall be undertaken.

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SEC. 2. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 10068 is hereby amended, to read as follows:

"SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms.* – For purposes of this Act, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

- (O) BIO-HERBICIDE REFERS TO A SUBSTANCE USED IN THE CONTROL OF WEEDS WITHOUT ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS POSED BY OTHER SYNTHETIC COUNTERPARS. IT IS MADE UP OF MICROORGANISMS (E.G., BACTERIA, VIRUSES, FUNGI) AND OTHER MICROBES THAT POSSESS INVASIVE GENES THAT CAN ATTACK THE DEFENSE GENES OF SPECIFIC WEEDS THEREBY KILLING THEM.
- (P) BIO-PESTICIDE REFERS TO A CERTAIN TYPE OF PESTICIDE

 DERIVED FROM SUCH NATURAL MATERIALS AS ANIMALS,
 PLANTS, BACTERIA, AND CERTAIN MINERALS. IT INCLUDES

 NATURALLY OCCURRING SUBSTANCES THAT CONTROL PESTS

 BY NON-TOXIC MECHANISM THAT INTERFERE WITH MATING,
 AS WELL AS VARIOUS SCENTS OF PLANTS THAT ATTACT INSECT

 PESTS TO TRAPS. IT CAN ALSO INCLUDE MICROORGANISMS

 SUCH AS BACTERIUM, FUNGUS, VIRUS, OR PROTOOAL AS AN

 ACTIVE INGREDIENT.
