

# AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SAFETY INTERNET EDUCATION PROGRAM IN THE CURRICULUM OF ALL ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Article II, Section 13 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being."

The Internet links and connects millions of people's computers together globally. It is a massive networking infrastructure that forms a linkage wherein computers can communicate with each other provided that it is connected to the Internet. The Internet can enrich lives, provide information, entertainment, social networking, and connections to people all over the world. However, the Internet can be a cause of problems when people use it to do unscrupulous acts like cybersex, pornography, gambling, cyber bullying and among others. Students may develop a habit of overusing the Internet consequently interfering with their ability to keep up with school, relationships, and may have a negative effect on their mood.

The proposed bill seeks to establish a comprehensive program that will require a mandatory Internet safety education for all students in order to prevent the problems arising from the misuse of the internet and other new media by guiding students to properly use the Internet.


In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly requested.



# AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SAFETY INTERNET EDUCATION PROGRAM IN THE CURRICULUM OF ALL ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Internet Safety 2 Education Act" 3 Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. – For the purposes of this Act, the terms: 4 (A) "DepEd" means Department of Education 5 (B) Internet Safety Education Program" means an age-6 appropriate, research-based program that encourages safe, 7 8 ethical, and responsible use of the Internet, promotes an 9 informed, critical understanding of the internet, and educates 10 children and communities about how to prevent or respond to 11 problems or dangers related to the internet or new media; (C) "New Media" 12 13 (1) means emerging digital, computerized, or network 14 informed and communication technologies that often have interactive capacities; and 15 16 (2) includes e-mail, instant messaging, text messaging, 17 web sites, blogs, interactive gaming, social media, 18 cellphones, and mobile devices; and

1	(D) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Department of
2	Education.

4	Sec. 3. Implementing Agency and its duties. –
5	
6	(A) The DepEd shall:
7	(1) Identify, develop, and implement Internet Safety
8	education programs, including educational technology,
9	multimedia and interactive applications, online
10	resources, and lesson plans
11	(2) Provide professional training to elementary and
12	secondary teachers, administrators, and other staff on
13	Internet safety and new media literacy;
14	(3) Develop online risk prevention programs for children;
15	(4) Train and support peer-driven Internet Safety
16	education initiatives;
17	(5) Coordinate and fund research initiatives that
18	investigate online risks to children and Internet safety
19	education;
20	(6) Develop and implement public education campaigns to
21	promote awareness of online risks to children and
22	Internet safety education;
23	(7) Educate parents about teaching their children ho to
24	use the Internet and new media safely, responsibly,
25	and ethically and help parents indentify and protect
26	their children from risks relating to use of the Internet
27	and new media; or
28	(B) The DepEd Secretary shall, within sixty (60) days from the
29	effectivity of this Act, promulgate rules and regulations,
30	including those of disciplinary nature, to carry out and

1	enforce provisions of this Act. Further, the DepEd shall be the
2	lead agency in the carrying out the following: the Secretary
3	is hereby authorized and directed to adopt a system to
4	implement and carry out the provisions of this Act.
5	
6	Sec. 4. Appropriations To carry out the provisions of this Act, such
7	amount as may be necessary is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the
8	National Treasury. Thereafter, the amount necessary for the continuous
9	operation of this program shall be included in the annual appropriation of the
10	DepEd.
11	
12	Sec. 5. Separability Clause If any provision or section of this Act is held
13	invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions and sections not affected thereby
14	shall remain in full force and effect.
15	
16	Sec. 6. Repealing Clause All laws, presidential decrees, executive
17	orders, or issuances, or any part thereof which are inconsistent with the
18	provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
19	
20	Sec.7. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
21	publication in the Official Gazette or two (2) newspaper of general circulation.
