# AN ACT REGULATING THE USE OF PLASTIC BAGS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Recent research data from around the globe cites the Philippines as one of the top contributors of plastic wastes in the world's oceans. According to Ocean Conservancy, a non-profit organization based in the United States of America, the Philippines produces an average of 2.7 million metric tons of plastic wastes every year. It was also noted that bulk of plastic wastes in the country comes from local plastic consumption.

The bill seeks to address the growing threats of plastic pollution to the environment and wildlife. Regulating the use of plastic bags, and providing alternatives will surely help reduce tons of plastic wastes in the country.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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# AN ACT REGULATING THE USE OF PLASTIC BAGS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

	Congress assembled:
1	Section 1. State Policy The State shall advance the right of the people
2	to a balanced and healthful ecology, Towards this end, it is necessary to reduce
3	the environmental, public health, economic, and societal costs resulting from the
4	production, use, and discard of single-use plastic carryout bags thereby
5	minimizing land-based sources of pollution, and increasing efforts to protect
6	water quality.

8	Sec. 2. Definition of Terms For purposes of this Act, the following
9	definitions shall apply:
0	(a) "Department" means the Department of Environment and
1	Natural Resources,
2	(b) "Recycled paper bag" means a paper carryout bag provided by
.3	a store to a customer at the point of sale that meets all of the
4	following requirements:
5	(1) Contains a minimum of 40 percent postconsumer
6	recycled content;

1	(2) Accepted for recycling in curbside programs in a majority
2	of households that have access to curbside recycling
3	programs;
4	(3) Capable of composting.
5	(4) Printed on the bag the name of the manufacturer, the
6	location where the bag was manufactured, and the
7	percentage of postconsumer content.
8	(c) (1) Until a standard is established and enforceable by the
9	Department, "reusable, biodegradable bag" means a bag
10	that meets both of the following requirements:
11	(A) Designed and manufactured for at least 100
12	uses.
13	(B) Made of a washable material that does not
14	contain lead or any other heavy metal in a toxic
15	amount. as determined by the Department.
16	(2) By January 1, 2014, the Department shall establish
17	standards in regulations that define "reusable,
18	biodegradable bag," using the standards specified in
19	paragraph (1), and any additional durability, material
20	content, or labeling requirements. Labeling requirements
21	shall, at a minimum, require reusable, biodegradable bags
22	to be imprinted, in a manner sufficient to be identifiable
23	and readable, with both of the following:
24	(A) The name of the reusable, biodegradable bag
25	producer;
26	(B) The reusable, biodegradable bag seal or logo, as
27	determined by the Department, showing
28	compliance with the minimum standards.

13	(A) A bag provided by a pharmacy to a	customer

15	(B) A nonhandled bag used to protect a purch	ased item
16	from damaging or contaminating other	purchased
17	items when placed in a recycled paper	, bag or

19	(f) "Store" means a retail establishment that meets a	ny of the
20	following requirements: (1) Supermarkets and groce	ry stores;
21	(2) A retail space over 100 square meters that gener	ates sales
22	of retail goods; (3) A convenience food store, food r	nart, sari-
23	sari store or other entity engaged in the retail sale of	f a limited
24	line of goods that generally includes milk, bread, s	soda, and
25	snack foods.	
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27	Sec. 3. Carryout Bag Regulation	
28	(a) (1) On and after April 1, 2014, a store, as defined in	n paragraph 1
29	or 2 of subdivision (f) of Section 2, shall not provide	e a single-use
30	carryout bag to a customer at the poir	nt of sale.

(2) On and after July 1, 2014, a store, as defined in paragraph 1 1 2 or 2 of subdivision (I) of Section 2, shall only provide reusable, biodegradable bags, as defined by subdivision (c) of Section 2, 3 4 that meet the requirements of this chapter and standards 5 established by the Department. (b) A store shall make reusable, biodegradable bags available for 6 purchase by a customer. A store, as defined in paragraph 1 or 8 2 of subdivision (f) of Section 2, may provide reusable, 9 biodegradable bags to customers at no cost. (c) Notwithstanding the requirements of subdivision a, a store 10 shall make available for sale to a consumer at the point of sale 11 a recycled paper bag at a reasonable cost. 12 13 (d) Beginning July 1, 2014, a store as defined in paragraph 3 of 14 subdivision (f) of Section 2 shall comply with the provisions of 15 this article. 16 Sec. 4. Certification. -17 18 (a) On or after January 1,2015, and on or before January 1 every 19 two years thereafter, a reusable, biodegradable bag producer 20 that sells, distributes, or makes a reusable, biodegradable bag 21 available to a store shall submit a certification to the 22 Department that each reusable, biodegradable bag meets the 23 requirements of subdivision (c) of Section 2 and associated 24 standards issued by the Department. 25 (b) A reusable, biodegradable bag producer shall submit a fee to the Department with each certification pursuant to Section 2. 26 27 (c) The Department shall provide a system to submit certifications

online.

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(d) The Department shall publish a list on its Internet Web site

that includes: (1) The name, location, and appropriate contact

information of a reusable, biodegradable bag producer in compliance with this section. (2) The reusable, biodegradable bog product or products in compliance with this section.

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### Sec. 5. Certification Fees. -

Sec. 6. Inspection. -

(a) The Department may inspect and audit any entity subject to this chapter.

- (a) The fee for the initial certification by a reusable, biodegradable bag producer, as defined in subdivision (d) of Section 2, shall be as determined by the Department. In establishing the initial fee, consideration by the Department shall include, but not be limited to, if provided by a reusable, biodegradable bag producer, the annual sales revenue of a participating reusable, biodegradable bag producer, the number of its employees, and the number of reusable, biodegradable bag products to be submitted for certification by the such participating producer.
- (b) The fee for biennial certification thereafter shall be determined by the Department which shall include inspection and recertification. The Department may adjust the biennial certification fee, if the Department determines that additional fees are necessary to support implementation of this section, Notification of any fee increases shall be provided to certified producers and posted on the department's Internet Web site 60 days in advance of the fee increase.
- (c) The fees in this section shall not exceed the amount necessary to cover the Department's reasonable costs associated with the implementation of this chapter.

- 1 (b) On or after July 1, 2014, the Department may test any 2 reusable, biodegradable bag manufactured by a reusable, biodegradable bag producer and provided to a store for sale 3 4 or distribution for compliance with this chapter and associated 5 regulations. (c) (c) The Department may enter into an agreement with other 6 government agencies that conduct inspections to provide 8 necessary enforcement of this chapter. 9 10 Sec. 7. Violations. -(a) Any violation of Section 3 shall be subject to an administrative 11 12 penalty of a fine as assessed by the Department in an amoun1 13 not less than five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) for the first 14 violation. Subsequent violations may be increased by up to ten 15 thousand pesos (P 10,000.00) per violation, but not to exceed 16 one hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) per violation. 17 18
  - (b) Any violation of Section 4, or any submission of false or misleading information to the Department, shall be subject to an administrative penalty of a fine assessed by the department of up to fifty thousand pesos (P50,000.00) per violation, not to exceed an annual total of one hundred fifty thousand pesos (P150,000.00).
  - (c) The Department shall publish a list on its Internet Web site of any fines or penalties that have been levied against a violator of this section for failure to comply with the requirements of this chapter.

### Sec. 8. Reusable, Biodegradable Bag Account. -

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(a) The Department shall deposit all certification fees paid pursuant to this article into the Reusable, Biodegradable Bag

1	Account, which is hereby created in the Department. The
2	moneys deposited in the Reusable, Biodegradable Bag
3	Account shall be expended by the Department, upon
4	appropriation by the Congress, to assist the Department with
5	its costs of implementing this Act.
6	(b) The Department shall deposit all penalties and fines collected
7	pursuant to this article into the Penalty Subaccount, which is
8	hereby created in the Reusable, Biodegradable Bag Account,
9	and shall be expended by the Department, upon appropriation
10	by the Congress, to assist the Department with its costs of
11	implementing this Act.
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13	Sec. 9. Rules and Regulations The Department shall adopt rules and
14	regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this Act within ninety (90)
15	days from the effectivity thereof.
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17	Sec. 10. Repealing Clause All laws, executive orders, executive
18	issuances, rules and regulations or part thereof inconsistent or contrary to the
19	provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.
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21	Sec. 11. Separability Clause In case any provision of this Act is declared
22	unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not affected
23	thereby shall continue in full force and effect.
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25	Sec. 12. Effectivity This Act shall take effect thirty (30) days after its
26	publication in two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
