ESTABLISHING A CRISIS CENTER FOR STREET CHILDREN IN EVERY REGION OF THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Declaration of the Rights of the Child states that "the child, by reason of his physical and mental immaturity, needs special safeguards and care, including appropriate legal protection, before as well as after birth."

As stated by Senator Joseph Victor G. Ejercito when he filed this bill during the Seventeenth Congress, increasing poverty in the country's urban centers such as Metro Manila, Cebu and Davao is causing a corresponding rise in the number of street children. This observation is borne out by reports of the Department of Social Welfare and Development in every budget hearing about the status of street children in the country.

Clearly, there is an urgent need to protect those street children. The vulnerable children that roam our streets should be sheltered from circumstances which endanger their survival and normal development.

Our government's commitment when it signed the UN Convention of the Rights of the Child (CRC) and the World Declaration on Children's Survival, Protection and Development is to promote children's right. To fulfill such commitment, the proposed

commitment, the proposed bill seeks to establish Crisis Center in every region so that proper care and nutrition will be provided to them.

Let us build a protective environment for street children. Let us protect their well-being.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A CRISIS CENTER FOR STREET CHILDREN IN EVERY REGION OF THE PHILIPPINES, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- Section 1. *Title.* This Act shall be known as the "Street Children Crisis Center Act".
 - Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* It is hereby declared as policy of the State to defend the right of children to assistance, including the proper care and nutrition, and to provide them with special protection against all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation and other condition prejudicial to their development.
 - Sec. 3. *Coverage.* This Act shall cover all persons below eighteen (18) years of age and roaming in the streets without supervision of adults, whether parents, relatives or friends.
 - Sec. 4. *Program Framework.* There shall be a comprehensive program to be formulated by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), in coordination with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), to protect street children from circumstances which endanger their survival and normal development. Such program shall include but not limited to the following:
 - (a) Emergency medical and feeding program;
 - (b) Temporary shelter for street children who have been separated from their respective homes who have been staying in the streets;

| 21 | The local officials may call upon private and responsible volunteers of the |
| 22 | community to assist in the care of the street children by providing consultative services |
| 23 | for medical, educational and other needs of children. |
| 24 | Sec. 6. Functions of the Department of Social Welfare and Development. – The |
| 25 | Department shall: |
| 26 | (a) Formulate the criteria for the selection and qualification of street children |
| 27 | who shall be covered by this Act; |
| 28 | (b) Provide training for crisis center workers, counselors and other |
| 29 | volunteers; |
| 30 | (c) Coordinate activities of non-government organizations with the crisis |
| 31 | center workers and other social workers of the Department on order that |

| 19 | shall be allocated among the regional crisis centers nationwide. |
| 20 | Sec. 9. Separability Clause If any portion of this Act be declared |
| 21 | unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or any provision not affected thereby shall |
| 22 | remain in force and effect. |
| 23 | Sec. 10. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations |
| 24 | and executive orders contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or |
| 25 | modified accordingly. |
| 26 | Sec. 11. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its |
