## AN ACT INTEGRATING LABOR EDUCATION INTO SOCIAL SCIENCE SUBJECTS IN THE TERTIARY EDUCATION CURRICULUM AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Section 3, Article XIII of the 1987 Constitution declares that the State shall afford full protection to labor and promote full employment and equality of opportunities for all. However, a gap exists in terms of fostering knowledge and awareness of the different labor laws, rules and regulations. Based on Commission on Higher Education (CHED) Memorandum Order No. 20, series of 2013, labor education is not among the components of any of the core and elective General Education courses for undergraduate students. This is a cause for concern since college students will eventually be future members of the labor force. It is therefore imperative that college graduates must be equipped with the necessary knowledge of their rights, obligations, and benefits as employees.

This proposed measure seeks to strengthen the labor education in the country by integrating discussion thereon into Social Science subjects being offered under the mandatory general education curriculum at the tertiary level of education. Under this proposed measure, labor education that will be taught in the tertiary level shall include subjects relating to labor rights, workers' welfare and benefits, core labor standards, labor laws and regulations, the national arid global labor situation, labor market concerns, labor issues, overseas work and related problems, the nature of

human labor, the role of labor in the self-realization of the human being the foundations of the dignity of labor, and other topics related to labor and employment.

In view of the foregoing, early passage of this bill is earnestly sought.


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## AN ACT

## INTEGRATING LABOR EDUCATION INTO SOCIAL SCIENCE SUBJECTS IN THE TERTIARY EDUCATION CURRICULUM AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Labor Education Act".
  - Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy*. It is the policy of the State to protect the rights of workers, promote their welfare, their living and working conditions, and terms of employment. Towards this end, the State shall promote a mechanism to educate the youth on the rights and welfare of the workers and promote a society that is responsive and sensitive to the needs of the labor sector.
- Sec. 3. *Definition of Terms*. For purposes of this Act, the following terms shall mean:
- a) Labor education shall refer to the teaching of labor rights, workers' welfare and benefits, core labor standards, labor laws and regulations, the national and global labor situation, labor market concerns, labor issues, overseas work and related problems, the nature of human labor, the role of labor in

the self-realization of the human being, the foundations of the dignity of labor and other topics related to labor and employment.

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- b) Tertiary Education curriculum shall refer to the general education curriculum designed for students taking up courses leading to a degree.
- c) Social Science subjects shall refer to the subjects pertaining to the branches of science that deal with the institutions, functioning, and aspects of human society and with the inter-personal relationships of individuals as members of society.
- Sec. 4. Integration of Labor Education into the Social Science Subjects in the
  Tertiary Education Curriculum. Labor education shall be integrated into mandatory
  Social Science subjects offered under the general education curriculum at the
  tertiary level of education.
- Sec. 5. Development of Academic Program and Implementing Rules and Regulations. The Commission on Higher Education (CHED), pursuant to its mandate under Republic Act No. 7722, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1194", shall develop the program to execute and implement this Act. Further, the CHED shall formulate the rules and regulations necessary for the proper implementation of this Act.
- Sec. 6. *Appropriations Clause*. The amount necessary to implement the provisions of this Act shall be included in the general annual appropriations of the year when it is enacted into law.
- Sec. 7. Separability Clause. If any provision or part of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions that are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
- Sec. 8. *Repealing Clause*. All laws, orders, rules and regulations, or parts thereof that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby modified or repealed accordingly.

- Section 9. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
- 2 its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general
- 3 circulation.
