PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY OF SENATOR DRILON

Senator Drilon noted that earlier, the Chair mentioned that the first in the list of members nominated on the floor shall automatically become the vice chairman. Commenting thereon, he pointed



out that under the Rules, the designation of the vice chair is optional. He then requested a clarification of the rule insofar the designation of vice chairperson is concerned.

In reply, Senate President Sotto adverted to Section 18, Rule X of the Rules of the Senate, to wit:

"SEC. 18. The membership of the permanent committees, including their respective Chairmen, shall be chosen by the Senate. The Chairman of each committee may designate the Vice Chairman or such Vice Chairmen of his committee and create such subcommittees as may be deemed necessary."

Senate President Sotto agreed that the chairperson may or may not designate a vice chairperson and that if ever the chairperson decides to designate, he/she is not limited to one vice-chairman. But he recalled that it has been the practice before that the first name mentioned in the list is usually the vice chair, unless another is manifested by the committee chair himself/herself.

As to whether a chairperson can manifest his or her choice of vice chairperson, or manifest that he or she does not need any, Senator Zubiri affirmed that both scenarios are possible. He agreed that there is no limit on the number of vice chairpersons that could be designated, unlike the Rules of the House of Representatives which is specific in the number of vice chairpersons of a committee.

PROPOSED SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 23

Upon motion of Senator Zubiri, there being no objection, the Body considered Proposed Senate Resolution No. 23, entitled

RESOLUTION HONORING THE SERVICE AND CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE LATE MAJOR GENERAL JOSE V. BALAJADIA, JR. AFP (RETIRED), SERGEANT-AT-ARMS, SENATE OF THE PHILIPPINES.

With the permission of the Body, only the title of the resolution was read without prejudice to the insertion of its full text into the Record of the Senate.

Thereupon, the Chair recognized Senator Gordon for the sponsorship.

SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF SENATOR GORDON

Senator Gordon presented for plenary consideration Proposed Senate Resolution No. 23 which honors the service and contributions of former Senate Sergeant-at-Arms, Major General Jose Villaruz Balajadia, Jr. (Ret.) who died at the age of 75 years old.

(Along with Senator Gordon's sponsorship speech was a presentation showing General Balajadia's service, achievements and contributions not only as Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate but as soldier and civil servant par excellence.)

Senator Gordon narrated General Balajadia's — or Badjao's—beginnings, from the time he was born in Baguio on November 23, 1943, to his attendance to the Saint Louis University as an Electrical Engineering student until he decided to become a reserve pilot during his sophomore year.

Senator Gordon said that the young Balajadia formally started his military pilot training at the Philippine Air Force Flying School in Fernando Air Base, Lipa City from 1962 to 1972 where he earned his air crew badge; FAM course for F-86 Sabre which was the most modern jet fighter aircraft at that time; jet qualification training; advanced combat training; combat crew training; and aircraft maintenance officer course. He said that then reservist Balajadia never lost sight of the fact that he had to be educated to pursue a career and move ahead; thus, he studied and earned BSE Aviation and AB English degrees from Basa Air Base College in Pampanga, completed a master's degree in Business Administration from De La Salle Graduate School of Business, and studied again at the Civil Aviation Training Center in 1994.

Senator Gordon said that General Balajadia was able to rise through the ranks from being a reservist to a Second Lieutenant in 1964 and Major General on September 28, 1998.

Back when the country's air force was at its golden age, when F-86 squadrons would be sent to other countries as part of the peacekeeping forces, Senator Gordon recalled that the quiet, dignified but very friendly General Balajadia was at one time commander of the 6th Tactical Fighters Squadron of the Philippine Air Force from 1976 to 1978 and was, in fact, team leader of the highly esteemed Blue Diamonds of the Philippine Air Force Aerobatic



Group that performed very serious acrobatic drills with F-86 and F-5 jets.

Senator Gordon said that General Balajadia held a premier position as deputy commander of the Armed Forces of the Philippines' Southern Command in Zamboanga until he became an executive officer of the Clark Air Base Command under the US Air Force, and officer-in-charge of Rescue and Relief Operations at Clark Air Base during the 1991 Mt. Pinatubo eruption. He remembered General Balajadia as a true humanitarian who was always willing to help during huge disasters like the cataclysmic eruption of Mt. Pinatubo and the major earthquake that hit Baguio City.

Moreover, Senator Gordon stated that General Balajadia became the wing commander of the 600th Air Base Wing in Clark and commander of the Air Reserve Command from 1995 to 1998, and deputy chief-of-staff for Reservist and Retiree Affairs from 1998 to 1999. He said that "Badjao" certainly served the country well as proven by the medals given to him: two Silver Wing medals for meritorious achievement while performing an aerial flight and a single act of merit for participating in sustained operations activities against the enemy while in an aerial flight mode; Distinguished Service Star — the third highest military award - in 1993 in recognition of eminently meritorious and valuable service rendered while holding a position of great responsibility; two Gawad sa Kaunlaran awards from the Armed Forces of the Philippines — considered the second highest distinction award presented by the Armed Forces of the Philippines to civilians and government officials; three Bronze Cross medals for heroism in risking life either for voluntary action in the face of great danger above and beyond the call of duty or two other deeds evidenced by extraordinary bravery not involving direct combat with the enemy; seven military merit medals; two Military Commendation Medals (MCM) for his exemplary execution of military duty; four military civic action medals from 1973 to 1993; award for meritorious achievement in the conduct of humanitarian civic actions in direct support of military operations; Kahusayan award; Mutual Defense Award; February 1986 Revolution Ribbon bestowed upon all officers and enlisted personnel in the AFP and PNP in recognition of their professionalism and dedication to duty as well as their contribution to the preservation of democracy and peace; AFP Combat Badge (Kagitingan) awarded by the commanding general of the Philippine Army to Philippine Army officers and enlisted personnel who commanded combat and combat support units for at least one cumulative year; and many other awards.

(At this juncture, Senate President Sotto relinquished the Chair to Senate President Pro Tempore Recto.)

Acknowledging General Balajadia's distinguished professional career, Senator Gordon said that the General's career did not end with his retirement from the military as he went on to earn another great achievement when he was appointed Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate by Senate President Drilon and four other Senate Presidents — Villar, Enrile, Pimentel III and Sotto.

He lauded General Balajadia for being instrumental in keeping the discipline, security and enforcement of the law in the Senate as Sergeant-at-Arms, adding that the Senate never had a problem with security because of his great listening skills which made him an effective leader.

Senator Gordon likewise expressed great pleasure and comfort for having General Balajadia and his staff watch his back during the Blue Ribbon Committee hearings involving tough, powerful and influential people involved in criminal organizations and commended him for protecting the senators during the impeachment trial of former Chief Justice Renato Corona, and even during the arrest of Senator Leila De Lima—a kind of service which General Balajadia did with much equanimity. He added that General Balajadia was proud of and he was a darling of the media.

He said that General Balajadia was also instrumental in ensuring the safekeeping of Bureau of Immigration Commissioner Al Argosino and Michael Robles who were jailed for contempt, and for safeguarding the Senate during the temporary detention of Nicanor Faeldon, Kenneth Dong, Mark Taguba, Wally Sombero, and Marina Signapan, among others.

Senator Gordon said that on top of General Balajadia's kindness, he did his job extremely well as he always secured the Senate from bomb threats.

He expressed certainty that the new Senate Sergeant-at-Arms, Major General Rene Samonte, would likewise take care of everyone in the Senate.

Amid all of his capabilities, accomplishments, professionalism, and humanitarian feats, Senator



Gordon said that General Balajadia was a true Christian, a good and dutiful husband to Thelma, his wife of 50 years, and a loving father to Rey Jose, Maria Araceli, Maria Cristina, Maria Isabel, and Jonathan, whose 50-year inspiring love story with his wife Thelma was featured in 2018 as part of the CNN Philippines' Valentine Special. He noted that the late General had the essentials to a happy and successful relationship particularly since his wife managed to keep him in high gear.

Senator Gordon also considered General Balajadia as a simple and humble man, who never left his old Fairview residence and only shared in the use of his son's car, who never abused his prerogatives even while serving as a commander in the air force, as well as for being firm and fair while being a kind and approachable gentleman.

Aside from commending the late general for his 38 years of service to the country as part of the uniformed personnel and as a support staff to the senators, Senator Gordon said that he even thought of asking Senate President Sotto to put the flag at half-mast in his honor.

Senator Gordon said that he admired General Balajadia more because even as he was suffering from prostate cancer, he never complained, never failing to greet him and take time to talk to him about work in the Senate and the country's state of affairs.

He said that the resolution was the Senate's way of thanking and exalting the late General who, as a professional in his military and civic duties as well as great family man and a compassionate, caring and humanitarian individual, ought to be emulated by the senators and staff alike.

ALL SENATORS AS COAUTHORS

Senator Zubiri manifested that all senators were coauthors of Proposed Senate Resolution No. 23.
