AN ACT GRANTING NIGHT SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL PAY TO THE GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES INCLUDING THOSE IN GOVERNMENT-OWNED OR -CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Government employees under Salary Grade 1 to Salary Grade 24, including those in 2 3 government-owned or -controlled corporations, whether 4 their nature of employment is permanent, contractual, 5 temporary, or casual, shall be paid night shift differential at a rate not exceeding twenty percent (20%) of the hourly 6 7 basic rate of the employee as determined by the head of the 8 agency for each hour of work performed between the hours

- 1 of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. of the following day: Provided,
- 2 That the night shift differential pay provided under this
- 3 Act shall be in addition to, and shall not in any way
- 4 diminish whatever benefits and allowances being presently
- 5 enjoyed by the government employees.
- 6 Hourly basic rate refers to basic salary rate per hour
- 7 derived by dividing the basic monthly rate by twenty-two
- 8 (22) working days and dividing the quotient derived by
- 9 eight (8) hours.
- 10 SEC. 2. The following government employees are not
- 11 covered by this Act:
- 12 (a) Government employees whose schedule of office
- 13 hours fall between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Services rendered
- 14 beyond the regular eight hour work schedules are paid
- 15 overtime pay in accordance with existing laws, rules and
- 16 regulations; and
- 17 (b) Government employees whose services are
- 18 required, or are on call, twenty-four (24) hours a day such
- 19 as uniformed personnel of the Armed Forces of the
- 20 Philippines (AFP), the Philippine National Police (PNP),

- 1 the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP), the
- 2 Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), and other similarly
- 3 situated, as may be determined by the Civil Service
- 4 Commission (CSC) and the Department of Budget and
- 5 Management (DBM).
- 6 SEC. 3. The Civil Service Commission (CSC), in
- 7 coordination with the Department of Budget and
- 8 Management (DBM), shall promulgate the necessary rules
- 9 and regulations for the effective implementation of this
- 10 Act.
- 11 SEC 4. The amount necessary for the effective
- 12 implementation of this Act shall be funded as follows:
- 13 (a) For the national government entities, the initial
- 14 amount shall be charged against existing appropriations
- 15 for the purpose of departments, bureaus, offices, and
- 16 agencies concerned. Thereafter, such sum as maybe
- 17 necessary for the continuous implementation of this Act
- 18 shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act
- 19 (GAA);

1	(b) For local government units, the amount shall be
2	charged against their respective funds; and
3	(c) For government-owned or -controlled corporations
4	and their subsidiaries, the amount shall come from their
5	respective corporate funds.
6	SEC. 5. Separability Clause If any provision or part
7	hereof, is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of
8	the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall
9	remain valid and subsisting.
10	SEC. 6. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential
11	decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction,
12	administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to, or
13	inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby
14	repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
15	SEC. 7. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect
16	fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2)
