AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10068, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE ACT OF 2010

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Organic Agriculture Act of 2010 or Republic Act No. 10068 is the landmark legislation aimed at the promotion of organic agriculture in the Philippines. Specifically, it seeks to promote ecologically-sound, socially acceptable, economically viable and technically feasible production of food and other fibers. RA 10068 institutionalized our country's movement towards developing organic agriculture as a farming scheme that would guarantee food and environmental safety while enhancing global competitiveness.

This proposed measure seeks to amend RA 10068 to further strengthen sustainable agriculture. More importantly, this proposed amendment seeks to enhance the support that we give small organic farmers.

Participatory Guarantee System (PGS) is a community-oriented certification system that encourages climate-friendly agri-produce smallholders to form a network of producers, consumers and other stakeholders¹. It hopes to build a credible certification system following the International Federation of Organic Agriculture Movement (IFOAM) Standards and Guidelines. Through the institutionalization of the


PGS, farmers and their communities are empowered. Small farmers will be able to produce and sell organic food and products without the fear of being persecuted. It is our aim that when small organic farmers are empowered, broader societal objectives are also achieved, i.e. food security, poverty alleviation, use of biodiversity, equity, safety, rural development, among others.

For the recognition of farmers' rights and promotion of their welfare, consideration of this bill is earnestly sought.

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AN ACT

AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10068, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE ACT OF 2010

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 10068, otherwise known as "An Act Providing for the Development and Promotion of Organic Agriculture in the Philippines and for Other Purposes", is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy. — It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote, propagate, develop further and implement the practice of organic **FARMING AND OTHER SUSTAINABLE** agriculture **PRACTICES** in the Philippines that will cumulatively condition and enrich the fertility of the soil, increase farm productivity **AND FARMERS' INCOMES**, reduce pollution and destruction of the environment, prevent the depletion of natural resources, further protect the health of farmers, consumers, and the general public, [and] save on imported farm inputs **AND PROMOTE FOOD SELF-SUFFICIENCY.** Towards this end, a comprehensive program for the promotion of community-based organic agriculture systems, which include, among others, farmer-produced purely organic fertilizers such as compost. [pesticides] **BIO-PESTICIDES** and other farm inputs, together with a nationwide

1	educational and promotional campaign for their use and processingl,]

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Sec. 6. Section 10 of Republic Act No. 10068 is hereby repealed and a new Section 10 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

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THE BUREAU OF AGRICULTURE AND 10. FISHERIES PRODUCT STANDARDS (BAFPS) OF THE DA. - THE BAFPS OF THE DA SHALL BE STRENGTHENED AND EMPOWERED IN TERMS OF ESTABLISHING FUNCTIONAL DIVISIONS AND INCREMENTAL STAFFING TO SERVE AS THE NATIONAL TECHNICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARIAT OF THE NOAB WITH THE MEMBER AGENCIES PROVIDING ADDITIONAL STAFF AS THE NEED ARISES. THE BAFS SHALL ALSO BE TASKED TO FORMULATE GUIDELINES IN THE RECOGNITION OF ORGANIC CERTIFYING BODIES (OCB) AND PGS GROUPS, AND RULES AND REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ACT AND NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL STANDARDS.

TOWARDS THIS END, THE ALREADY ESTABLISHED FUNCTIONAL DIVISION FOR ORGANIC AGRICULTURE WITHIN BAFPS SHALL BE FURTHER STRENGTHENED AND EMPOWERED TO PERFORM AS THE DESIGNATING-AUTHORITY FOR THE RECOGNITION OF ORGANIC CERTIFYING BODIES (OCB) AND PARTICIPATORY GUARANTEE SYSTEM (PGS) GROUPS: PROVIDED, THAT THE REGIONAL FIELD OFFICES OF THE DA SHALL IMPLEMENT THE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PROGRAM IN THE REGIONS PURSUANT TO THE NATIONAL ORGANIC FARMING/AGRICULTURE PROGRAM COORDINATED AND ADMINISTERED BY THE BAFPS."

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(c) mislabels or claims that the product is organic when it is not in accordance with the existing standards for Philippine organic agriculture or this Act shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment of not less than one (1) month nor more than six (6) months, or a fine of no more than Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000), or both, at the discretion of the court. If the offender is a corporation or a juridical entity, the official who ordered or allowed the commission of the offense shall be punished with the same penalty. If the offender is in the government service, he shall, in addition, be dismissed from office: *PROVIDED*, THAT ANY PGS FOUND TO HAVE ISSUED A CERTIFICATION TO A FARM OR PRODUCER ESTABLISHED TO BE OT IN COMPLIANCE WITH ANY OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL STANDARDS ON ORGANIC AGRICULTURE, SHALL BE PENALIZED AS FOLLOWS:

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- 1. FIRST OFFENSE, WRITTEN WARNING;
- 2. SECOND OFFENSE, SUSPENSION OF RECOGNITION."
