

**AN ACT  
AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10068, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE  
ORGANIC AGRICULTURE ACT OF 2010**

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Organic Agriculture Act of 2010 or Republic Act No. 10068 is the landmark legislation aimed at the promotion of organic agriculture in the Philippines. Specifically, it seeks to promote ecologically-sound, socially acceptable, economically viable and technically feasible production of food and other fibers. RA 10068 institutionalized our country's movement towards developing organic agriculture as a farming scheme that would guarantee food and environmental safety while enhancing global competitiveness.

This proposed measure seeks to amend RA 10068 to further strengthen sustainable agriculture. More importantly, this proposed amendment seeks to enhance the support that we give small organic farmers.


Participatory Guarantee System (PGS) is a community-oriented certification system that encourages climate-friendly agri-produce smallholders to form a network of producers, consumers and other stakeholders<sup>1</sup>. It hopes to build a credible certification system following the International Federation of Organic Agriculture Movement (IFOAM) Standards and Guidelines. Through the institutionalization of the

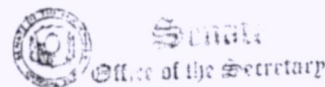

PGS, farmers and their communities are empowered. Small farmers will be able to produce and sell organic food and products without the fear of being persecuted. It is our aim that when small organic farmers are empowered, broader societal objectives are also achieved, i.e. food security, poverty alleviation, use of biodiversity, equity, safety, rural development, among others.

For the recognition of farmers' rights and promotion of their welfare, consideration of this bill is earnestly sought.

**AN ACT**  
**AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10068, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE**  
**ORGANIC AGRICULTURE ACT OF 2010**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 10068, otherwise known as "An Act  
2 Providing for the Development and Promotion of Organic Agriculture in the Philippines  
3 and for Other Purposes", is hereby amended to read as follows:

4  
5 "Sec. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* – It is hereby declared the policy of  
6 the State to promote, propagate, develop further and implement the  
7 practice of organic **FARMING AND OTHER SUSTAINABLE** agriculture  
8 **PRACTICES** in the Philippines that will cumulatively condition and enrich  
9 the fertility of the soil, increase farm productivity **AND FARMERS'**  
10 **INCOMES**, reduce pollution and destruction of the environment, prevent  
11 the depletion of natural resources, further protect the health of farmers,  
12 consumers, and the general public, [~~and~~] save on imported farm inputs  
13 **AND PROMOTE FOOD SELF-SUFFICIENCY.** Towards this end, a  
14 comprehensive program for the promotion of community-based organic  
15 agriculture systems, which include, among others, farmer-produced  
16 purely organic fertilizers such as compost. [~~pesticides~~] **BIO-**  
17 **PESTICIDES** and other farm inputs, together with a nationwide

1 educational and promotional campaign for their use and processing[,]  
2 **SHALL BE ESTABLISHED.**

3  
4 **LIKewise, A NATIONWIDE EDUCATIONAL AND AWARENESS**  
5 **CAMPAIGN AMONG CONSUMERS ON THE BENEFITS OF**  
6 **CONSUMING ORGANIC PRODUCTS TO BOOST LOCAL**  
7 **PRODUCTION OF ORGANIC FOOD AND NON-FOOD PRODUCTS,**  
8 as well as adoption of organic agricultural system as a viable alternative  
9 shall be undertaken.

13 Sec. 2. Sec. 3 of Republic Act No. 10068 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14  
15 "Sec. 3. *Definition of Terms.* – For Purposes of this Act, the  
16 following terms shall be defined as follows:

20 (o) **BIO-HERBICIDE** REFERS TO SUBSTANCE USED IN THE  
21 CONTROL OF WEEDS WITHOUT ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS  
22 POSED BY OTHER SYNTHETIC COUNTERPARTS. IT IS MADE UP  
23 OF MICROORGANISMS (E.G. BACTERIA, VIRUSES, FUNGI) AND  
24 OTHER MICROBES THAT POSSESS INVASIVE GENES THAT CAN  
25 ATTACK THE DEFENSE GENES OF SPECIFIC WEEDS THEREBY  
26 KILLING THEM.

27  
28 (P) **BIO-PESTICIDE** REFERS TO A CERTAIN TYPE OF PESTICIDE  
29 DERIVED FROM SUCH NATURAL MATERIALS AS ANIMALS,  
30 PLANTS, BACTERIA, AND CERTAIN MINERALS. IT INCLUDES  
31 NATURALLY OCCURING SUBSTANCES THAT CONTROL PESTS BY  
32 NON-TOXIC MECHANISM THAT INTERFERE WITH MATING, AS

1 WELL AS VARIOUS SCENTS OF PLNTS THAT ATTRACT INSECT  
2 PESTS TO TRAPS. IT CAN ALSI INCLUDE MICRO ORGANISMS  
3 SUCH AS BACTERIUM, FUNGUS, VIRUS OR PROTOZOAL AS AN  
4 ACTIVE INGREDIENT.

5  
6 **(Q) *PARTICIPATORY GUARANTEE SYSTEM (PGS)*** REFERS TO  
7 LOCALLY FOCUSED QUALITY ASSURANCE SYSTEMS DEVELOPED  
8 AND PRACTICED BY PEOPLE WHO ARE ACTUALLY ENGAGED IN  
9 ORGANIC AGRICULTURE. IT IS USED TO CERTIFY PRODUCERS  
10 AND FARMERS AS ACTUAL AND ACTIVE PRACTITIONERS OF  
11 ORGANIC AGRICULTURE, AND IS BUILT ON A FOUNDATION OF  
12 TRUST, SOCIAL NETWORK AND KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE.

13  
14 IT SHALL ALSO REFER TO AN ORGANIZATION OR ASSOCIATION  
15 THAT ADOPTS THIS KIND OF SYSTEM.

16  
17 **(R) *PARTICIPATORY ORGANIC CERTIFICATION*** REFERS TO A  
18 DOCUMENTARY PROOF THAT A PERSON/ENTITY IS COMPLIANT  
19 WITH THE REQUIREMENTS, STANDARDS AND NORMS OF  
20 ORGANIC FARMING/AGRICULTURE.

21  
22 **(S) *RECOGNITION*** REFERS TO AN AUTHORIZATION PROVIDED  
23 BY THE GOVERNMENT TO ORGANIC CERTIFYING BODY OR  
24 PARTICIPATORY GUARANTEE SYSTEM GROUP TO PERFORM  
25 CERTIFICATION AND INSPECTION ACTIVITIES.

26  
27 **(T) *SMALL FARMERS*** REFER TO THOSE CULTIVATING NOT MORE  
28 THAN FIVE (5) HECTARES OF LAND AND/OR THOSE ENGAGED  
29 AS POULTRY/LIVESTOCK RAISERS WITH NOT MORE THAN THE  
30 FOLLOWING:

- 31 • POULTRY – 1,000 POULTRY LAYERS OR 5,000 BROILERS
- 32 • SWINE – 10 SOW LEVEL OR 20 FATTENERS

- 1           • **NATIVE PIGS – 30 HEADS**
- 2           • **CATTLE – 10 FATTENERS OR 5 BREEDERS**
- 3           • **DAIRY – 10 MILKING COWS**
- 4           • **GOAT – 50 HEADS**

6           **(U) AGRIBUSINESS REFERS TO AGRICULTURE-RELATED**  
7           **ACTIVITIES THAT PUT FARMERS, PROCESSORS,**  
8           **DISTRIBUTORS AND CONSUMERS WITHIN A SYSTEM THAT**  
9           **PRODUCES, PROCESSES, TRANSPORTS, MARKETS AND**  
10           **DISTRIBUTES AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.”**

12           Sec. 3. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 10068 is hereby amended to read as  
13 follows:

20           organizations. These representatives must **REPRESENT FARMERS'**  
21           **ORGANIZATIONS AT LEAST FROM THE PROVINCIAL LEVEL,**  
22           **ACTUALLY AND ACTIVELY PRACTICING, PROMOTING ORGANIC**  
23           **AND OTHER SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE PRACTICES,** be  
24           conversant in organic agriculture and committed to the policies and  
25           programs provided under this Act. **THE THREE SEATS GIVEN TO**  
26           **SMALL FARMERS SHALL BE CHOSEN FROM THE LIVESTOCK AND**  
27           **CROP SECTORS, WHICH WILL HAVE ONE (1) AND TWO (2)**  
28           **SEATS RESPECTIVELY.**

32           Sec. 5. Section 8 is hereby amended to read as follows:

1                   "SEC. 8. *Organization of the NOAB.* –

5                   The Chairperson shall call the members of the NOAB, or a  
6                   majority thereof if not all have been designated, to a meeting to organize  
7                   themselves and prescribe its rules and procedures for the attainment of  
8                   the objectives of this Act. A majority of all members of the NOAB shall  
9                   constitute a quorum. **THE MEMBERS OF THE NOAB SHALL MEET AT  
10                  LEAST ONCE EVERY QUARTER AFTER ITS CONSTITUTION.**

15                  Section 10 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

18                  ***FISHERIES PRODUCT STANDARDS (BAFPS) OF THE DA.* – THE**  
19                  **BAFPS OF THE DA SHALL BE STRENGTHENED AND EMPOWERED**  
20                  **IN TERMS OF ESTABLISHING FUNCTIONAL DIVISIONS AND**  
21                  **INCREMENTAL STAFFING TO SERVE AS THE NATIONAL**  
22                  **TECHNICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARIAT OF THE NOAB**

6 BODIES (OCB) AND PGS GROUPS, AND RULES AND  
7 REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ACT AND  
8 NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL STANDARDS.

9  
10 TOWARDS THIS END, THE ALREADY ESTABLISHED  
11 FUNCTIONAL DIVISION FOR ORGANIC AGRICULTURE WITHIN  
12 BAFPS SHALL BE FURTHER STRENGTHENED AND EMPOWERED  
13 TO PERFORM AS THE DESIGNATING-AUTHORITY FOR THE  
14 RECOGNITION OF ORGANIC CERTIFYING BODIES (OCB) AND  
15 PARTICIPATORY GUARANTEE SYSTEM (PGS) GROUPS:  
16 *PROVIDED*, THAT THE REGIONAL FIELD OFFICES OF THE DA  
17 SHALL IMPLEMENT THE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PROGRAM IN  
18 THE REGIONS PURSUANT TO THE NATIONAL ORGANIC  
19 FARMING/AGRICULTURE PROGRAM COORDINATED AND  
20 ADMINISTERED BY THE BAFPS."

21  
22 Sec. 7. A new section is hereby inserted after Section 10 of Republic Act No.

22 FARMERS WHO DO NOT COMPLY WITH  
23 STANDARDS, WHOSE ACTIONS SHALL BE  
24 RECORDED IN A DATA BASE OR MADE  
25 PUBLIC IN A CERTAIN MANNER.

26 B. *REGISTRATION.* A PGS SHALL BE REGISTERED WITH THE  
27 BAFPS ONLY IF IT HAS AT LEAST FIVE (5) MEMBERS,  
28 COMING FROM DIFFERENT FARMS IN THE LOCALITY AND  
29 WHO ARE ACTUALLY PRACTICING ORGANIC  
30 AGRICULTURE. THE BAFPS SHALL PROVIDE THE  
31 GUIDELINES FOR SUCH REGISTRATION.

1 THE BAFPS SHALL ISSUE ITS DECISION ON THE  
2 APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION BY A PGS WITHIN  
3 FIFTEEN (15) DAYS FROM THE SUBMISSION OF THE  
4 COMPLETE REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION FOR  
5 REGISTRATION, AND FAILURE TO RENDER DECISIO  
6 WITHIN SUCH PERIOD SHALL BE UNDERSTOOD AS AN  
7 APPROVAL OF THE APPLICATION FOR RAGISTRAION OF  
8 THE PGS. THE BAFPS SHALL NOT CHARGE ANY  
9 REGISTRATION OR APPLICATION FEES.

10  
11 UPON APPROVAL OF ITS APPLICATION FOR  
12 REGISTRATION WITH THE BAFPS, A PGS MAY BEGIN TO  
13 OPERATE ONCE IT IS RECOGNIZED BY THE SANGGUNIAN  
14 PAMBAYAN OR PANLUNGSOD.

15 **C. ORGANIZATIONAL LEVELS.**

16 1. *THE CORE PGS.* EVERY PGS SHOULD HAVE AT LEAST  
17 FIVE (5) MEMBERS, COMPOSED OF FARMERS FROM  
18 EITHER THE CROPS OR LIVESTOCK SECTORS OR A  
19 COMBINATION OF BOTH SECTORS, AND WHO ALL LIVE  
20 IN THE SAME MUNICIPALITY OR CITY AND  
21 REGULARLY INTERACT WITH EACH OTHER. EACH  
22 CORE PGS WILL HAVE THE FOLLOWING DUTIES AND  
23 RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 24 i. DEVELOP AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE  
25 ORGANIC STANDARDS;  
26 ii. MAKE SURE FARM PRACTICES ARE  
27 COMPLIANT;  
28 iii. MAKE A PLEDGE THAT THEY UNDERSTAND  
29 AND ADHERE TO THE ORGANIC  
30 STANDARDS;  
31 iv. PARTICIPATE IN  
32 APPRAISALS/INSPECTIONS OF MEMBER

1 FARM. AT LEAST MAJORITY OF THE  
2 MEMBERS OF THE CORE GROUP SHOULD  
3 BE PRESENT TO SIGN ON THE  
4 TRUTHFULNESS OF THE FINDINGS OF THE  
5 APPRAISAL/INSPECTION;

6 v. INITIATE KEY FIELD TRAININGS FOR  
7 FARMER-MEMBERS AND RESIDENTS IN  
8 THEIR LOCALITY TO PROMOTE ORGANIC  
9 AGRICULTURE;

10 vi. ATTEND MUNICIPAL/PROVINCIAL PGS  
11 MEETINGS AND SHARE INFORMATION;

12 vii. RECOMMEND WHICH FARMS WILL BE  
13 CERTIFIED;

14 viii. TAKE ACTIONS ON DEFAULTS/NON-  
15 COMPLIANCE AS PER SANCTION  
16 GUIDELINES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE  
17 BAFPS AND MUNICIPAL/CITY PGS; AND

18 ix. ASSIST DEFAULTING AND NON-  
19 COMPLIANT MEMBERS TO REGAIN  
20 CERTIFICATION STATUS.

21 2. *MUNICIPAL / CITY PGS.* THE MUNICIPAL/CITY PGS  
22 SHALL BE COMPOSED OF THE FOLLOWING: 1.  
23 MUNICIPAL/CITY AGRICULTURAL OFFICER; 2) ONE

1 VI. MAINTAIN A REGISTRY OF CORE PGS  
2 OPERATING WITHIN ITS AREA OF  
3 JURISDICTION, WHICH SHALL BE  
4 FORWARDED TO THE BAFPS FOR THE  
5 LATTER'S NATIONAL DATA BASE;

6 VII. ISSUE PARTICIPATORY ORGANIC  
7 CERTIFICATION AND THE "PGS  
8 GUARANTEED ORGANIC"  
9 LABEL/MARK TO COMPLIANT CORE  
10 PGS, AFTER BEING BESTOWED ITSELF  
11 WITH RECOGNITION BY THE BAFPS.

12 3. *PROVINCIAL AND NATIONAL PGS.* IT SHALL BE THE  
13 OPTION OF THE PGS TO FORM THEIR AGGRUPATION  
14 AT THE PROVINCIAL AND NATIONAL LEVELS. THEY  
15 SHALL RECEIVE THE ASSISTANCE, SUPPORT AND
