AN ACT

PROVIDING SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS TO STUDENTS ENROLLING IN TEACHER EDUCATION AND PROVIDING INCENTIVES FOR TEACHING IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

EXPLANATORY NOTE

A UNESCO report recently elucidated on how the Philippines failed to reach its Year 2015 targets on the Millennium Development Goals of Education for All. One of the goals set is for our country to Improve on the Quality of our Education. It simplifies the four (4) strategies to achieve this, one of which is to overcome the inequalities in learning by allocating the best teachers to the most challenging parts of our country. Thus, this bill seeks to respond to the need to provide more teachers in the rural areas where there is seemingly a dearth in good teachers that arises in the inequality of the quality of education of our learners, especially in the public school.

It is envisioned that by establishing a scholarship program for deserving students who want to pursue a career in teacher education, the government shall be developing highly qualified educators to serve in the remote rural areas of our country. The incentive is for the student to acquire a four-year full-time scholarship and the security of an employment upon graduation. In view of the urgent need to be able to accomplish the MDGs, though belatedly, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Teacher
 Education Scholarship Program of 2019".

3 SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* - It is the policy of the State to give 4 priority to education, science and technology, arts, culture, and sports to 5 foster patriotism and nationalism, accelerate social progress, and 6 promote total human liberation and development. Towards this end, the 7 State shall continue to develop programs that will encourage the youth to 8 pursue an education in teaching and provide them with opportunities for 9 employment by serving their countrymen as rural teachers.

10 SEC. 3. *General Objectives.* - A scholarship program shall be 11 offered to deserving students pursuing a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of 12 Science in Education degree or training in teacher education to provide said 13 students with incentives to pursue a teaching career in their home regions or in 14 other rural areas.

15 SEC 4. *Scholarship Program* - This Act envisions a four-year 16 full-time Teacher Education Scholarship Program, hereinafter referred to as the Program, to be offered to deserving students, based on meritocracy for those eligible, who will take up teacher education or Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in Education, or any other teacher training program or course under Republic Act No. 7836, otherwise known as the "*Philippine Teachers Professionalization Act of 1994.*"

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6 The graduates of the Program shall render services and be 7 integrated into any public school in their home region or other rural 8 public elementary or secondary school in the Philippines as provided for under 9 Section 6 of this Act.

SEC. 5. Eligibility and Qualifications. - Without prejudice to the 10 minimum requirements set forth in Republic Act No. 10687 or the Unified 11 Student Financial Assistance System for Tertiary Education (UniFAST) Act, there 12 shall be an annual selection through appropriate examinations and screening 13 processes of those who shall be admitted to the Program. The candidates shall 14 secondary graduates, gualified chosen from among be 15 whether from the private or public high schools. The qualified and 16 selected scholars shall be granted scholarship to enroll in a teacher 17 for matriculation and other course expenses education covering 18 school fees, prescribed textbooks, supplies and equipment, clothing and 19 uniform allowances, and other related miscellaneous expense. 20

At least ten (10) candidates per province shall be chosen to participate in the Program every year.

An applicant whose family's combined gross income falls below the 23 official poverty threshold as determined by the National Economic and 24 Development Authority or those whose parent is a barangay worker, 25 of employee, or а member an indigenous government 26 cultural community shall be given priority in the selection. 27

SEC. 6. *General Conditions for Admission to the Scholarship.* - A teacher education scholar shall be accepted to the Program and shall receive and continue to enjoy the benefits of the scholarship until the completion of the course, subject to the following conditions:

32 a) The scholar shall pass the entrance or admission 33 examinations and related requirements of the school where the scholar

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1 intends to enroll;

b) The scholar shall carry the full load of subjects prescribed
per semester and shall, under no circumstance, drop a course which will
result in under-loading;

5 c) The scholar may be allowed, for valid reasons, to defer 6 enrollment and of availing of the scholarship for a period not exceeding 7 one school year;

d) Upon completion of the course and other relevant training, the scholar shall agree to teach in any public elementary or secondary school in the scholar's home region or in any rural public school for a period of at least five (5) years;

e) The scholar shall repay the full cost of the scholarship and related benefits received in the event of the scholar's failure to complete the teaching education course without valid cause; and

15 f) The scholar shall sign an agreement stating the terms and 16 conditions of the scholarship.

SEC. 6. Secretariat. - The Chair of the Commission on Higher Education 17 (CHED) may create a Secretariat to provide administrative and technical 18 assistance to effectively and efficiently implement the Program. It shall perform 19 the duties and responsibilities as may be determined and delegated by the 20 support staff, as may be created, shall be CHED Chair. The 21 recruited preferably from any accredited teacher organization or the 22 academe. 23

Donations, Grants and Other Contributions. - The SEC. 7. 24 CHED may accept any donation, contribution, bequest, grant, in cash or 25 services, whether local or foreign, which may be made by individuals and 26 organizations, to fund the Program. Such donation, contribution, bequest, grant, 27 in cash or services shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall be 28 considered as an allowable deduction from the gross income in the computation 29 of the income tax of the donor in accordance with the provisions of the National 30 Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended. 31

Proceeds from at least two (2) draws of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes every year shall also be allocated to finance the Program.

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SEC. 8. Appropriations. - The sum of Fifty Million Pesos 2 (Php50,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated for the initial implementation of 3 funds necessary for its continued Thereafter, such Act. this 4 the appropriations of the shall be included in implementation 5 CHED in the annual General Appropriations Act. 6

SEC. 9. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within sixty 7 approval of this Act, the CHED shall, 8 (60) days from the in coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd) and in consultation 9 with schools offering education for teachers and other relevant stakeholders, 10 issue such rules and regulations as may be necessary for the effective 11 implementation of this Act. 12

13 SEC. 10. *Separability Clause.* - If any provision or part of this Act 14 is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions 15 not affected shall remain in full force and effect.

16 SEC. 11. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, decrees, orders, rules and 17 regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of 18 this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

19 SEC, 12. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days 20 after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of 21 general circulation.
