AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR BENEFITS TO MILITARY DEPENDENTS, CREATING THE MILITARY DEPENDENTS WELFARE OFFICE, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Section 3, Article II of the Constitution declares that "the Armed Forces of the Philippines is the protector of the people and the State", particularly in securing the sovereignty of the Philippines and the integrity of its national territory as its main goal.

While we must not overlook the obligation of the State to safeguard our sovereignty by modernizing the military, it must be viewed that modernization of our Armed Forces cannot be in terms of equipment, facilities, and skills alone but must also be accompanied by better and improved benefits for military personnel, most importantly their families. It is also the primary concern of the State to grant adequate remuneration and benefits for members of the Armed Forces.

In accordance with Constitutional provisions, this measure provides the necessary framework of institutionalizing benefits for military dependents and emphasizes on increasing benefits on the dependents for health, housing, education, among other benefits.

Therefore, expeditious passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. *Short Title.* – This Act shall be known as the *"Military Dependent's*

2	Benei	fits Act."	
3		Sec. 2. Declaration of Policy It shall be the policy of the State to ensure the	
4	prosp	erity and well-being of its citizens through policies and programs that provide	
5	adequ	ate social services, promote rising standards of living and an improved quality	
6	of life for all.		
7	Moreover, the State recognizes the vital role of the military in the protection		
8	of our country's sovereignty and should therefore ensure the promotion and		
9	improvement of the social and economic status of military personnel and their		
10	dependents.		
11		Sec. 3. Definition of Terms. – For purposes of this Act, the following shall	
12	mean	:	
13	a)	Military Dependent refers to the wife, children and other persons dependent	
14		on the military personnel for chief support, duly registered with the Moral and	
15		Welfare Division, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel J1 of the	
16		Armed Forces of the Philippines.	

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b) *AFP Military Personnel* shall include all active and incapacitated members of
 the Armed Forces of the Philippines.

Sec. 4. *Educational Benefits.* – Dependents of military personnel not exceeding four (4) shall be entitled to educational assistance in any of the following educational levels with the indicated amount of support per school year and corresponding durations as follows:

Educational level	Amount of Support	Duration
	(Per year)	
College	P50,000.00	4/5 years
Vocational	P30,000.00	2 years
Secondary	P30,000.00	6 years
Elementary	P20,000.00	6 years

1 Sec. 5. *Health Benefits.* – Dependents of Military personnel shall be entitled to

2 the following health benefits to be provided by AFP Health Facilities located in

- 3 various parts of the country:
- a) Free Hospitalization, inclusive of Professional Services, Medicines, and Medical
 Supplies;
- 6 b) Dispensary or Outpatient Services;

7 c) Ambulance Services; and

8 d) Free Dental Services.

9 Sec. 6. *Housing Benefits.* – All military personnel and their dependents shall 10 be provided with the necessary housing subject to the eligibility and priority system 11 set by the Major Service/Unit Housing Boards of the Armed Forces of the Philippines. 12 Housing, especially Off-Base housing in preparation for retirement will be provided 13 additional funding.

Sec. 7. *Commissary Benefits.* – All military dependents shall be entitled to the
benefit/privilege of purchasing tax-exempt merchandise from any of the AFPCES
units either cash or salary check.

Sec. 8. Other Benefits and Privileges. – Military dependents shall continue to
 receive all other existing benefits and privileges.

Sec. 9. *Creation of the Military Dependents Welfare Office.* – There is hereby created a Military Dependents Welfare Office, herein after referred to as the Office, which shall be attached to the Morale and Welfare Division, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel, J-1 Armed Forces of the Philippines, for the coordination and recommendation of policies and programs for military dependents.

6 Sec. 10. *Functions of the Office.* – The Office shall have the powers and 7 functions:

8 9 To act as coordinating body for all issues and concerns of military dependents;

- b) To formulate and institutionalize the necessary system1 and mechanism to
 ensure the effective and responsive delivery of benefits for military
 dependents;
- 13 c) To facilitate and ensure the swift release of benefits to the Military14 Dependents;
- d) To review existing benefits and recommend the necessary improvements to
 ensure better benefits for Military Dependents; and
- e) To annually recommend to the Department of National Defense
 appropriations for military dependent's benefits under the budget of the
 Armed Forces of the Philippines.
- Sec. 11. *Coordination with Armed Forces of the Philippines Savings and Loans, Associations Incorporated (AFPSLAI) and the Armed Forces of the Philippines Retirement Separation Benefit System (AFPRSBS).* – The Military Dependents' benefits office shall coordinate with the AFPSLAI and AFPRSBS to facilitate and ensure the release of benefits for military dependents.
- 25 Sec. 12. *Appropriations.* The Department of National Defense shall, every 26 year allocate a portion of their annual budget for the support of this Act.

Sec. 13. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The Department of National
 Defense shall promulgate the Rules and Regulations necessary for the effective
 implementation of this Act.

30 Sec. 14. *Separability Clause.* – If any portion or provision of this Act is 31 subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions hereof which are 32 not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

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Sec. 15. *Repealing Clause.* – All other laws, acts, presidential decrees, executive orders, presidential proclamations, issuances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof which are contrary to or inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

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Sec. 16. *Effectivity*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
