## CREATING AN ADVANCED STUDIES DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR EXCEPTIONAL EMPLOYEES FROM THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Thousands of Filipino students have acquired advanced degrees and specialized training in foreign countries through various scholarships grants either of local or foreign funding. While these local and overseas scholarship programs have produced a sizeable number of high-level professionals for the country, these programs have also resulted in a significant brain drain for our country. Moreover, some of the returning scholars have not found the opportunity the maximum utilization of newly acquired knowledge and training. As a result, many of them leave the country in search of greener pastures abroad.

It is imperative that the Philippines should devise a program for overseas education and training for the brightest and most promising Filipinos who are already employed (or self-employed) in a branch of science or technology along identified priority areas. Such a program shall affect the pooling together of all foreign and local (public or private) sponsorship intended for further education, enrichment and training of exceptionally able and highly motivated and employed Filipinos.

The proposed legislation endeavors to provide the Philippines a continuing supply of highly trained leaders for industry, research and academe. Under the bill, the maximum utilization of returning talents will be coordinated under a single governing body where all scholarships under foreign and local sponsorship are pooled together. Approval of the bill is, thus earnestly requested.

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### AN ACT

# CREATING AN ADVANCED STUDIES DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR EXCEPTIONAL EMPLOYEES FROM THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. Short Title. - This bill shall be known as the "Pensionado Act of 2019". 2

3 Sec. 2. Declaration of Policies. – Human resources developments are essential for economic development and progress. In the pursuit of economic development 4 and progress, the state shall give priority to the creation of a critical mass of elite 5 professionals who shall take the lead in harnessing science, technology and related 6 7 disciplines towards accelerating the productivity of the country's human resources.

8 Consonant with this trust, it is hereby declared a policy of the state to devise 9 a program for exceptionally able and highly motivated employees, preferably age 30-40, from the government, the private sector and/or the self-employed to 10 undertake advanced studies in a branch of science, technology or related fields of 11 12 learning on which depends the development and progress of the country. As such, it 13 shall provide for fellowships to enable them to pursue advanced studies or research in their field of expertise. 14

15 The state shall develop a critical mass of first-rate specialist in various 16 disciplines and areas of specializations vital to national development to form a 17 collective national "think tank" who shall place continuously their knowledge and skills at the service of the nation, be it in industry, the academe or the highest policy-making levels of government, with the government taking the lead in harnessing their knowledge and skills for the greatest good of the country.

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Sec. 3. *Definition of Terms*. – For purposes of this Act, the following terms are
hereunder defined accordingly:

a) *Post-graduate* refers to formal degree course program of training/research
 requiring at least a Master's Degree for entry; a student pursuing such
 program;

9 b) *Advanced studies* refer to a post-graduate problem-oriented program of 10 studies and/or research, not necessarily leading to a degree, undertaken for 11 further specialization or advanced knowledge in a specific field of a study, or 12 to acquire specialized knowledge and/or skills in a particular area of science 13 or technology; and

c) *Pensionado* refers to a Filipino citizen selected and supported by the
 Philippine government under this program to undertake advanced studies in
 selected institutions of higher learning or recognized research centers, in
 fields relevant to the officially-declared priority areas for development.

Sec. 4. *Establishment of a Program.* – There shall be established under the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), in coordination with the non-government organizations (NGOs), the private sector and other government agencies, namely, the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA), the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), a fellowship program to be called as the "Pensionado Program" for Filipinos employed in the government and the private sectors and those who are self-employed.

The program shall pool together all fellowships, scholarships, training grants sponsored or extended by foreign government, agencies and other bodies, as well as by local agencies and organizations, whether public or private, intended for advanced studies in international centers of advanced learning, scholarship and research.

30 Sec. 5. *Establishment of a National Secretariat; Functions and Composition.* – 31 There shall be established a National Secretariat, hereafter referred to as the 32 "Secretariat", with the following functions:

- a) Identify, and assist in negotiations with sponsors (foreign and local, public
   and private) of fellowships, scholarships and grants;
- 3 b) Provide assistance to the selection panel in accomplishing its work;
- c) Provide the Pensionados continuing assistance from the time of selection thru
  the time of their return to the country, including assistance for the productive
  utilization of their newly-gained expertise;
- 7 d) Serve as the administrative arm of the government for the program; and
- 8 9
- e) In general, promulgate and implement the policies and guidelines governing the Program.

10 The National Secretariat shall be headed by an Executive Officer with the rank 11 of Assistant Secretary, to be appointed by the President of the Republic of the 12 Philippines, upon the recommendation of CHED. Members of the Secretariat shall 13 consist of representatives from CHED, NEDA, DTI, and DOST. These representatives 14 shall be seconded to the Secretariat for a period of one year, subject to renewal 15 every year. Service rendered thereat shall be considered as part of their 16 performance for promotions purposes.

Sec. 6. *Number of Pensionados and Length of Grant.* – There shall be selected twenty-four (24) fellows annually – three (3) fellows for each priority discipline/industry field of the eight (8) vital disciplines or areas of specializations identified by the CHED in consultation with the NEDA as frontiers or new areas essential for pushing the economic and social development thrusts of the country. The scholarship shall be for a period not exceeding three (3) years.

Sec. 7. Selection Process. - There shall be a Selection Panel under the 23 Secretariat consisting of three (3) university presidents and two (2) eminent 24 members from the academe to be appointed by the CHED. They shall serve on a 25 staggered basis for the purposes of continuity and consistency, each for a term of 26 three (3) years. The Selection Panel shall make the final selection of the 27 Pensionados from among the nominees from the academe, industry and research 28 centers. The integrity and objectives of the program are paramount considerations 29 for the panel in making the selection. 30

31 Sec. 8. *Qualifications.* – In order to qualify for the Fellowship Program, the 32 applicant must be: 1 a) A Filipino citizen;

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- 2 b) Gainfully employed;
- 3 c) A college degree graduate, with honors;

d) With demonstrated leadership and proven exceptional performance in his/her
present work;

- 6 e) Enthusiastic in undergoing further training; and
- f) Willing to sign a contract requiring him/her to return to his/her job in anothercapacity after training.

9 Sec. 9. *Place of Study.* – The Pensionados shall be sent to a foreign country 10 well-known for its advanced stage in particular discipline of area of specialization. 11 Training and education may be an academic institution, research and development 12 (R&D) center or a major industrial establishment with and R&D program. It may or 13 may not lead to an advanced academic degree.

- Sec. 10. Assistance to Grantees. The Pensionado is entitled to the following
  benefits:
- a) Up to three (3) years leave with pay, including allowances and other benefits;
- b) One economy round-trip air fare to and from the host country plus other
  travel expenses required for foreign travel;
- 19 c) Clothing allowance to be determined by the Secretariat;
- 20 d) Monthly stipend while on study abroad, of such amount to determined by the21 Secretariat;
- e) Books/Instructional Materials/Research allowance of such amount to bedetermined by the Secretariat; and
- f) Health, Travel and Insurance fees of such amount to be determined by theSecretariat.

Sec. 11. *Program Funding.* – The cost of each fellowship grant shall be shared by the Pensionado's employer and the National Government. The employer pays the salary, allowances and other benefits due the Fellow as employed during the oneyear period of advanced studies overseas while the national Government, thru the program, shall be responsible for items b, c, d, e, and f as enumerated in Section 10 hereof. With the transfer of all pertinent foreign and local grants for coordination under the Program, the government, through the Program, may negotiate bilateral

arrangements with hosts governments, host universities, host research institutions
 and host corporations to share at least 50% of the total cost of items b, c, d, e, and
 f under Section 10 hereof.

The National Government may also negotiate bilateral agreements with host governments, host universities, research institutions and corporations to enable our scholars to stay abroad and continue their studies or training at a minimal cost to the national Government. A sharing program can be established where the host government, host-universities, research institutions and corporations can pick up of the expenses of the scholars while he is abroad.

Sec. 12. Service Obligation. - Immediately upon completion of the studies or 10 training, a fellow shall be required to return to his job or in another capacity 11 12 approved by the Secretariat and serve on a full-time basis for a minimum period equivalent to twice the period covered by the fellowship grant. In addition, the 13 scholar shall be required to hold seminars or training sessions for employees from 14 the government and the private sectors on topics related to the course or training he 15 has completed. Any recipient of the program who has not completed his course 16 17 shall reimburse the Fellowship the grant received or render service to the sponsoring agency or company for a period equivalent to the period covered by the fellowship 18 grant. Any Pensionado who violates the service obligation imposed under this 19 section shall reimburse the sponsoring agency or company and the national 20 21 Government of the Fund assistance received under this act in full or in part as the 22 case may be.

Sec. 13. Mechanism for Utilization of Returned Fellows. - There shall be 23 established and developed a National Network of Specialized Institutes for Advanced 24 Studies in universities selected by CHED in consultation with the DOST and other 25 appropriate agencies to be determined by the Secretariat to provide returned 26 27 scholars an office, laboratory, library and conference facilities for their continuing 28 activities. The Institute shall also serve as a place for an Exchange Program and Collaborative Research among local and international scientist and scholars in 29 priority areas of research and development. 30

The National Government may, thru CHED and/or the National Secretariat, negotiate bilateral agreements with foreign government, universities, research

institutions and corporations, public and private, to effect exchange of scholars and scientists for collaborative advanced studies, as well as to equip the Institute for purposes of benefit to the cause of scholar and scientists for collaborative advanced studies, as well as to equip the Institute for purposes of benefit to the cause of scholarly or scientific advancement and national development.

6 A sharing program may be established whereby the host 7 government/university/institution/ corporation can pick up part of the expenses of 8 the Fellow in pursuit of his/her Fellowship.

9 Sec. 14. *Appropriations.* – The amount necessary to carry out the initial 10 implementation of this Act shall be drawn from the savings of the national 11 government. Thereafter, the funds necessary for the continuous implementation of 12 the program shall be included in the General Appropriations Act. The Program shall 13 receive 2% from the share of the DOST and 1% from the share of the Philippine 14 Youth Commission in the Bases Conversion Development Authority (BCDA) 15 proceeds.

Sec. 15. *Transfer of other fellowship, scholarship and training grants.* – All foreign and locally sponsored fellowship, scholarship and training grants will be transferred to the program for coordination. With respect to government employees who may be affected by the transfer, the pertinent rules and regulations of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) shall apply.

Sec. 16. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – Within ninety (90) days from the approval of this Act, CHED, in coordination with NEDA, DTI, DOST, and CSC, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of the provisions thereof.

Sec. 17. *Separability Clause.* – If any portion or provision of this Act is subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

Sec. 18. *Repealing Clause.* – All other laws, acts, presidential decrees, executive orders, presidential proclamations, issuances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof which are contrary to or inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

 Sec. 19. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
 publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation. Approved,

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
