AN ACT

CREATING IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION THE
PLANTILLA POSITIONS OF GUIDANCE COUNSELORS IN EVERY ELEMENTARY
SCHOOL AND ADDITIONAL PLANTILLA POSITIONS OF GUIDANCE
COUNSELOR FOR HIGH SCHOOL, INCREASING THE SALARIES OF
GUIDANCE COUNSELORS AND GUIDANCE-RELATED POSITIONS,
AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Guidance and counseling are important tools for the holistic development of a child to better manage one's emotions when faced with different situations, practice healthy coping mechanism at times of emotional conflict and personal problems, and get comprehensive advice on courses and careers, among others.¹

Secretary Leonor Briones stressed that the lack of guidance counselors in all levels of education system has been "a persistent problem" in the Philippines. Such problem is rooted from the issue of difficulty of attracting graduates to go into the field or even to choose public sector due to the low salary provided for those who are in the field. As of June 2018, according to Undersecretary Annalyn Sevilla, only 3,553 guidance-related plantilla items were authorized, of which only 1,483 or 42% are filled and out of 1,483,

only 393 are Registered Guidance Counselors (RGCs). It is important to note that there are 3,220 RGCs as of July $2017.^2$

This proposed measure seeks to provide for the sufficient number of plantilla positions in the Department of Education for the guidance counselors and other guidance-related personnel in the public-school system. Further, it aims to increase the salaries of the same to be able to incentivize and attract them in the field.

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Be it enacted in the Senate and the House of Representatives in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Creation of Plantilla Positions.* The Department of Education, in consultation with the Department of Budget and Management, shall ensure that there is sufficient number of *plantilla* positions for guidance counselors in every public elementary and high schools.

For purposes of this Act, the Department of Education shall endeavor to meet the recommended ratios of one guidance counselor for every 200 students in the public elementary and high schools.

SECTION 2. Increase in Salary Grades of Guidance Coordinators, Guidance Counselors, Guidance Services Associates, and Guidance Services Specialists. The present minimum salary grade levels of guidance coordinators, guidance counselors, guidance services associates, and guidance services specialists shall be increased in the following manner:

SECTION 3. *Appropriations.* The amounts necessary for the initial implementation of this Act shall be charged against the savings of the Department of Education. Thereafter, the funds shall be provided in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SECTION 4. Separability Clause. Should any provision herein be declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act.

SECTION 5. *Repealing Clause.* All other laws, decrees, orders, issuances, rules and regulations, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. Effectivity. The Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from the publication in the Official Gazette or in any newspaper of general circulation.
