**RESOLUTION**  
**HONORING AND COMMENDING BATCH SAKABYAS: THE PHILIPPINE**  
**CONTINGENT TO THE 46<sup>TH</sup> SHIP FOR THE SOUTHEAST ASIAN AND**  
**JAPANESE YOUTH PROGRAM (SSEAYP)**

1           WHEREAS, Batch Sakabyas, guided by the National Youth Commission (NYC),  
2 will be the official Philippine contingent to the 46<sup>th</sup> Southeast Asian and Japanese  
3 Youth Program (SSEAYP) – a joint program between Japan and the ASEAN member  
4 states (J-ASEAN) established since January 1974 aimed at promoting friendship,  
5 mutual understanding, and leadership among the participating youth of J-ASEAN;

6           WHEREAS, as part of the ASEAN integration thrust of the government, Batch  
7 Sakabyas is committed to foster better understanding among Japan and the ASEAN  
8 member states through the various sessions to be conducted particularly on diversity  
9 and social inclusion, information and media, good health and well-being, disaster and  
10 risk reduction, education, environment, employment and decent work, youth  
11 entrepreneurship, soft power and youth people-to-people diplomacy, international  
12 relations (J-ASEAN cooperation), and other relevant topics;

13           WHEREAS, as goodwill ambassadors of the Philippines, Batch Sakabyas will  
14 advance their personal advocacies – as well as those anchored to the United Nations'  
15 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) – for the benefit of the country. The  
16 passion and excellence of the 27 young Filipino servant-leaders and their national  
17 leader will hopefully cascade to the rest of our Filipino youth and ignite a collective  
18 movement towards the improvement of the overall quality of life of Filipinos;
