AN ACT PROVIDING FOR SCHOLARHIP TO CHILDREN AND DEPENDENTS OF FARMERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Philippines is mainly an agricultural country. However, it has been an undying irony that farmers in this country remain marginalized. Those who should have been the strongest and probably the richest sector are those who have now less in life.

Despite them comprising more than sixty percent (60%) of the country's workforce, their welfare remains not being carefully promoted. The sad fact is that they remain neglected. While other sectors in the workforce continuously enjoy various kinds of benefits, farmers experience incessant indigence.

This proposed measure attempts to give farmers a kind of assistance that has not yet been afforded to them. This bill seeks to give full scholarship to dependents of farmers. This might help them cope with present circumstances that contribute to their poverty. This is anchored on our view that education is a tool to address poverty and this is a tool for economic improvement. This bill is definitely a far-cry from the long-desired economic development for our farmers, but this may be a first step towards the achievement of such. In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR SCHOLARHIP TO CHILDREN AND DEPENDENTS OF FARMERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 Section 1. *Full scholarship for Children and Dependents of Farmers.* – Children 2 and dependents of farmers listed in the Registry System for Basic Sectors in 3 Agriculture (RSBSA), the Farmers' Database consisting of records of all farmers 4 covered by the Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation shall be entitled to full 5 scholarship from basic education until their completion of tertiary education subject to 6 rules and regulations as mandated by this Act.

8 The benefits shall include all expenses for education, whether in public or 9 private school, such as but not limited to tuition fees, miscellaneous and other fees, 10 board and lodging, transportation expenses, allowances for books, clothing and food 11 and other similar expenses.

Sec. 2. Special Fund for Educational Benefits. – In order to carry out the provisions of this Act, there is hereby established a Special Fund, to be known as the "Educational Benefits for Farmers Fund," in the amount of Fifty Million Pesos (P50,000,000.00). Such fund shall be perpetually maintained and used exclusively for the benefit of children and dependents of farmers; *Provided*, that not more than 5% of this Fund shall be used by the Board, herein created, for the administration of the Special Fund.

Sec. 3. *Farmers' Educational Benefit Board.* – There shall be created an interagency Farmers' Educational Benefit Board or the Board, composed of the Secretaries of Agriculture, Local Government, the President of the Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation, and three (3) representatives from the farmers selected from a verified procedure of selection as agreed upon by the farmers.

8 The Board shall have the primary responsibility of managing and supervising 9 the Fund. It shall also formulate policies, implementing rules and regulations, 10 guidelines and other related functions to oversee, manage and supervise the 11 operations of the Fund. It shall also be responsible in formulating the mechanics, 12 scope and limitations, and requirements for the scholarship program.

There shall be established a secretariat of the Board which shall provide administrative support to the Board and shall perform functions as authorized by the Board. The secretariat shall implement the policies approved by the Board, including but not limited to the screening, admission, qualification, disqualification and otherscholarship-related availment processes.

Sec. 4. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. – Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Agriculture as the lead agency, with PCIC, DILG, various non-government organizations and other stakeholders shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

25 Sec. 5. *Separability Clause.* If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or 26 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall 27 remain valid and subsisting.

Sec. 6. *Repealing Clause.* Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to, or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

Sec. 7. *Effectivity Clause.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
